The family of the Agriculturalist of the Year came to the West Camp community on Jan. 30, 1930. Thy bought a section of land at $\$ 35$ an acre and planted maize, hegari and sudan. Money was tight and the times were trying. Of course, they had their own hogs, cows and chickens.
The children attended grad school at West Camp and, after completing the 8th grade, transferred to Farwell High School. The honoree's sisters attended had two sons. The other sister and her husband had one son.
The honoree remained on the farm and helped his dad. He later joined the service in 1945 and served in the Merchant Marines. He soon returned to help his dad on the farm and married on May 28, 1948.
He and his wife were able to start their three sons and a daughter in their own separate farming opera tions. This family has been very successful in thei farming endeavors and represent five generations, starting with John S. and Beulah Stone Williams, who have contributed to the economy of this area. The Williams family was struck with tragedy when two of their sons, Barry and Eric, were killed in a plane crash in 1999. The loose ends were picked up and the family continued farming.

on spring planting

## By

As the spring planting season rolls around for many producers in Parmer County we start looking soil temperatures as a guide for planting of crops conducive to a rapid rise in the soil temperature Many parts of the county have reported from a half to nearly an inch and a half of precipitation. This pre cipitation also slows the process of the soil temper ature rise.
Cotton production favors warm temperatures for ptimum growth.
It prefers soil temperatures above 64 degrees Fahrenheit. It can germinate if the mean temperature of the day is 60 degrees Fahrenheit however the process is slowed forcing a slower emergence of the plant.
Cotton is a tropical plant and during the germination period temperatures below 50 degrees can cause chilling injury. Chilling injury can resulting in malformed seedlings, loss of taproot, reduced also increase the chance for seedling disease Temperatures need to exceed 80 degress dur Te day and not fall below 50 degrees at night when planting for optimum results because the optimum temperature for cotton germination is above 65 degrees.
