AUSTIN, Feb. 5.—Smothered under amendments and bearing battle scars from more than half a dozen voted down, the senate realtors bill, by Senator Stuart, was laid upon the table in the senate under indefinite postponement after a mectic session last Tuesday.

Senator John Bailey took the floor in a bitter arraignment of "under hand" attempts to kill the bill, urging members to vote outright for its defeat. Bailey termed the bill a plan to create a "trust wherein the little man who dabbles in real estate" would be removed from competition.






