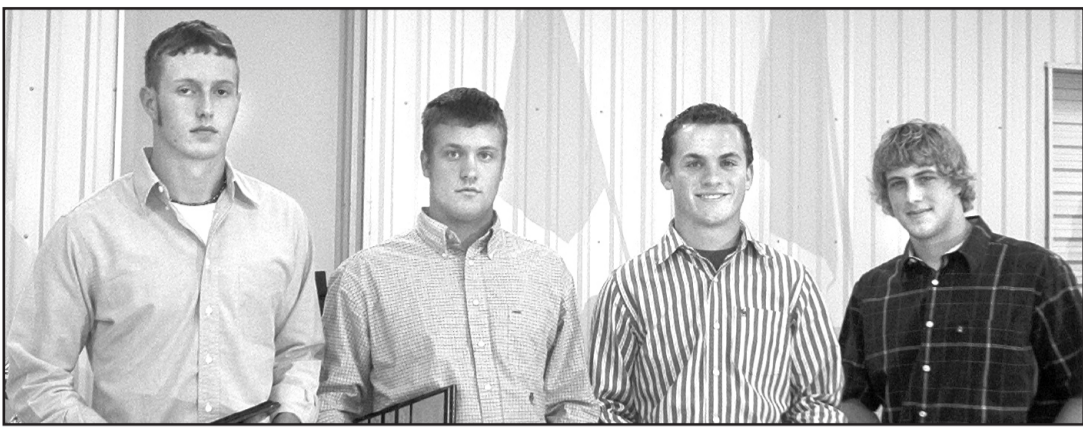

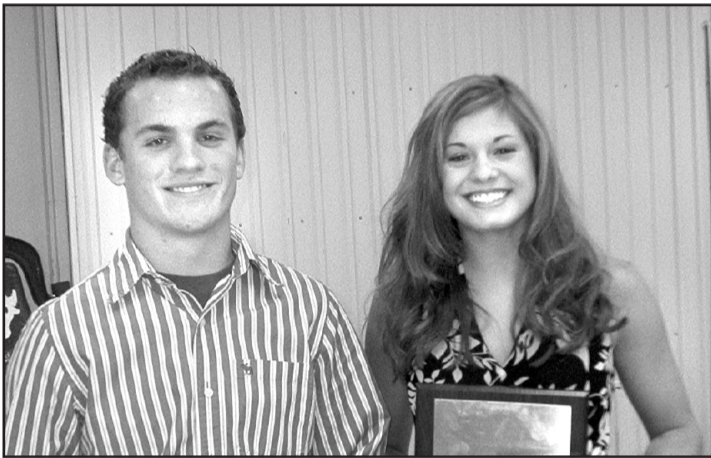

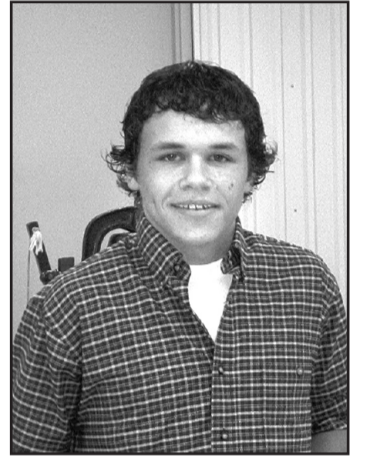
-- In golf, the varsity girls won the Friona, Sundown and Clovis Christian Invitational Meets as well as the district meet. Micah Christian took 1st place in district.

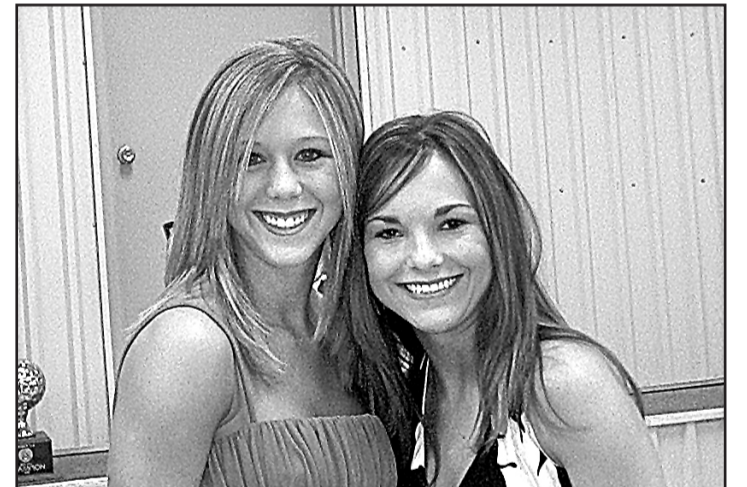
-- The theme for the dinner was a tail gate part with the meal provided by the Booster Club and prepared by the cafeteria ladies.



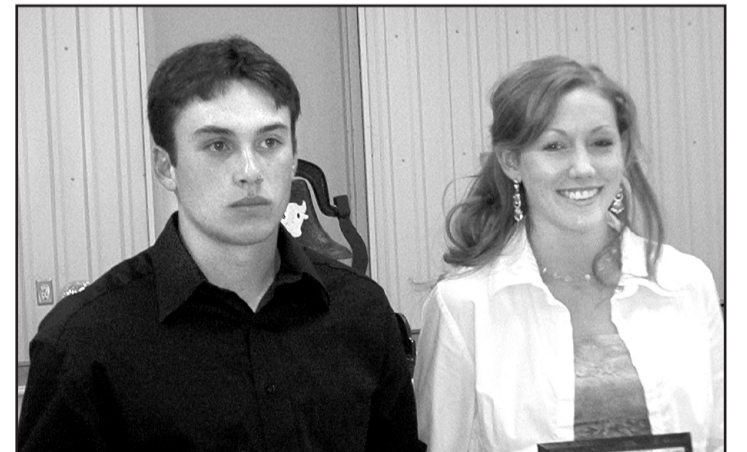

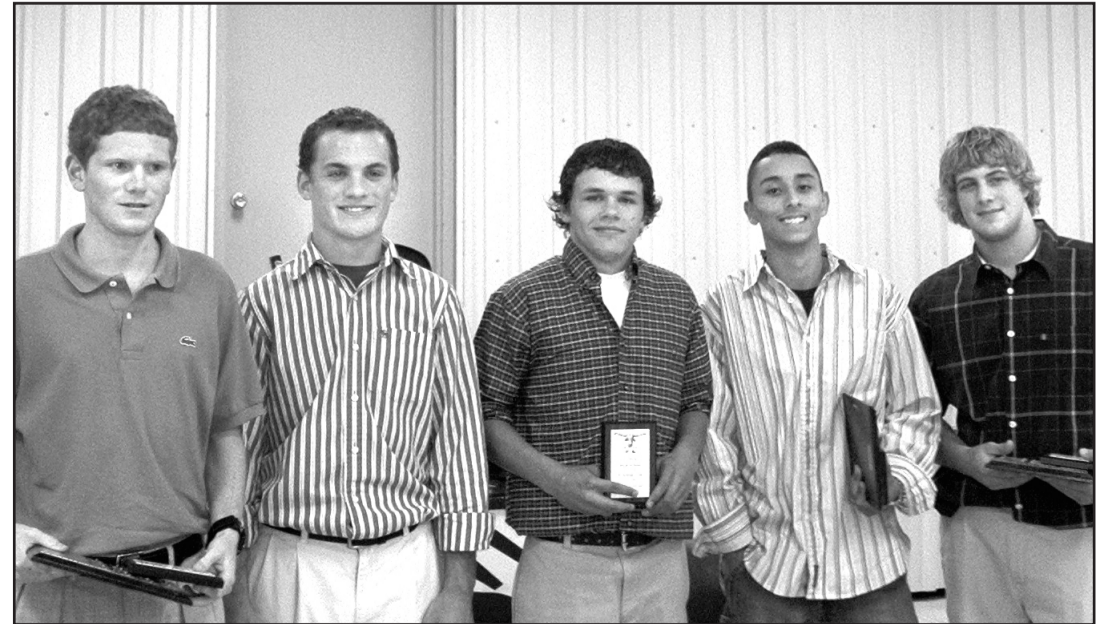

-- Agreed to participate in the Panhandle Region Mutual Aid agreement. This is basically to get help in case of a major disaster, such as a tornado.

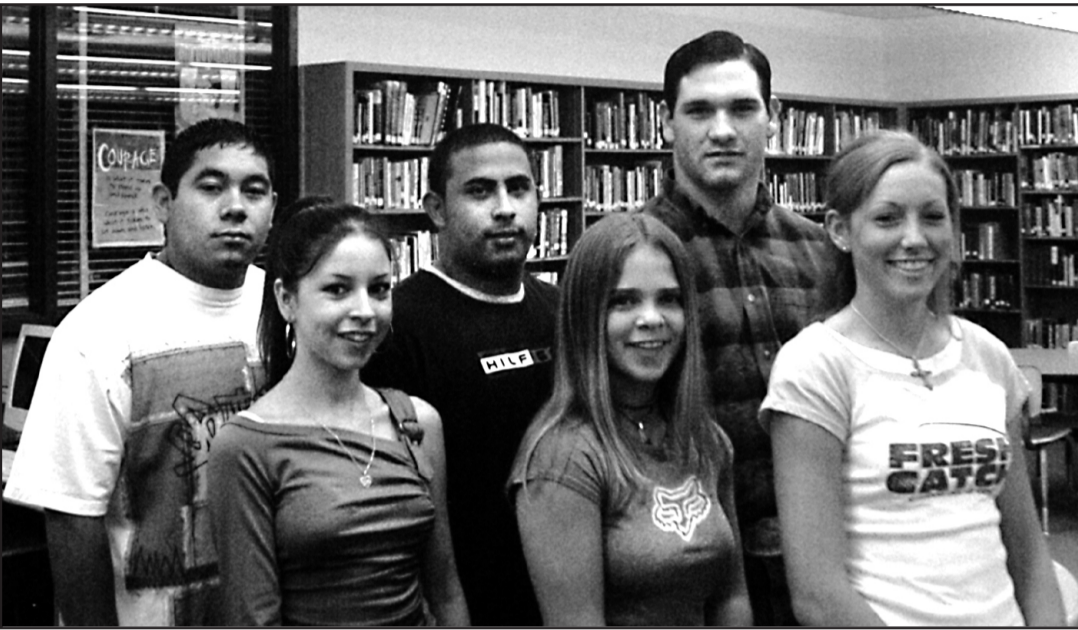

 -- Juan Manuel Rivera, 28, of Friona, charged with subsequent DWI, was sentenced to 2 to 10 years in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice, probated for 3 years; 10 days in Parmer County Jail as a condition of community supervision; \$403 court costs; \$1,000 fine; 160 hours of community service; loss of driver's license for 18 months, and obtain alcohol counseling at own

expense.

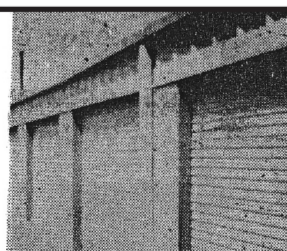


Well, folks, we are coming down to the end of another school year. As always, there have been lots of programs, assemblies, banquets and graduations.

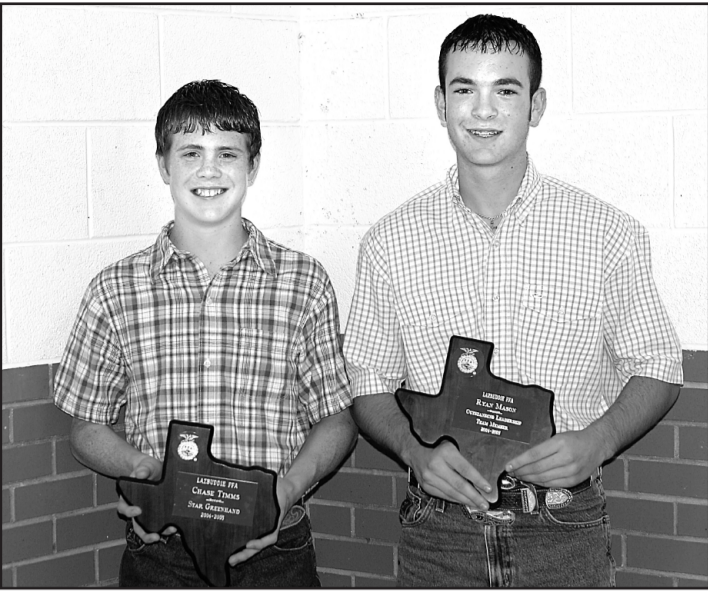

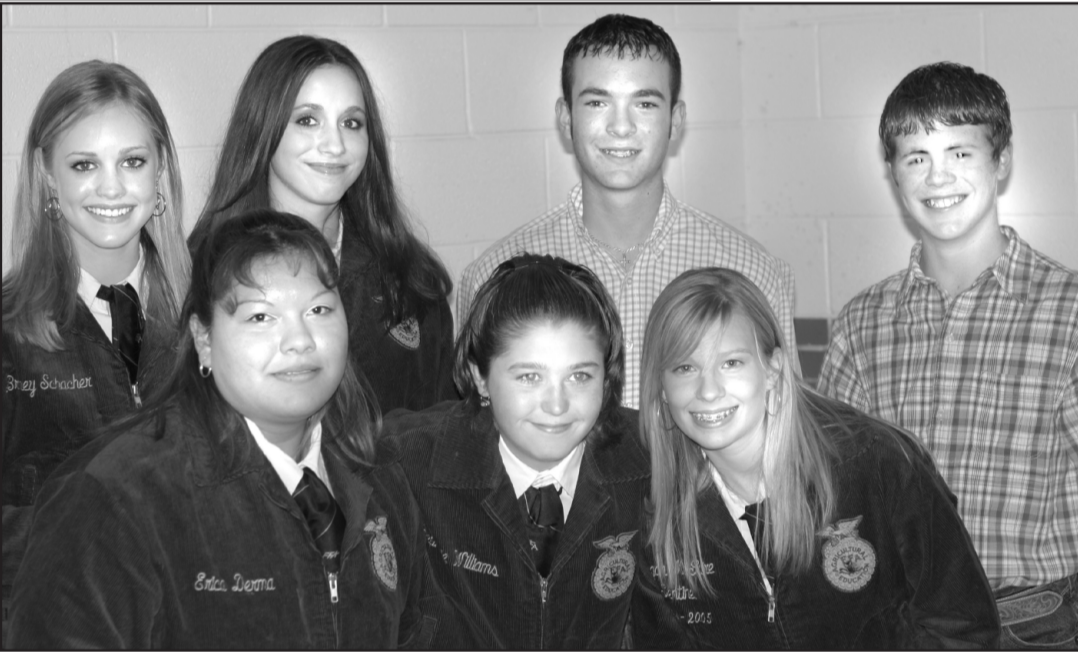

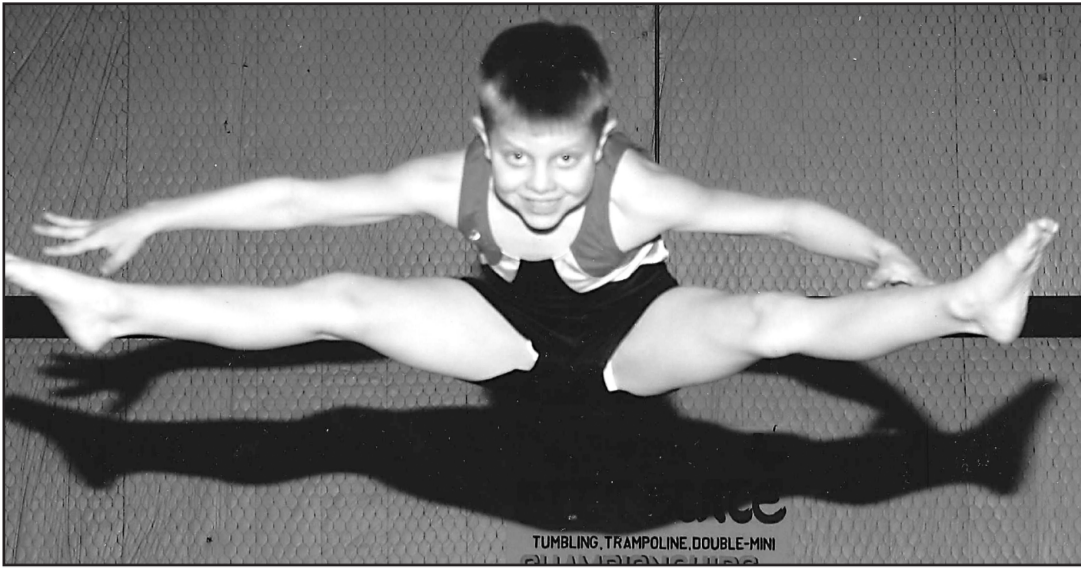

By now, you might have heard that Cannon is on the list to be possibly shut down.

It is interesting to me that this follows so closely on the heels on the special paper we put out about Farwell's 100th anniversary.

Why? Because that paper showed many of the struggles that the city

faced over the years. It showed how the people got together, made the city grow, and become what it is today.

I know that story focused on Farwell, but the same is true for many of the cities in this area. It is really the people who make our cities.

This area will see some economic hardship in the near future, but do not forget that Roswell went through this in the mid '60s and they worked hard to bring in industry to diversify their economy and build up the economic base that was lost.

In the last year, Clovis enticed the cheese plant to move in, and there are plenty of more opportunities that can follow that one.

I know that there are a lot of people in Clovis and the surrounding areas that depend on the base. This isn't going to be easy, but I know that with a little luck Clovis will come through this and keep growing.

Also, at the May 5 club meeting, it was noted that there was still a bill out for \$191 from last year's banquet that needed to be paid.



Edgar Ortiz competed in two track events at the state Class 1A meet last weekend. In the 3200 meter run, he finished 7th with a time of 10:13.82.
