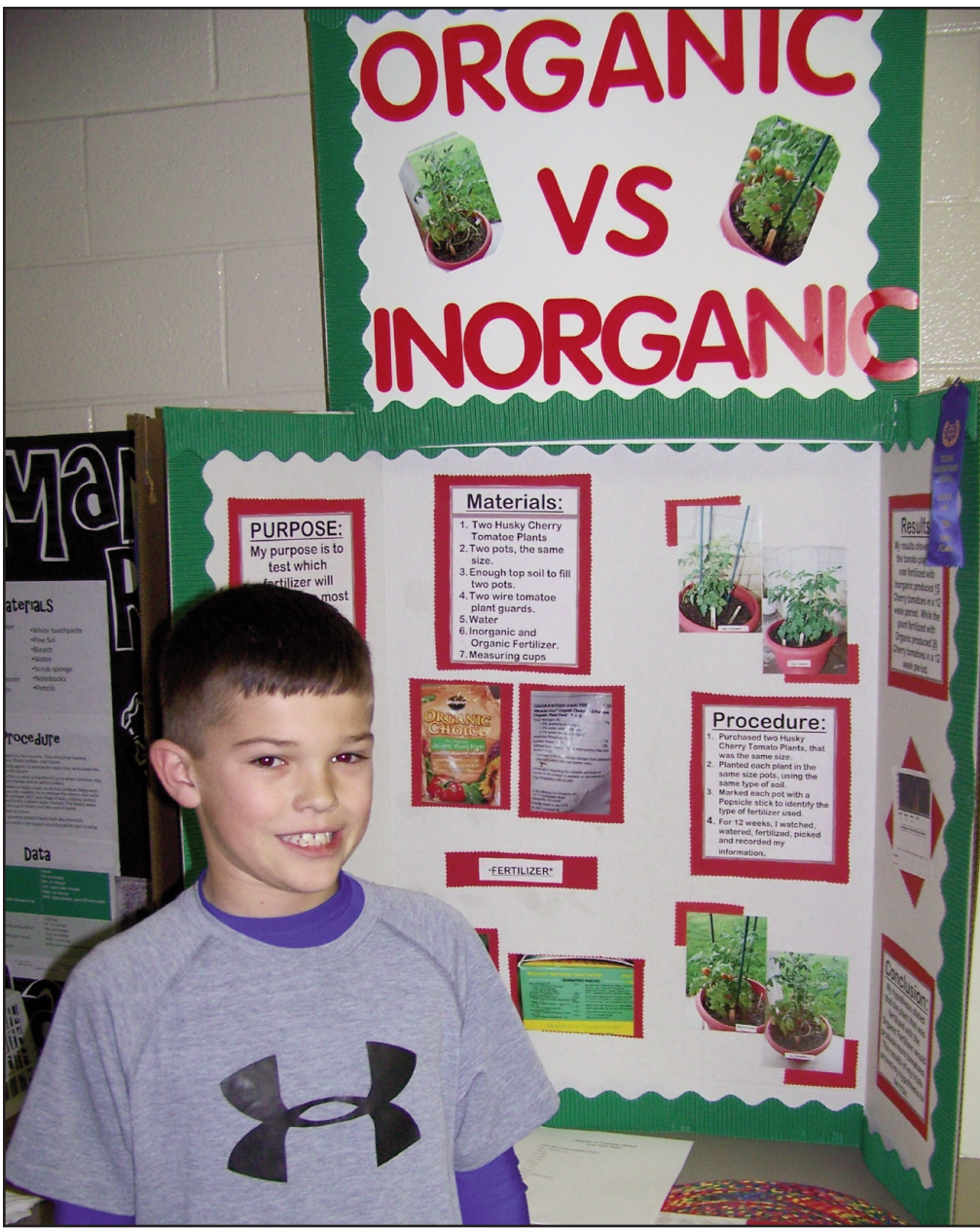

If you have higher standards in the classroom, the dropout rate will increase. Students will then turn toward colleges with easier standards.

Folks, I know people who have graduated from major universities and can't spell the simplest of words.

Thank goodness for spell check, they say.

Am I wrong or shouldn't college graduates be able to spell most simple words on their own instead of depending on the computer?

It must be me. I'm out of date and not ready for the future.

Live Cattle prices have fallen over the last few days, but have yet to take out any major long term support levels at this time. Most support basis the nearby February contract lies around the \$105.85 level which is also the low that held before the most recent rally took place. Cash trade has also softened to some degree, but not enough to turn anyone from Bull to Bear. Market is weak, but holding support.

Feeder prices have also drifted back off their highs made last week, but a reversal back higher early this week could lead to another move back up over the near term. There are some who believe a 'spike' top could have been made last week, but until prices make another attempt to test those levels and 'fail', long term trends will remain higher. The Cash Feeder Index has held up fairly well which could support prices.

Soybean prices have leveled off after spiking up for one day after the last USDA Crop Production report. The market made several attempts to break out to new highs and continue, but instead have moved back down into lower levels. There is some fairly strong support around last weeks low at \$13.83 basis the March contract. A break below this level should lead to a test of the \$13.50 area.

Corn prices moved up into the \$6.67 level early last week, sold off and tried once again late in the week to break out to new highs, but failed. Prices have not moved far enough off last weeks highs to turn short term trends down, but a close below the \$6.50 level would be enough to confirm a short term high. A close above last weeks highs should lead to a test of the psychological level of \$7.00 basis the March contract.

Wheat prices were able to break out to new highs late last week and saw more to the upside again this week. Most of the support came from more news of widespread damage in Australia couple with extremely dry conditions across most major winter wheat growing areas in the U.S. which has created concerns. Trends have continued to indicate higher prices, but still need help from beans and corn.

Cotton prices also broke out to new high territory this week all the way out into December. All contracts either closed up the 500 point limit or traded there. The volatility in this market has been indescribable. Prices have been able to move in 30cent increments in either direction for several months. Prices trading in on direction or the other in 'limit up or limit down' fashion has limited this market to primarily Funds.

Notice of Application and Preliminary Decision for water quality land application permit for municipal wastewater amendment Permit No. WQ0014730001

APPLICATION AND PRELIMINARY DECISION: City of Bovina, P.O. Box 720, Bovina, Texas 79009-0720, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for a major amendment to TCEQ Permit No. WQ14730001 to authorize a reduction in BOD₅ monitoring frequency and to clarify that the number of ponds mentioned in Special Provision 15 of the existing permit should be 2. The current permit authorizes the disposal of treated domestic wastewater at a daily average flow not to exceed 250,000 gallons per day via surface irrigation of 63 acres of non-public access pastureland, which will remain the same. This permit will not authorize a discharge of pollutants into waters in the State. TCEQ received this application on September 7, 2010.

The wastewater treatment facility and disposal site are located approximately 0.75 mile northeast of the intersection of State Highway 86 and East Street, to the south of State Highway 86 in Parmer County, Texas 79009. The wastewater treatment facility and disposal site are located in the drainage basin of White River Lake in Segment No. 1240 of the Brazos River Basin.

The TCEQ Executive Director has completed the technical review of the application and prepared a draft permit. The draft permit, if approved, would establish the conditions under which the facility must operate. The Executive Director has made a preliminary decision that this permit, if issued, meets all statutory and regulatory requirements. The permit application, Executive Director's preliminary decision, and draft permit are available for viewing and copying at Bovina City Hall, 205 North Street, Bovina, Texas.

PUBLIC COMMENT / PUBLIC MEETING. You may submit public comments or request a public meeting about this application. The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or to ask questions about the application. TCEQ holds a public meeting if the Executive Director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. After the deadline for submitting public comments, the Executive Director will consider all timely comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. **Unless the application is directly referred for a contested case hearing, the response to comments will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments and to those persons who are on the mailing list for this application. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions for requesting a contested case hearing or reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision.** A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

TO REQUEST A CONTESTED CASE HEARING, YOU MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN YOUR REQUEST; your name, address, phone number; applicant's name and proposed permit number; the location and distance of your property/activities relative to the facility; a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the facility in a way not common to the general public; and the statement "{I/we} request a contested case hearing." If the request for contested case hearing is filed on behalf of a group or association, the request must designate the group's representative for receiving future correspondence; identify an individual member of the group who would be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity; provide the information discussed above regarding the affected member's location and distance from the facility or activity; explain how and why the member would be affected; and explain how the interests the group seeks to protect are germane to the group's purpose.

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for reconsideration or for a contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

The Commission will only grant a contested case hearing on disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material to the Commission's decision on the application. Further, the Commission will only grant a hearing on issues that were raised in timely filed comments that were not subsequently withdrawn.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ACTION: The Executive Director may issue final approval of the application unless a timely contested case hearing request or request for reconsideration is filed. If a timely hearing request or request for reconsideration is filed, the Executive Director will not issue final approval of the permit and will forward the application and request to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

Bovina seeks citizen input

Bovina's residents are requested to contact city hall or council members with their requests and suggestions for the recreation center that will be completed this year. They may also wish to attend the next meeting for that purpose.

The recreation center committee will meet Feb. 3 at 7 p.m. in Bovina's EMS building. That meeting will consolidate all center ideas for submission to an architect to prepare the final design.

Bovina's committee to plan the 7,200 sq. ft. community and recreation center studied the initial design proposal on Jan. 20.

"We intend this to be a center that will be used every day," said city manager Jana Pitcock. "We really want to give something to everyone who lives in our community."

The initial design calls for a half-court basketball gym (52' x 60') with an adjoining stage area and a fully equipped kitchen so it can be used for banquets and other festivities. Adjacent will be an infant care facility, a teen recreation room, and an adult work-out center.

"The adjoining walls will have shatter-proof glass," said Mayor Stan Miller. "That way, a mother on the walking machine or a father lifting weights will be able to watch their children at the same time."

The center will offer indoor and outdoor walking tracks and an upstairs coffee bar and balcony.

Bovina has won grants to finance the project -- avoiding shifting the burden onto the city's taxpayers. With a combination of the grant money

and funds or interest payments the city has set aside, the total in hand exceeds \$471,000.

The cost estimate is between \$432,000 (\$60 a sq. ft.) and \$468,000 (\$65 a sq. ft.) so the city already has the project fully funded. Separate grant funding has been identified to install an electric marquis exterior to the building with which Bovina's citizens can read updates on their community day and night.

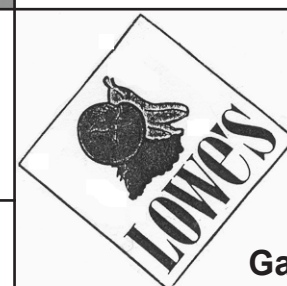
