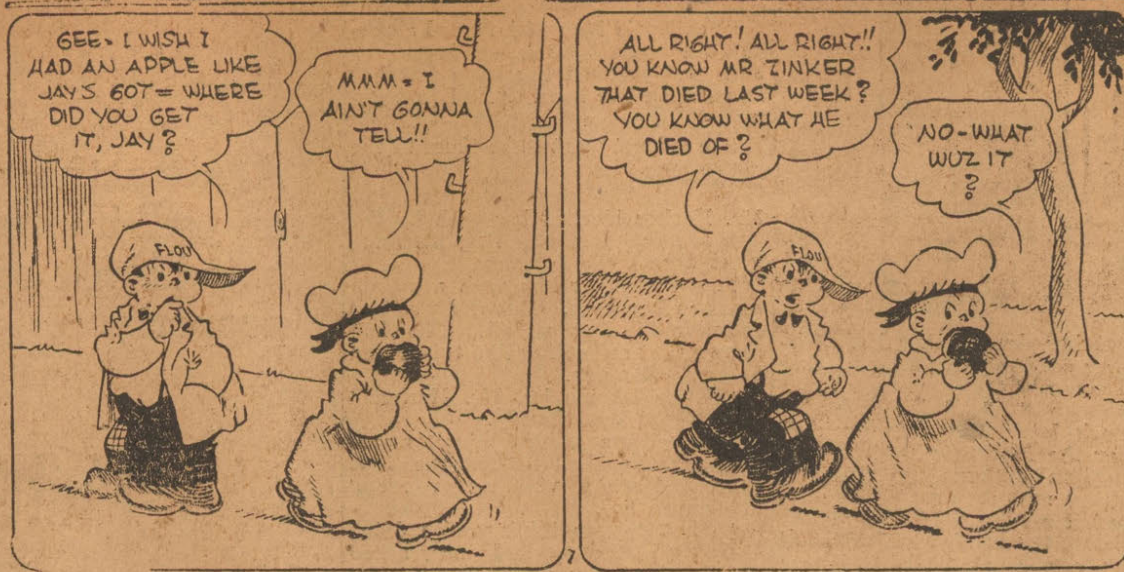

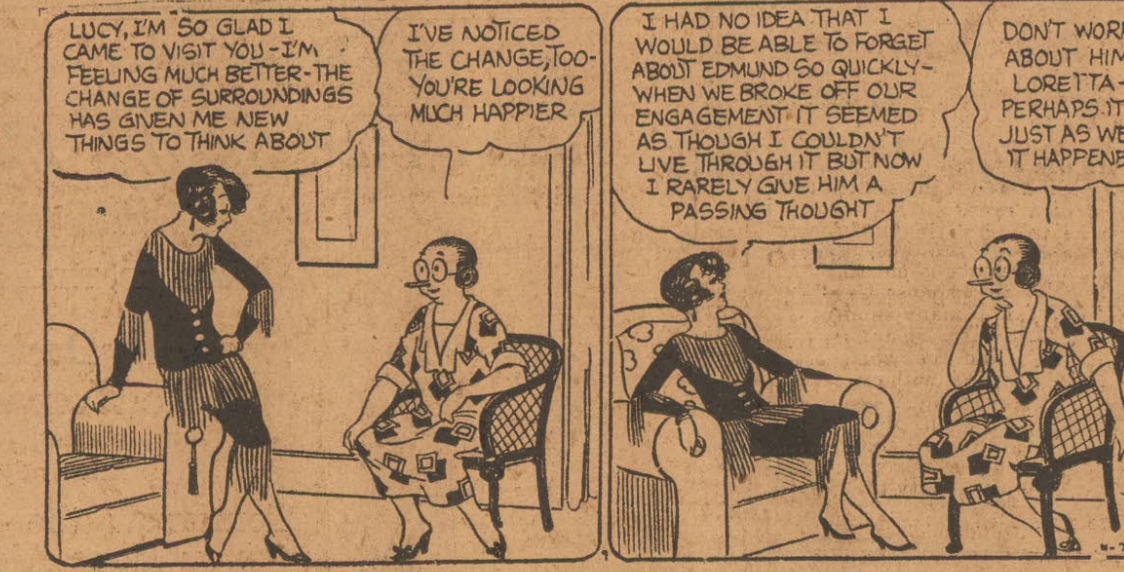

Scientific Whaling Flourishes In Pacific; More Profitable Than of Old

By United Press. SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 9.—Minus most of the dangers of older days, and plus the benefits of modern science, the business of catching whales still flourishes in the sea off this port.

An average of fourteen of the sea monsters now are caught each week in the Pacific, only a few miles from land, and towed by whaling tugs to reductions stations at Trinidad, north of here, and Moss Landing, located a few miles southward.

There they are cut up, boiled and made into fertilizer, oil and chicken feed, worth approximately \$1,000 a whale. Whalebone for corset stays still is produced, but on a greatly lessened scale.

The modern whaling vessels are smaller and more powerful than the old-time ships. They are absent from port usually only three days, instead of six months to three years.

No longer is the whale carcass hoisted aboard the vessel, and the decks made odorless and redolent of the catch. Nowadays the whaling tug takes as many as six whales in tow and hauls them into port.

The modern harpoon is as deadly in comparison to the old style one as it is the modern ordinance in comparison with the flintlock musket.
