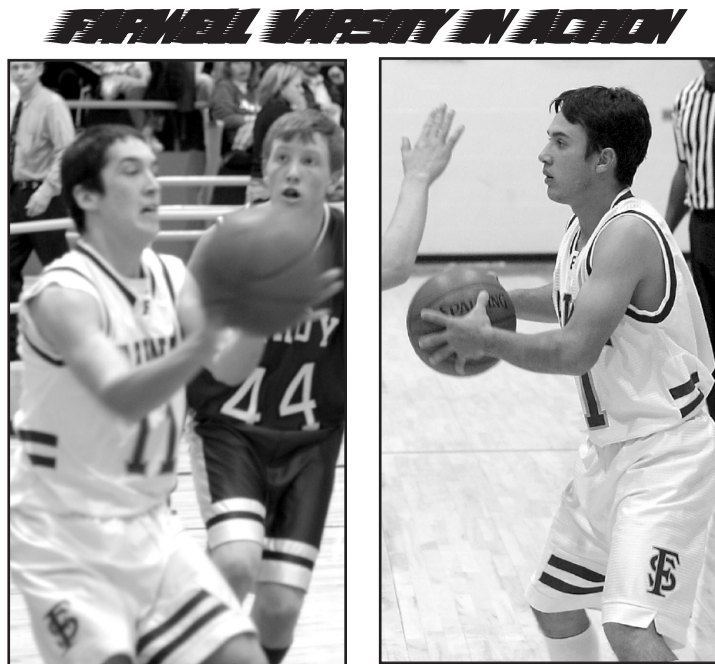

Texas Cooperative Extension will offer a regional workshops for 4-H shooting sports leaders and coaches April 28-30 at the Agricultural Research and Extension Center at Lubbock, one-half mile east of Interstate Highway 27 on FM 1294.

The workshop will cover archery, pistol, rifle, reloading, shotgun, black powder shooting and instruction specifically geared for coordinating a local shooting sports club or program.

Instructors will cover teaching and coaching techniques, the fundamentals of safety and firearms nomenclature, and strategies for success in youth program leadership.

From Plains Cotton Growers Inc.:

The big 2005 crop is still growing and the High Plains forecast is up 80,000 bales since December.

The High Plains region will produce a record breaking 5.63 million bales from the 2005 crop, eclipsing last year's \$4.9 million-bale record by more than 700,000 bales.

The January estimate is 80,000 bales higher than the National Ag Stats Service forecast in December.

Texico ag teacher Tod Pinnell reports there will be a Spring Ag Field & Project Day held during FFA Week next month at the school ag facility.

This will replace the spring hog show that had been held in years past, but not the last three years.

He felt that a project day will get more youths involved than the shows that used to be held. For example, elementary pupils can come and get hands-on experiences.

-- Extended the contract of Supt. Larry Gregory for another year.

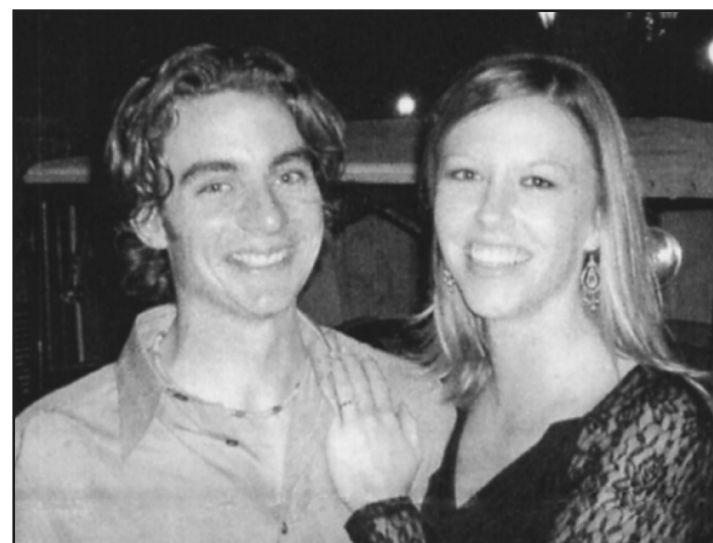
-- Heard that Farwell, with its new track, will host the Farwell Invitational Track Meet on March 24.

LIVE CATTLE: Cattle charts turned down this week for the first time since turning up last August. Although the market was able to rebound, the next couple of weeks should determine the next long term direction. Beef demand dropped off in 2005 which is the first time since turning up in 1998. Beef production is expected to increase over 9% in the first quarter of 2006. At this time, only new contract highs would turn the long term picture back positive. Although South Korea agreed to lift ban on US beef imports, keep in mind that in 2003, over 60% of exports were in the form of ibeef ribs. South Korea will continue to reject any US beef with bone.

FEEDER CATTLE: Long term trends also turned down this week for the first time since turning up in August. Most of the resistance above lies between \$113.00-114.00. Another drop below this weeks low of \$110.70 would project a drop down into the \$1.08 area basis the March contract.

CORN: Long term trends turned up in late December. The market has tested support around \$2.09 basis the March contract several times and has held thus far. Seasonal trends really begin to turn positive towards the end of this month. Sharply lower soybean prices have weighed on corn prices, but any turn up in beans will probably lead to higher corn prices.

SOYBEANS: The market dropped over 50 cents in just the last couple of weeks, but now looks to have found some fairly solid support. If trends are able to turn back higher from these levels, then it's possible that long term lows may be complete. World supplies and US ending stocks are fairly high, but world demand could put a dent in this if production does not keep pace this year.

WHEAT: The March KC contract has almost gained all of last weeks losses this week. The strong move back higher should hold for a few more days. It's not clear whether or not the market will make any new contract highs, but seasonally, prices normally come under pressure from late January into late February. Prices have declined over 90% of the time over the last 15 years.

COTTON: Although there remains some fairly strong resistance in the March contract around \$55.50, the long term seasonal picture began to turn up this week and should help to support this market into early March. The world is still betting that strong demand out of China will continue to drive this market higher over the near term. Technically, we need a close above \$55.50.

Farwell okays burn ban

The Farwell City Council on Tuesday approved a 90-day fire ban to parallel the one recently adopted by the Parmer County Commissioners.

The county's ban only covers unincorporated areas, so if the cities within Parmer County also want a ban, they must approve their own resolutions.

In other business, the council:

-- Approved two building permits: for Mike Pomper, 105 W. Ave. I, a sunroom; and for Shane Serratt, 700 block of 4th Street, a fence.

-- Approved the annual audit by CPA De'Aun Willoughby.

Of all the municipalities she audits, Mrs. Willoughby praised Farwell for the best management, best use of resources and highly efficient government.

Some of the audit's highlights were:

-- The total net assets for the year ending June 30, 2005, was \$2,236,906. Of that \$1,400,701 was invested in capital assets, net of related debts; and \$836,205 was unrestricted.

-- Capital assets increased from \$2,776,380 on June 30, 2004, to \$2,918,545 on June 30, 2005 -- an increase of \$142,165. The reason for the increase were street improvements, radio equipment, and equipment for the new fire tanker.

-- Tax collections increased from \$133,452 during the year ending June 30, 2004, to \$139,456 for the year ending June 30, 2005 -- an increase of \$6,004.

-- The city is paying one long-term debt, for construction improvements to the water works and sewer system. The original amount of the loan was \$400,000, at 5.5 percent interest. The loan is being paid from tax revenues. The loan balance as of June 30, 2005, was \$175,000.

-- Under "future trends," Mrs. Willoughby said, "The Farwell City Council continues to strive to maintain a quality of life for its residents. Agriculture continues to be our strong point. Farwell is becoming home to many employees of Southwest Cheese and area dairies."
