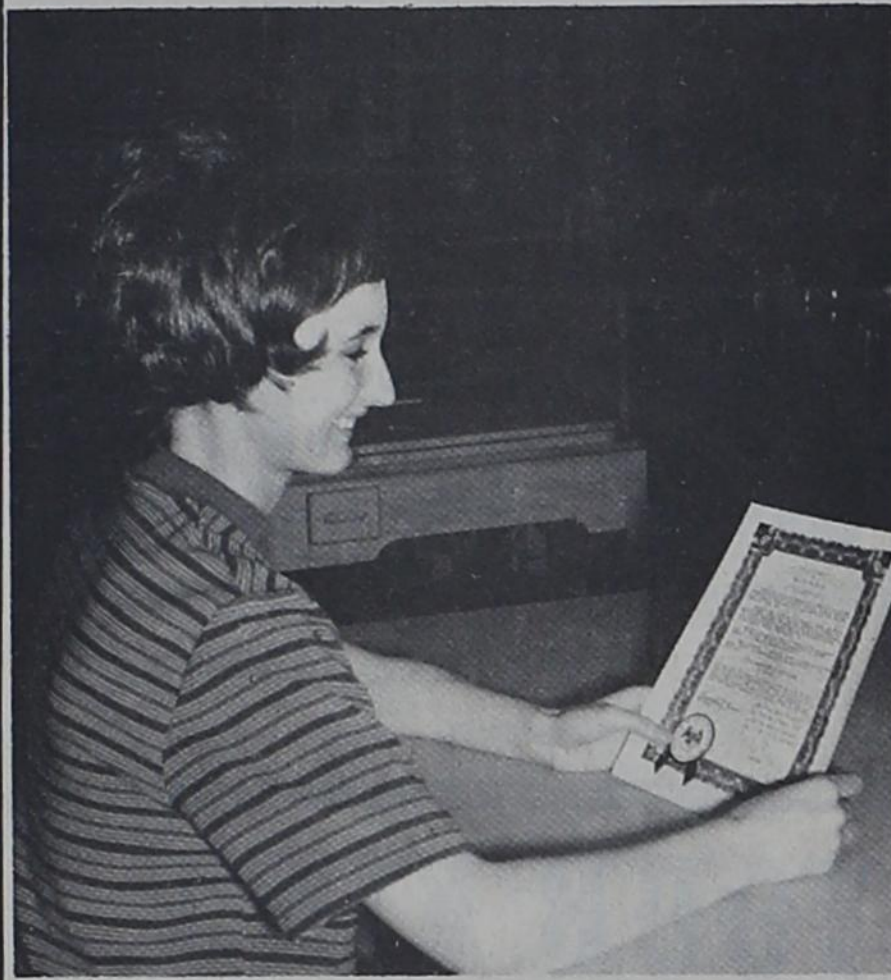

**Soil Conservationist Explains --**

**Deferred Grazing Program**

Edward G. Phillips, soil conservationist in the Farmer County SCS office, explains the deferred grazing program by stating that all grasses need a rest period each year. Deferred grazing is periodically postponing grazing or resting grazing land for a prescribed period of time during the growth period of the year. Purpose of deferred grazing is to promote natural revegetation by increasing the vigor of

the forage stand and permitting desirable plants to produce seed, or to provide a feed reserve for fall or winter grazing or emergency use, and to improve the appeal of the ranges with adequate cover. To properly handle such a program, Phillips says it is necessary that all domestic animals be excluded from the land for a prescribed period of time...on all rangelands grazed throughout the entire growing

season, season-long, or year-long native pasture or grazable woodlands. Livestock should be excluded for a minimum of three months. The recommended minimum time of deferment is three months for short grasses, four months for mid-grasses, or five months for tall grasses. Starting dates for a deferment period should be after the average date of the last killing frost for the area.

**Another Change In Grazing**

The May 1 date is completely out. You may graze your diverted acres through May 14. You can resume grazing your diverted acres on October 15, 1970.

The wheat disposition date has also been extended through May 15, 1970. This means that wheat in excess of your permitted acreage must be destroyed.
