Fruit Nut Fudge

3 cups of Diamond Star Sugar
1 cup of milk
2 tablespoons of butter
1/2 cup of cocoa
1 cup of seeded raisins
1/4 cup of finely chopped nuts

Cook together the sugar, milk, butter and cocoa, stirring only until the sugar is melted, then cooking slowly as for ordinary fudge. When it is done, turn in the prepared raisins and nuts, not chopped. Stir these into the candy; let it boil up once; beat thoroughly and turn into greased pans. Cut into squares when nearly cold.




