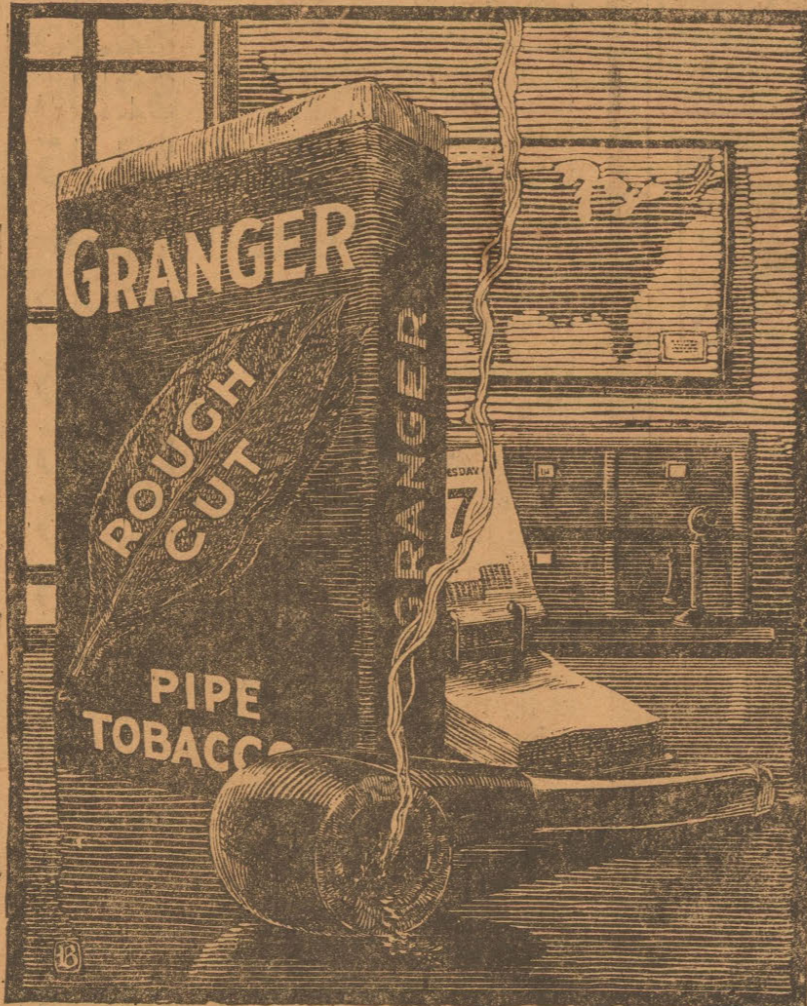

More than 1,500 progressive communities throughout the entire 48 states conducted better homes campaigns last year, and the influence of these demonstrations and observances has made a lasting impression on those districts, says a report from national headquarters.

Community Effort.
The importance of community effort to render assistance to the prospective home buyer or builder in meeting the desires for a real home becomes apparent when it is realized that of five billions of dollars expended in building construction throughout the United States for 1924, two billions are for residential construction. And to this huge sum must be added hundreds of millions which will be expended for furnishing and equipment of homes.

Better homes in America is an educational movement which was formed about three and a half years ago. Supported by private gifts and public funds, and having no commercial backing or connections, it has been working since that time under the presidency of Herbert Hoover to help attain the following objectives:

Seven Objectives.
To put knowledge of high standards in house-building, home-furnishing and equipment, and home life within the reach of all citizens.

To encourage the building of sound, attractive, economical single-family houses; to encourage the reconditioning and remodeling of old houses to render them sanitary, attractive and convenient, and to encourage thrift of home ownership.

To encourage general study of the housing problem and the problems of family life, to demonstrate each year the best types of house construction, home furnishing, and labor-saving devices for the home which are within the reach of families in moderate circumstances.

To encourage sensible and appropriate furnishing for the home and the elimination of needless burdens in housekeeping.

To encourage instruction in home economics and home life in the public schools.

To promote the improvement of house lots, yards, and neighborhoods.

To extend knowledge of the ways and means of making home life more attractive and to encourage special study and discussion of the problem of character building in the home.

Many Interests Enlisted.
Civic leagues, women's clubs, business men's clubs, Boy and Girl Scouts, chambers of commerce,

boards of trade and builders exchanges were enlisted. The banks and building and loan associations ranging from Michigan to Texas and from New York to California co-operated with local committees which sponsored the movement. In Georgia, Michigan and Pennsylvania trades union leaders gave active co-operation.

Other organizations which actively took hold of the program included colleges, business and professional women's clubs, the American Legion, the churches, and a wide range of fraternal and other organizations, as well as government agencies.

In virtually every state the home demonstration agents, farm bureaus, and officials interested in rural life gave their unstinted support, and even in communities where there were but a dozen families, the Better Homes Week observances proved their worth in helping to make the home a more enjoyable place.

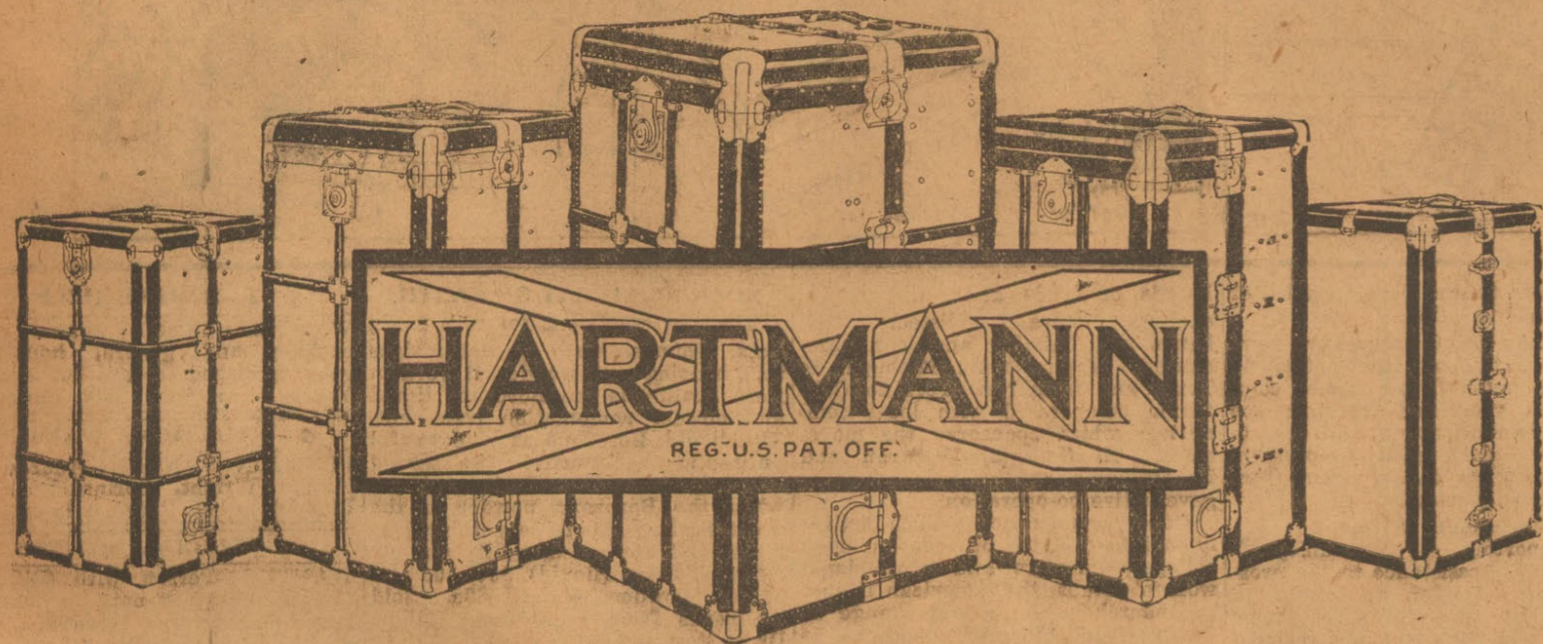
SCHOOL CENSUS BLANKS NOW BEING SENT OUT

Blanks, to be used in taking the scholastic census of Eastland county, are being mailed by the county superintendent to the various trustees of the rural schools and to the superintendents of the independent schools. The county superintendent has control only over the taking of the rural school census, however, both the rural and independent census are compiled by the county superintendent.
The scholastic census must be taken during the month of March, and includes all children from 7 to 17 years inclusive. Last year there were 3,103 rural scholastics.
Transfers for school purposes must

be made prior to August 1st, except where they are made by the county school board, which has the authority to make transfers for high school purposes only, up to November 11.
