School improvements bond issue scheduled

Texico School District voters will head to the polls on Sept. 9 to vote on a bond issue for school improvements.

Voting will take place at the Texico Community Center. For complete details, see the legal ad elsewhere in today's Tribune.

The overall school project will be about \$8.3 million but the bond issue is only for \$2.8 million. If the bond issue passes, the state will come up with a match for the remainder – about \$5.3 million.

On a \$50,000 house, the bond would mean an

additional \$3.32 tax per month.

Passage of bond issues for Texico over the years has meant great rewards from the state. For every 34 cents Texico voters have contributed through them, the state has chipped in 66 cents, said Supt. R.L. Richards.

If the bond issue is not passed, Texico cannot qualify for state funding for the construction project.

Here is what the project will entail:

1. Construct a new kitchen and cafeteria with a classroom wing

for pre-kindergarten, and physical and occupational therapy. Also, equip and furnish them.

2. Build and/or remodel existing restroom facilities in each school.

3. Renovate the existing vocational agriculture shop, and renovate the current cafeteria for vocational programs.

4. Renovate music classroom in the high school and the home economics classroom in the junior high for general education classrooms.

5. Fire alarm upgrades in several buildings.

Steers lose '2 day game'

The Farwell Steers lost their season opener to the Olton Mustangs on Saturday at home, 21-9.

The game began on Friday but was halted with 7 minutes left in the 2nd quarter by the threat of lightning, then resumed Saturday afternoon.

Farwell tried a successful onside kick, recovered by Julian Cuevas, to open the game. Landry Actkinson completed passes to Danny Brown and Austin Wright. On 4th and 2, a pass to Wright gained 10 more. Brown ran for 6, but Olton recovered a fumble at its 9.

On defense, Cameron Kirkland and Zac Stancell had good tackles. Olton hit a long pass to midfield. The Mustangs scored on a 9-yard run at 4:14 for a 7-0 lead.

Bo Mitchell had a big kick return and Farwell started at the Olton 39 after a penalty. On 4th and 10, Colby Read ran around end for a 1st down. Brown ran for 10 to the Olton 5, but Farwell lost a fumble at the Olton 3.

Caleb Christian then tackled the Olton runner in the end zone and the score was narrowed to 7-2.

Farwell started at midfield, was held and punted. On defense, good tackles were recorded by Stancell, Trevor Owen, Michell and Brown as the 2nd quarter began.

Olton punted. Brown ran for 7 and Johnathan Edwards for 20. Then Actkinson hit Austin Wright with a 26-yard TD strike at 7:12. The Edwards kick put Farwell up, 9-7.

Brown tackled the kick returner at the Olton 26 as the Friday portion of the game ended.

On defense, Mason Howard had a QB pressure. Mitchell had a good punt return. Brown ran for 11 but Farwell was stopped.

Wright and Caleb Christian had good tackles. Owen had a big hit. Olton punted with another good Mitchell return.

The 3rd quarter opened with a good kick return by Wright to the Farwell 44. Farwell had to punt (Edwards had a very strong punting game). Brody Grimes tackled the returner at the Olton 27. Caleb Christian and Mitchell had good tackles.

Caleb Christian intercepted near the Farwell goal line and returned it 25 yards. But Farwell's offense was stymied.

Olton's ground attack was effective and the Mustangs scored on a QB sneak at 1:36 for a 14-9 lead.

On defense in the 4th quarter, Edwards, Caleb

Christian and Grimes had good tackles. But Olton scored at 6:55 on a 10-yard run and a 21-9 lead.

The only highlight of the rest of the game came when Colton Christian caused a fumble recovered by Stancell at midfield.

Coach Mark Anglin noted that Edwards played despite suffering a separated shoulder.

Team stats: 1st downs, Olton 20, Farwell 9; rushing yards, Olton 219, Farwell 73; passing yards, Olton 86, Farwell 81. Farwell had a 41 yard punting average.

to auction off the green house and current pre-kindergarten building.

Dr. Richards said, "These school facilities are needed regardless of whether the bond issue passes. It's just a question of whether the Texico residents have to pick up the entire tab themselves as opposed to sharing the cost with taxpayers around the state."

The life of the bond issue is 15 years.

The 2007 winner was D.J. Vogler who averaged 8.08 a week on a 12-point scale. That means she got just 8 games of each week's 12 picked correctly to take home the big prize. Here are details for Texico utility rate hikes

Last week, the Texico City Council raised its utility fees, effective Sept. 1.

Here's a closer look at the new rates:

Water

The required monthly charge for the minimum use of 4,000 gallons for users within the city limits is now \$18.63.

The required monthly charge for the minimum use of 4,000 gallons for users outside the city limits is now \$23.36.

For each 1,000 gallons in excess of 4,000 gallons used monthly either within or outside the city limits is now \$4.18 per 1,000 gallons.

Sewer

Residential rates move to \$13.20 a month, and commercial rates increase to \$15.97 a month.

Refuse Disposal

For all residential structures (including mobile homes occupied as a residence) inside the city limits, the charge will be \$15.50 a month. For those outside the city limits, the fee increases to \$20.53 a month.

Commercial charges for the various types will be: Solid Waste 5 (1.5 yard), \$44.87; solid waste 6 (21.5 yard), \$88.26; solid waste 7 (3.0 yard), \$70.04; solid waste 8, (23.0 yard), \$138.62; solid waste 9 (4.0 yard), \$84.66; solid waste 10 (34.0 yard), \$251.05; solid waste 11 (43.0 yard 3 times a week), \$615.01; solid waste 12 (63.0 yard 3 times a week), \$921.77; solid waste 13 (1.5 yard and 3.0 yard), \$113.44; solid waste 14, \$59.21; solid waste 15, \$595.20; solid waste 16, \$58.89; and solid waste 17 (3.0 yard 2 times a week), \$115.17.

In other business at the meeting, the City Council: - Heard that A&D Engineering is scheduled to be at the next meeting to discuss Phase II of the water project. This will include connecting two new wells into the city water system.

- Heard Police Chief Doug Bowman say that there will be more saturation patrols in Texico looking for drunk drivers. He said there has been a noticeable decrease in speeders in town, but tickets are still up from last year.

Bowman also said that he is working with the state to look at the speed limits on the Pleasant Hill highway as it passes by the school. There is a possibility that the speed limit will be raised, and signs put up with school hours to make it easier to know when children are present.

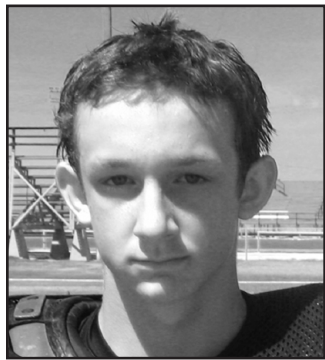
And think of all the bragging you can do. Women especially love to point out to their husbands "about who has the higher scores..." It's a kick. It's fun.

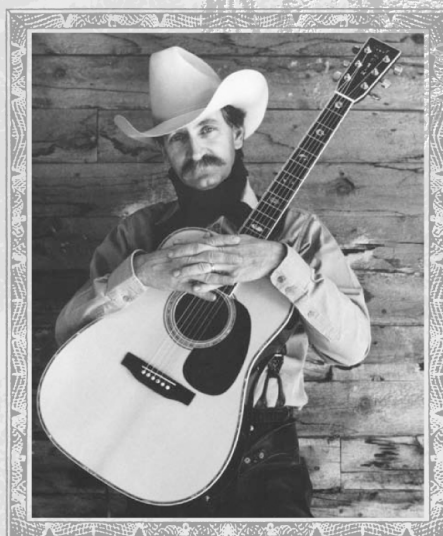

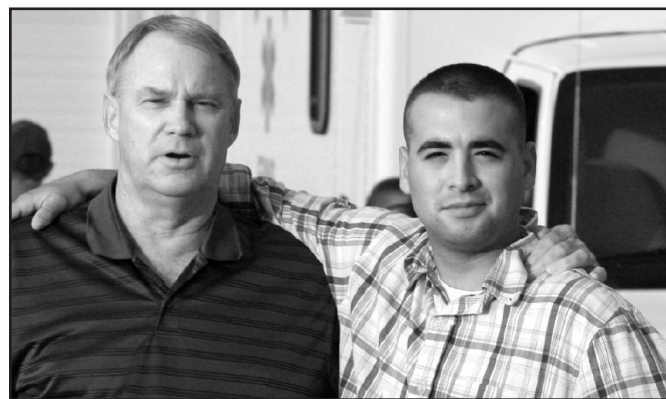

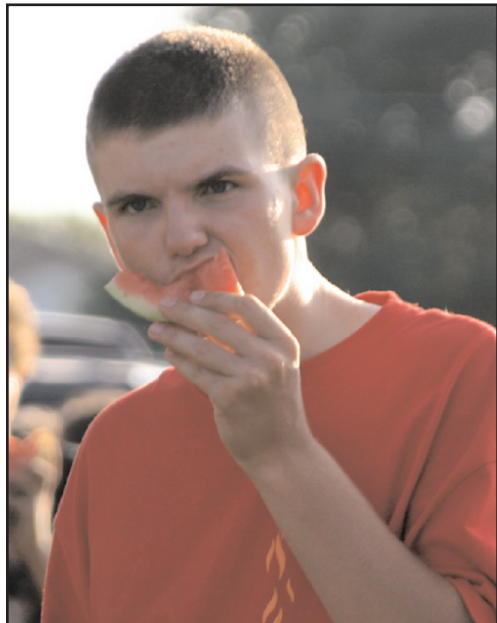

Lakeside Drive, North 1731 to get water line upgrades

The City of Bovina has gotten word that it will receive a \$228,000 state grant for water line upgrades.

The grant was sought by former City Manager Ernest Terry in 2006 from the state Office of Rural Community Affairs (ORCA).

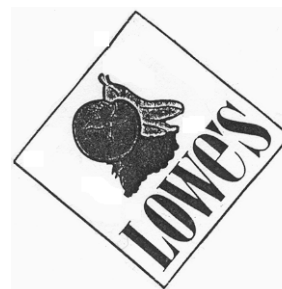
