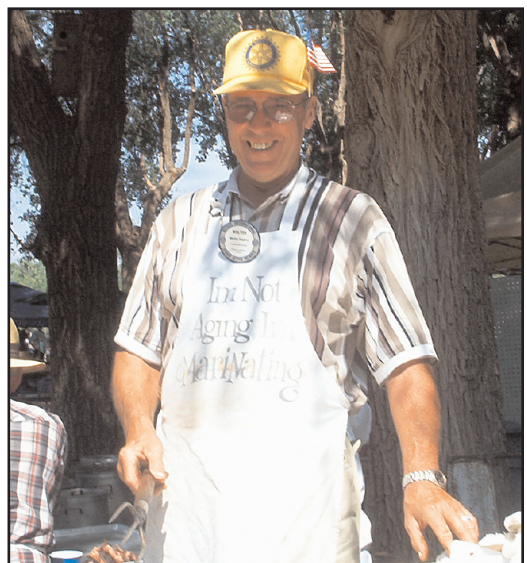

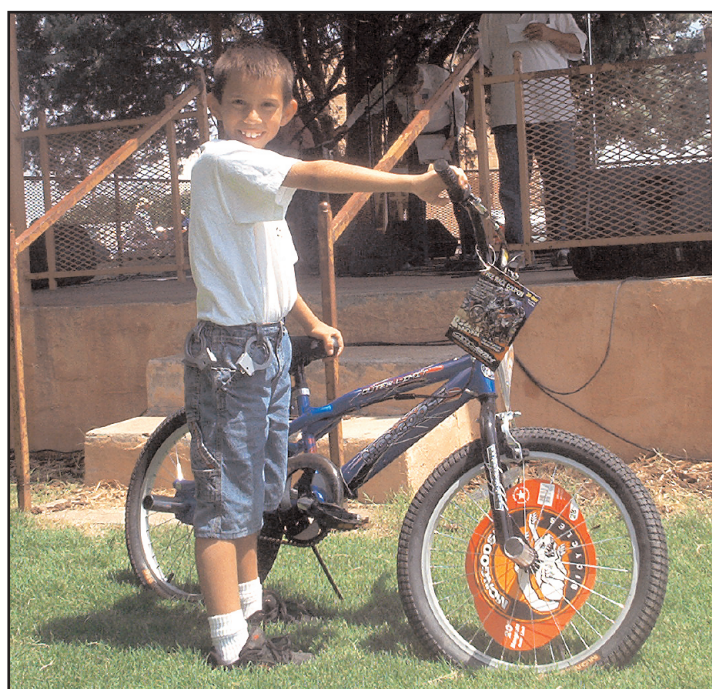

But back to responsibilities...

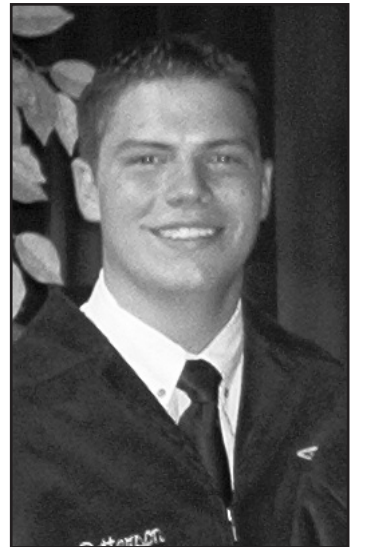
Dan played a big role at the Area Leadership camp held at Clarendon, Texas, this year. He put on a workshop every morning, and his theme was "Diversifying your chapter."

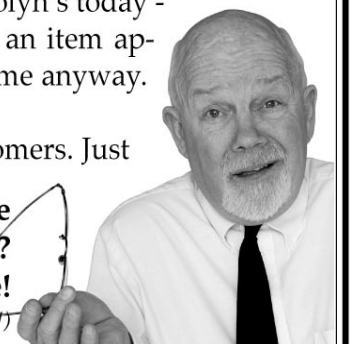

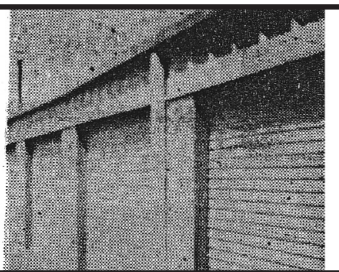

Here is a look at Texico's budget

Here's a look at the City of Texico's budget for 2007, for the period July 1, 2006, to June 30, 2007.

Total revenues are expected to total \$1,113,227. This includes:
 -- Cemetery, \$8,300.
 -- Public works, \$370,000.

-- General funds: municipal taxes, \$134,188; state shared taxes, \$105,570; fines and forfeitures, \$52,500; small cities grant, \$100,000; municipal streets, \$55,680; and miscellaneous receipts, \$35,570.
 -- Dedicated funding: law enforcement, \$21,800; fire protection, \$183,705; EMS, \$9,400; fire and rescue, \$23,795; and senior citizens, \$12,539.

General fund revenues are budgeted to be slightly under the fiscal 2006 rate, with municipal street funding decreasing by \$59,600, and no budgeted amount for the sale of fixed assets, which totalled \$16,731 in fiscal year 2006.

Public works revenue includes water, solid waste, sewage and taxes, and is based on the billings to customers during fiscal year 2006. The budget contains no increase in rates or growth.

Dedicated funding is the amount the city expects to receive from funding agencies. Expenses will not exceed actual funding received.

Other highlights of Texico's budget includes:

Personnel strength -- the city has seven fulltime employees -- finance and administration, 2; police, 3; and public works, 2.

Total expenditures for fiscal year 2007 are expected to be \$1,086,040. This includes:

-- Cemetery, \$5,700.
 -- Public works, \$358,783.

-- Dedicated funding: law enforcement, \$21,800; fire protection, \$183,705; EMS, \$9,400; fire and res-

cue, \$24,714; and senior citizens, \$18,118.

-- General funds: finance and administration, \$149,591; legislative, \$2,820; police, \$189,448; judicial, \$19,481; streets, \$69,250; swimming pool, \$15,800; zoning and planning, \$7,430; and recreation, \$10,000.

The budget includes a salary hike for all city employees of 4 percent, with police and public works employees receiving an additional salary hike so the city can stay competitive with the surrounding area.

Also, the budget allows for a substantial hike in fuel and utilities.

Including in the budget are funding for capital outlays. These include:

Reconditioning the city hall parking lot, \$12,190; new police vehicle, \$20,000; street improvements, \$57,500; new fencing and diving board for the swimming pool, \$12,000; and recreation, \$10,000. Also budgeted are funds for well improvements and repairs.

The city also plans to use its \$325,000 loan from the New Mexico Environmental Department Construction Programs Bureau for water system improvements and the purchase of additional water rights.

LIVE CATTLE: The cash market has remained under the gun once again this week with no apparent reason? The futures prices have been incredibly strong over the last few weeks in spite of lower cash prices. Prices should have seen a bottom this week in both futures and cash. Higher prices into August should follow. Beef demand remains strong, but packers continue to fight hard.

FEEDER CATTLE: Even though the market came under pressure early in the week, the market was able to move back to new highs on the week by Friday. Prices have been all over the place, but long term trends have remained up since making their bottom in late April. Expect to see steady to higher prices as we move into the September/October time frame.

CORN: The market was able to stop the drop this week even though this may only be temporary? The crop in the Mid West only seems to improve although there was a slight decline in the good to excellent category from last week, crop ratings are still far above year ago levels. Most private crop analysts believe trend line yields will exceed last year's crop and lower prices are expected.

SOYBEANS: For months, bean prices have been trading inside a range with no direction either to the upside or down? Look for this pattern to continue as we move further into harvest. There could be some support coming from ideas that the USDA has underestimated the size of this year's crop?

WHEAT: The market failed to break out to new highs just a couple of weeks ago and price trends have all turned down. Demand is weak and Funds have liquidated massive long positions held for months. Technically, there is some support around the June low of \$4.65 basis the September KC contract, but overall, the market should continue to drift lower into the September time frame.

COTTON: The market paused this week while the Delta received much needed rain and the West Coast continues to remain hot and dry. Although some rain was forecast across the Texas Plains areas, most of the Texas crop is past the point of no return. Weather in China has helped to support this rally and analysts believe that the next USDA report will drop world production sharply lower. If this comes to pass, higher prices are expected into the last quarter of this year.

Marcia Leavell, a member of the Texico Cemetery Board, assisted Kurt in getting information onto the site.

"Marcia knows a lot of history," Kurt said. "She could even tell me where the extremely small town of Grady was," he laughed.

Marcia has entered almost 900 headstones, according to the site. Quite an accomplishment.

"I have never seen a genealogy site like this," Kurt stated. "It does recognize veterans and records dates for those headstones missing them. But it has so much more than that. In fact, registered users can put in information and photos of people on the site. I find photos to be more tangible than words," said Kurt.

"The site is mostly my family right now," Kurt added. "But we are always looking for add-ins who have a few minutes to put in information and contribute their knowledge to the site"

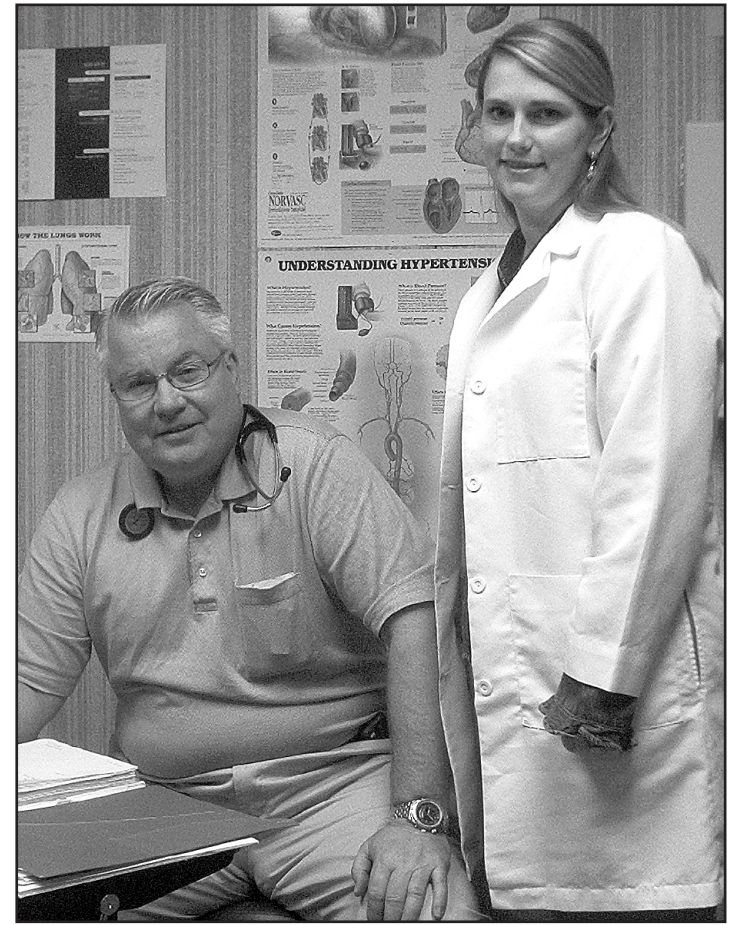

How zoning ordinance affects you

From City Manager Ernest Terry:
Bovina has a zoning ordinance that has evolved and been modified over the years, and there continues to be some misunderstanding about easements and right of way issues. What can property owners do with their property? That is a question, in one form or another, heard at City Hall almost daily.

The answer starts in two places at the same time. First is the requirement to obtain a Building Permit from City Hall. The cost is just \$25, and the Building Permit is required for all construction, enlargement, alteration, movement, improvement, conversion, or demolition of any building or structure in the City. This allows the City Building Inspector to insure that the property owner is compliant with all of the zoning issues within the City Code.

The second issue is right of way or the easements that the City and utility companies have within the City Limits. Basically, each City street easement is 80 foot wide. Now, the first response is that the pavement and curbs are only 38 feet wide. True. That leaves 42 feet of easement on what looks like a property owner's yard. There is also a 20 foot easement in the alley.

Now the question becomes: Where does the owner's property begin and end and where does the City's easement begin and end? The true answer actually requires a surveyor to answer. The simple and unofficial answer can be determined by measuring, from the center of a street, 40 feet toward the owner's house. That is the street easement. It may be used as part of the property owner's yard, and it may look like the owner's yard. The City has the right and obligation to regulate that easement by controlling obstructions, weeds, and signs. Anything made permanent or semi-permanent in that easement must have a permit.

Two examples of this are: anything made permanent such as fences or basketball goal/posts and trees or shrubs planted on the corners or at the curbs. The fences and basketball goal posts require a permit and are not authorized within the street easement. For safety reasons, trees and shrubs planted at intersection corners must be removed. Trees and shrubs planted on or next to the curbs must be removed.

This explanation may be as clear as mud at the bottom of Running Water Draw, for each property is different and has a different application of the zoning ordinance. If it is, please come to City Hall. The staff will do their best to answer your question and to explain the ordinance in a more personal manner.

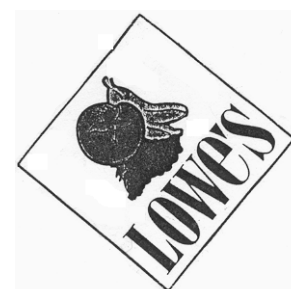
