Wolverines win opener

The Texico Wolverines opened the 2006 season last Friday at home with a resounding 48-12 slaughter of Dexter.

The Class 2A Demons were thoroughly manhandled by the Wolverines, both on offense and defense. The game time was shortened as the "clock ran" late in the game.

Leading the charge was running back Larry Garrison. He gained 227 yards in the first half, then 75 more on the first two series of plays in the 3rd quarter. He returned late in the game for one offensive play, gaining 4 yards - a total of 306.

Coach Mike Prokop got the chance to play many of his substitutes throughout the second half.

The game opened with Dexter on its 29. Eduardo Rodriguez's tackle forced a punt. On Texico's first play, Garrison ran 55 yards for a TC at 9:21. The kick failed.

But Dexter's Miguel Romero took the kick 84 yards for a TD. The kick was blocked and it was 6-6.

Mario Posada returned the kick 17 yards to the Texico 38. Garrison ran for 9, 10 and 9, but the drive stalled at the Dexter 20.

Kyle Teitz had a TD-saving tackle at the Texico 43. Rodriguez recovered a fumble.

Casey Crist passed to Billy Scott for 19 yards. Garrison ran for 23, but Texico lost a fumble at the Demons' 14. Rodriguez had a good tackle on defense as the 1st quarter ended.

Mark Rivera's sack forced a punt, which went for 1 yard. Garrison scored from the 5 at 11:09 behind excellent blocking. Garrison ran in the extra points (from the 7 yard line after a penalty) and it was 14-6.

Dexter's Romero then took the kick and raced 80 yards for his 2nd TD. The run for extra points failed due to a Scott tackle.

Posada returned the kick to midfield. Crist ran for 10; Scott for 10; Sterling Bowers for 10, and Posada for 8. Garrison scored from the 2 at 5:45. The kick failed and it was 20-12.

Teitz tackled the kick returner at the Dexter 32. Brett Anderson had a good pass defensive play. Scott fought off a blocker and tackled the runner for a 5-yard loss. Teitz broke up a pass. Ethan McDaniel's good tackle forced a punt to the Texico 33.

Garrison then had a twisting, exciting cut-back run for a 67-yard TD. The run for extra points failed and it was 26-12 at 1:43.

Dexter started at its 44. Posada had a TD-saving tackle. Niko Ulibarri intercepted at midfield. Garrison ran for 33, and Edgardo Meza scored from the 7 at 1:04. Seth Bailey grabbed a 2-point pass from Crist.

On defense, Bailey had a QB sack as the half ended.

Meza started the 3rd quarter with a kick return to the Wolverines 25. Garrison ran for 35, then scored from 20 yards out. The Posada kick made it 41-12.

Dexter went 3 and out, and Bailey had a good punt return to midfield. Brett Anderson was in at QB. Garrison

LIVE CATTLE: Cash trade was sharply higher this week which came as a surprise as packer margins are turning red. The market has been in the process of topping over the last 2-3 weeks and this still looks to be the case. We had anticipated a drop into late August followed by another rally into early October. A turn down from here may not allow the market any room for a rally into October? A break below \$90.50 basis the nearby October contract would add tremendous pressure.

FEEDER CATTLE: The market was reluctant to react to the strength seen in Live Cattle prices and stronger cash fed cattle prices. This market is building a top in the market and prices are expected to move lower into the Fall. Much will depend on the direction fed cattle prices take. Feeders will follow.

CORN: The market has struggled to work back higher, but little help has come from the Mid West Crop Tour taking place at this time. There is resistance between \$2.45-2.52 basis the December contract. With the absence of any substantial news to push prices higher, the seasonal tendency may take hold a turn the market down into harvest which would be normal.

SOYBEANS: Beans have also remained under pressure as the Crop Tour taking place at this time has nothing but good things to say about the crop and expectations of near record production as we move into harvest. Technically, the November contract would need to close back above the \$5.70 level in order to turn the market back higher, but expect pressure into harvest.

WHEAT: The market got a little lift back up from attempts in the corn to move higher. Overall, rains across most of the major wheat growing areas have helped to alleviate any concerns about shortfalls in subsoil moisture as we move into planting. There are still some areas of concern, but probably not enough to really turn the long term trends back higher.

COTTON: The market has tested and held major support levels around the \$54.00 mark basis the December contract over the last few weeks. As long as prices can hold support, then there is still potential to move higher. The big question many traders are asking is why aren't prices much higher if shortfalls in US production seem to be known by all? Is world demand tapering off?

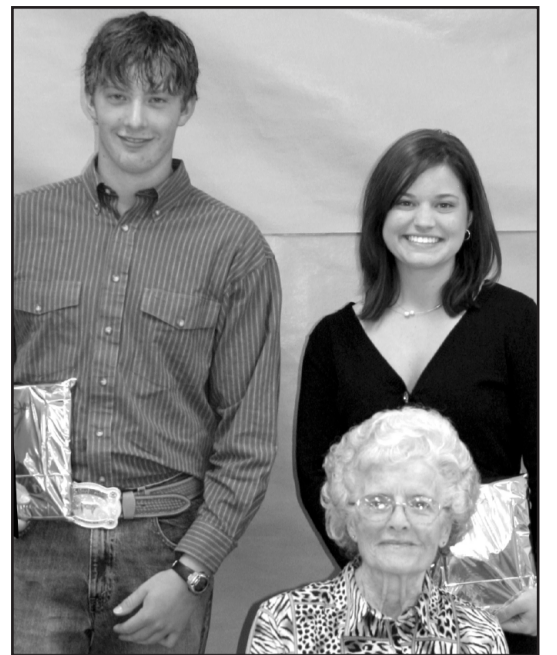

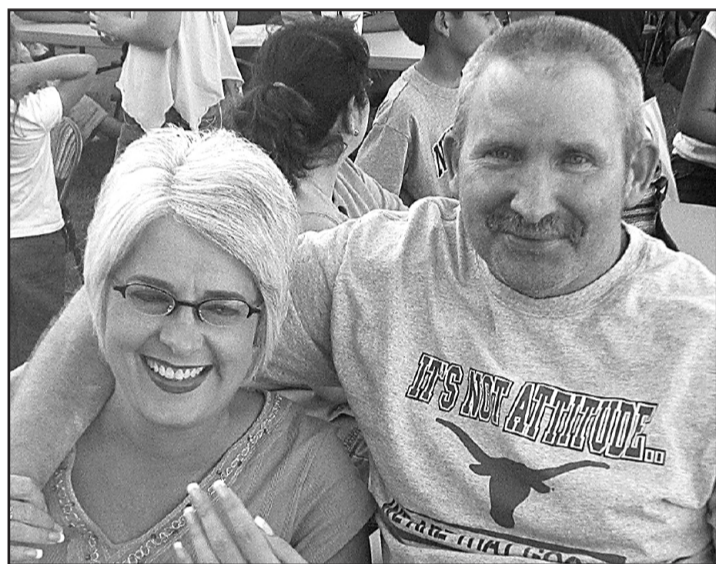
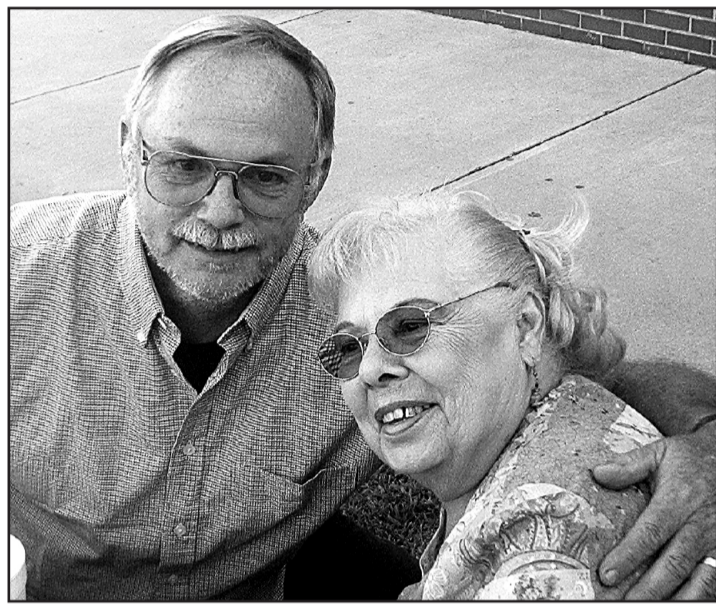

WT Services launches construction project

Work started this week and construction is expected to span a year.

WT Services will open an office in downtown Hereford as part of the project, providing the latest available technologies in telephone, high-speed Internet, digital cable television with high definition television capability, and video on demand as part of its package of offerings.

Thomas Hyer, WTRT general manager, says early work on the directional boring to install fiber optic cable for the project will begin in downtown Hereford, spreading to other areas of the city once downtown boring is completed. Services will be available as soon as the

fiber optic system reaches locations within the city.

The project will also result in a digital upgrade of WT Services cable TV systems in Friona and Bovina.

WT Services became a local telephone and cable television services provider within the city of Friona in March of 1998. Work on Bovina phone and cable services began in 1999.

WT Services, Inc. employees will perform all of the fiber optic cable installation for the Hereford system. Directional bores will allow workers to install fiber optic cable right up to

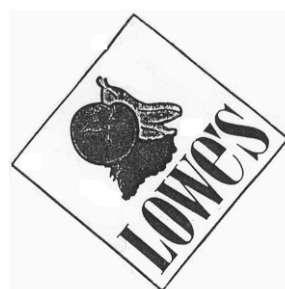
