Caprock Dairy, LLC, 160 County Road 50, Muleshoe, Texas 79347 has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) under General Permit No. TXG920000 for authorization to expand an existing dairy cattle
facility from 4,850 head to 5,850 head, of which 4,500 are milking cows in Lamb County, Texas. The notice of intent was received by TCEQ on October 19, 2009. No discharge of pollutants into the waters in the state is authorized by this general permit except under chronic or catastrophic rainfall conditions or events. All waste and wastewater will be beneficially used on agricultural land.
The existing facility is located at 160 County Road 50 , near the City of Muleshoe, Lamb County, Texas.
