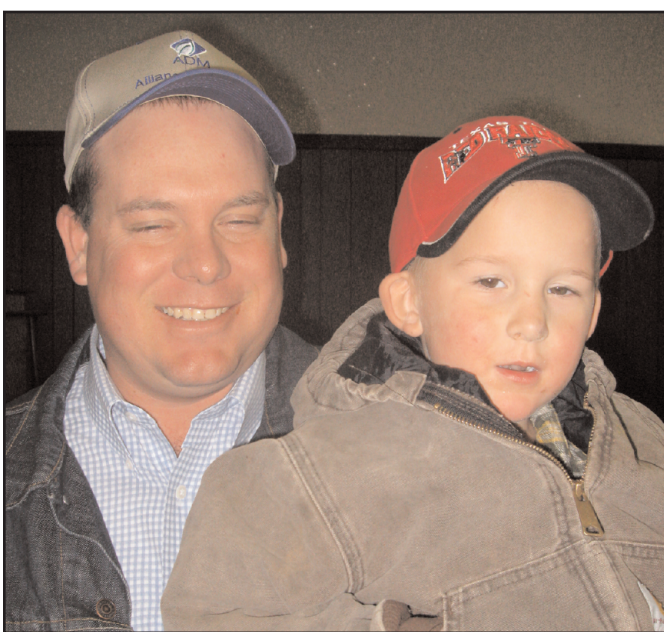

-- Received a report from cafeteria manager Fela Sena.

-- Heard that trigonometry is now being offered on-line through Clovis Community College to high school students of Marlene Anderson.

-- Plans to replace air conditioning units at the junior high and high school.

-- Received some trees for planting at the baseball field. Trees will be planted Feb. 5 and 6.

-- Continued planning for a bond issue, tentatively set for September, to finance a new cafeteria and kindergarten rooms building. These plans were detailed in the Tribune last month.

-- Renewed Supt. R.L. Richards' contract another year. He is one a 3-year contract.

Parmer County okays burn ban exemptions

The Parmer County Commissioners on Monday made a couple of changes in the county's burn ban.

Two exemptions were approved:

1. The burning of trash in earthen pits is allowed on days that are foggy, drizzly and/or rainy.

2. Cal-Main Foods is allowed to burn construction trash during construction of their new facility in Oklahoma Lane.

County Judge Bonnie Heald wanted residents to also know that household trash can be dumped at the following sites without charge:

1. Friona dump site, Tuesday through Saturday, from 12:30 to 5:30 p.m.

2. Lazbuddie dump site, Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Farmers also are encouraged that when they burn stubble to contact their county commissioner, the county sheriff and the local fire department.

In other business, the commissioners:

-- Agreed to give the radiant heater installed at the county jail recreation room free to the city of Friona where it will be installed in the show barn. The heater gives out too much heat for the rec room.

-- Agreed to have Kirkland & Co. CPA firm to do the annual audit again.

-- Approved the 2008 holiday schedule; no big changes from this year.

-- Changed the division of money for the 2008 subsidy for the five county fire departments (approved 3-1 with Friona area county commissioner Kirk Frye opposed). The commissioners added \$25,000 in this year's budget to bring the total to \$75,000.

The \$50,000 amount had remained static for over a decade.

Of this amount, \$7,000 will be given each department -- Friona, Bovina, Lazbuddie, Farwell and Rhea-Hollene. This amount is up \$2,000 from last year per department.

The remaining \$40,000 will be used for the funds given each department according to the number of fire calls they make during the year.

The trio also had been picked to play in Amarillo's Golden Spread All-Star Tourney last week but chose to play in the EPAC basketball tourney instead.

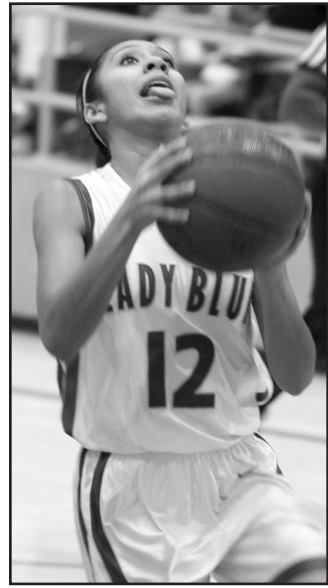

Farwell Street Supt. Joe Servin reported that they had a problem with the water tower pump on Tuesday night, when it didn't stop and start correctly.

Truckers invited to Farwell meeting

The Farwell City Council on Tuesday discussed a city truck ordinance that was put in place about 8 years ago.

The ordinance calls for trucks heavier than 12,000 lbs. to be parked outside the city.

Councilman Johnny Vidaurri said trucks are not allowed in the city, but allowed to be parked on private property.

The council discussed letting trucks in or to make them park outside town, allow only tractors in as long as they don't have a trailer, or ask them to park at the grain elevators on the north side of town.

This would not affect trucks that are making deliveries in town, only those that are driving through or stopping for a long period of time.

Mayor Jimmie Mace asked to put the issue on the next agenda and to check on Friona's ordi-

nances. He also asks that trucking representatives come to the next meeting if they have input on the situation.

In other news, the council:

- Heard that councilmen Vidaurri, Ysleta Kittrell, and Wayne Gruben are up for election this year. The filing dates are from Feb. 9 to March 4. The election is May 10.

Councilman Tim Kasel said that it looks like he will be moving out of town, so he would have to resign. Mace said that they will look at staying with four councilmen or appointing someone to take his place.

- Authorized buying new tables for the Farwell Community Center. Twenty two of the old tables had to be thrown away because they were in bad shape. The city will buy plastic tables because they are much less expensive and easier for people to set up.

- Received a report from Chief of Police Scott Burton. He has had pneumonia but is feeling much better now.

In January, a motorcycle was taken from the front porch of a home in the 400 block of 1st Street.

- Approved City Code Inspector Lee Hutchins to get an engineering study of the city water supply and the pipe system. There are several parts of town that don't have very good water pressure and if the city is interested in getting future grant money to replace, upgrade or put in new lines and hydrants, than this is the first step.

- Hutchins reported on the work being done next to 1st Street to help with drainage. Some has been done, but the railroad still needs to approve one part that is on their land.

Hutchins also said Ricky Boddy, owner of home at 413 2nd St., said he would tear it down but so far no work has been done. The council voted to give him a 30-day notice before condemning the house, then tearing it down.

Hutchins said repairs have started on the house at 410 2nd St.

Bovina no longer has a JV girls basketball team. Some of the girls were moved up to varsity.

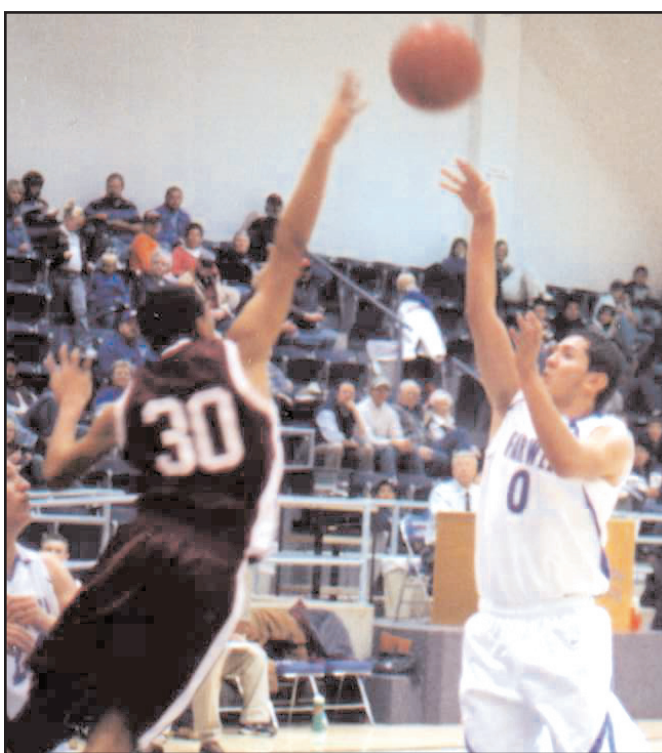
Bovina Elementary School Principal Darla Sealey has an interesting activity that promotes perfect attendance. It's called "Jump for George."

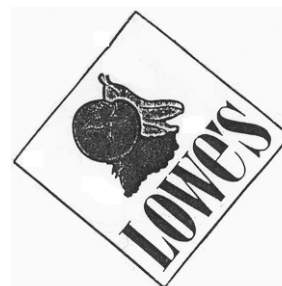
