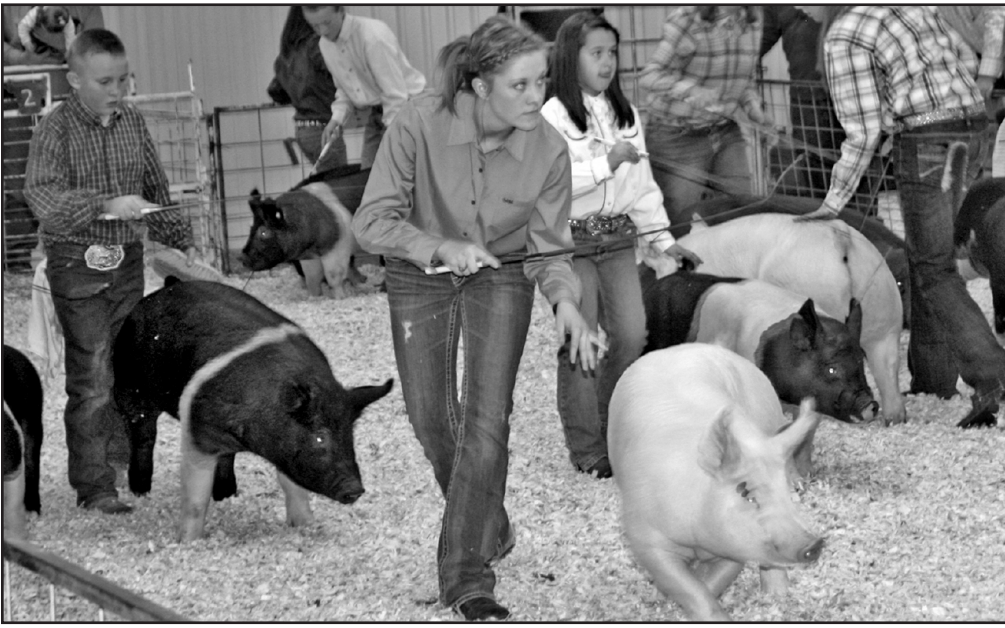

If you turned 65 years old as of January 1, 2011, then you need to sign up for the "65 and older" Homestead Exemption. This is a permanent exemption so if you already have signed up for it, you don't have to re-apply.

Just Passing Through

WILL ANDERSON

President Obama made a speech in Indonesia on his last world excursion condemning Israel for building apartments for Jewish families in Jerusalem...

He then chimed in again with his vision for an "internationalized Jerusalem" and the ceding of more Israeli land to Islamic control.

The president can obviously read; he is famous for needing a teleprompter before he can say good morning. Why doesn't he read some of the history of Israel and her Islamic neighbors before he recites nonsense like that?...

Israel is the only democracy in the Middle East. Its population is one-third Muslims who have full rights as citizens and voters and who make up one-third of its national legislature.

With the Palestinians, in contrast, you are dead if you're not Muslim, or even if you're the wrong kind of Muslim. The rival Islamic terrorist groups, Hezbollah and Fatah, kill each other on a recurring basis.

Does it sound reasonable to reward killers like that with part of Jerusalem?

How could our president fail to recognize the hypocrisy of assailing Israel while he was standing in Indonesia or in any other Islamic nation? The Indonesia in which Obama was speaking makes it illegal to be Jewish, period.

sands of their Christian neighbors and just prior to Obama's visit, a Catholic bishop was beheaded on the street outside his home as his Islamic neighbors watched and cheered.

Does it sound reasonable to reward monsters like that with part of Jerusalem?

The same is true in almost every Islamic nation in the world. Synagogues and churches are forbidden and even where permitted, they are in peril. The church I helped to build in Pakistan in 1982 had required more than 80 years just to get a construction permit.

Since its completion, its congregation has been bombed twice in its services and its deacons have to stand outside the church with shotguns to protect their families as they worship inside.

Does it sound reasonable to reward terrorists like that with part of Jerusalem?

Saudi Arabia ordered the American soldiers who saved their country in Desert Storm to leave their Bibles and Torahs at home and to remove the crosses, crucifixes, and stars of David from their dog-tags.

The Dept. of State, as might be expected, bowed and said "of course!" Our soldiers, however, just ignored the Saudis and the Dept. of State.

If the soldiers could recognize and reject absurdities like that then, does it sound reasonable to reward even worse absurdities now?

Israel has ceded the Sinai and its Gazan, Samaritan, and Galilean territories to Palestinian control over the years in

hopes that it might bring peace.

In each case, Islamic terrorists have used these lands to launch artillery shells and Katyusha rockets by the thousands onto Israeli cities. They produce suicide-vests there filled with plastic explosives and nails for their bombers to detonate in the crowded markets or schoolyards of Israel.

Palestinian Muslims have razed all churches and synagogues in the lands ceded to them. In the city of Hebron, they backed up a fleet of concrete mixers and filled up the ancient tomb of the Hebrew patriarch, Joseph.

Palestinian Christians have fared no better. When USS Forrestal took me to the Holy Lands in 1979, they made up the great majority of the city of Bethlehem. Under the control of a Jewish Israel, Palestinian Christians had lived there in peace and flour-

ished for decades.

Two years after Bethlehem passed to Palestinian control, the Palestinian Christians had been almost completely forced out their ancestral homes by the threats and violence of Palestinian Muslims.

Would reason reward intruders and despoilers like that with a part of Jerusalem?

If the United Nations or the European Union demanded that America "internationalize" Washington D.C. in order to placate Islamic terrorists like Osama bin Laden, Americans would quite legitimately (and quite forcefully) tell them to go to hell. That is certainly what Israel should be saying now.

However, the philosopher has observed that "hell is the impossibility of reason." With their assaults on reason in regard to Jerusalem these days, Israel's adversaries may well be on the way.

Farwell council agreed to keep renting city equipment

The Farwell city council on Jan. 18 discussed the use of city equipment by city residents.

It has been customary for the city to provide its equipment and the personnel qualified in their operation to citizens who make the request and pay the standard fee of \$10 an hour for smaller equipment, \$20 for a trailer to load debris and its disposal in the city landfill, or \$50 for major equipment like a backhoe.

The council agreed that this practice to the benefit of citizens in town or adjacent to it would continue on the current basis that such use would not detract from the city's own use of the equipment.

In other business, the

council:

Voted to reject the resolution from Southwest Public Service to increase the tariff on energy in Farwell. The council determined to reach a resolution in cooperation with all neighboring communities to facilitate a scheme of uniform rates for them all.

Learned that applications are being received to fill the vacancy in the Water Superintendent's position and that they are under consideration.

Received the report from police chief Larry Kelsay that in 2010 city law enforcement had made 567 traffic stops with 51 percent producing a warning and 49 percent ending in citation or arrest.

"We made 33 arrests in 2009 and 49 arrests in 2010" the chief continued.

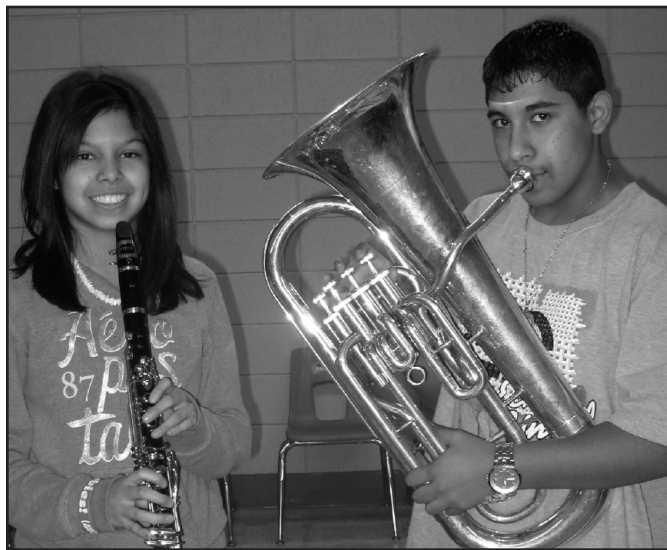

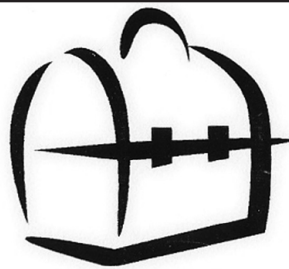

Read: State's budget crisis impacts schools

An article on school finances from Farwell School Supt. Mike Read:

In the coming weeks, I will be writing a few articles on the most pressing issues school districts face. First, I will summarize and provide some local figures and examples to help clarify it.

The largest part of our property tax bills is to pay school taxes. But local property taxes don't make up the majority of the revenue our school receives.

Most of our funding comes from local and state tax dollars determined through a complex, and often confusing, formula. The current formula contains over 50 variables, for example.

The concept sounds fair and equitable: higher property values and more students create more revenue. Unfortunately, that's not how it works. As local taxpayers' tax burden increases each year, local schools receive little or no benefit.

The additional dollars don't flow to the school district or end up in teachers' pay checks. Instead, those extra dollars go into the state's "general fund."

A good way to view school funding is to think of it as a bucket. First, the local school district puts in money from local taxes. Then the remaining space is filled with state and federal dollars. The bucket is now full.

As your property values increase, our tax dollars increase. But the bucket doesn't grow bigger. The state simply reduces the amount of money that it puts into the bucket.

With our current system, the bucket's size is determined by a formula called "the hold-harmless target revenue level." This means that if the formula results in less money than a predetermined amount for each district, the local schools receive the greater of the amounts.

The problem with both the formulas and "hold-harmless" is they result in different sized buckets in every community. Is this fair?

The average revenue for Texas schools is \$5,064 per weighted student. Target revenues, though, range from \$3,879 per student to a maximum of \$13,086.

Only 308 of the state's 1,029 school districts have a target revenue of \$5,064 per student -- the state average.

Farwell School has a target revenue of \$4,790 per student, which ranks in the bottom 25 percent of the state. Thus, 75 percent of the state's other schools have more money per child to spend on educating their students than Farwell has.

If we received a higher amount, we would have more funds to stay pace with rising overhead costs, fixed costs, teacher step raises, rising fuel prices and, hopefully, enough money to meet new academic standards heading our way in 2013.

More than 60 percent of Texas schools are using reserve funds to help pay current operating expenses. Fortunately, Farwell is not in that category.

But the state is looking at a large budget deficit measured in the billions and Farwell could possibly be looking at a 5 percent cut for next school year and a 10 percent cut the following school year.

Farwell operates off a \$5.4 million budget. 5 percent cut would be around \$270,000; and you can double that for 10 percent.

Every Texas school district is held to the same high accountability standards are dedicated to seeing that "No Child is Left Behind."

But, through no fault of our own, too many students are asked to compete and succeed on an academic playing field which is tilted in the wrong direction for schools like us. It doesn't seem fair to us that while Farwell gets under \$5,000 a student, other schools get up to \$13,000 a student.

Supt. Read's contract extended

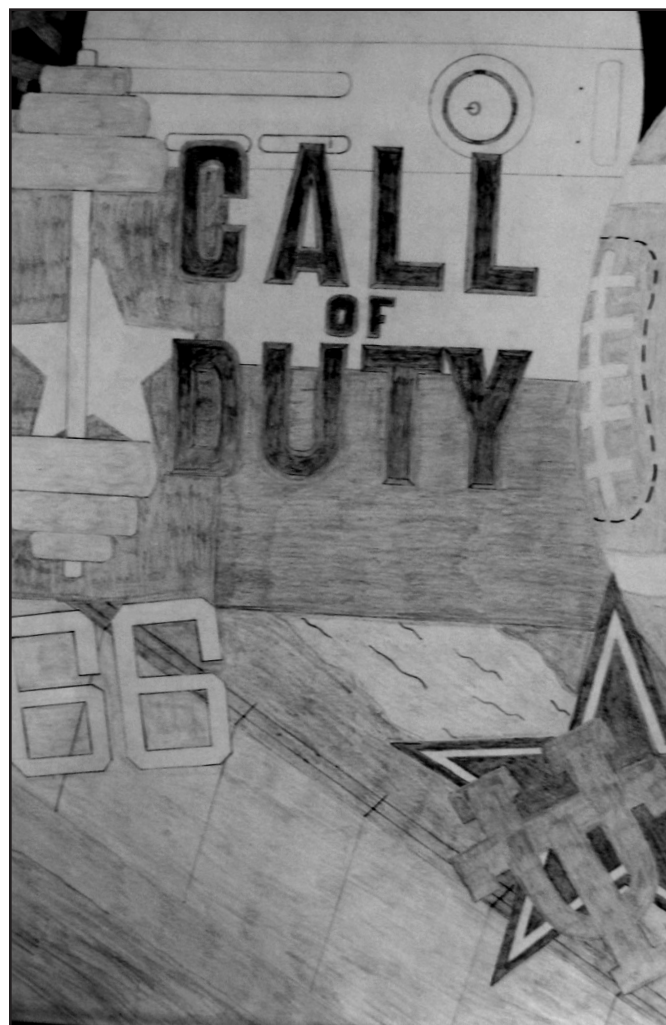

Bovina Council approves subdivision north of city

The Bovina City Council on Jan. 13 approved a subdivision installation just north-east of the city limits with the specification that it meets city codes.

This includes that any mobile homes there be placed on permanent foundations and relinquish their mobile home status.

The city has the right to maintain control of proposed subdivisions within a mile of the city limits.

Realtor Daren Sudderth represented several individuals who have purchased lots (5 to 10 acres) there.

The council also was advised that funds are in place for the construction of the new community center.

The preparations have begun with the removal of abandoned buildings on the site adjacent to city hall.

The community center is made possible not through local taxes but grants for which Bovina competed and won.

It will provide a care

facility for toddlers, a recreation center for juveniles, a work-out center including an indoor half-basketball court flanked by a stage for speakers and entertainment, and a complete kitchen for community festivities.

Space will also be available for requirements such as inoculations and other community programs. An outdoor electronic marquis to provide continuous community updates to residents was approved and competition for bids will begin shortly.

"We've very enthusiastic about this project," said city manager Jana Pitcock. "I feel certain that the center will be up and running no later than this autumn."

Bovina's administrators have created a committee to finalize plans for the center with its first meeting to be conducted at the EMS Center on Jan. 20 at 7 p.m.

The city has also submitted its request for grant money to construct a crisis response cell as

part of the center complex. Should that transpire, it will serve residents throughout the county, coordinating rescue and recovery in the event of tornados or other natural disasters.

In other business, the city council:

-- Learned that automatic meter reading devices have been installed at 270 residences thus far and that installation has begun on the emergency generators to power city water wells if normal power is lost.

These civic improvements are also funded by grants.

-- Accepted the bid by Farby Construction to construct a gazebo in the city park. Work will begin there soon.

-- Began planning for a community banquet to be held March 26. The city will sponsor this event on a "gap-filler" basis. City officials are working on re-establishing the Chamber of Commerce, which disbanded last spring due to lack of workers.

The dinner also includes cream potatoes, green beans, homemade sauerkraut, cranberry sauce, relish, homemade bread and desserts.

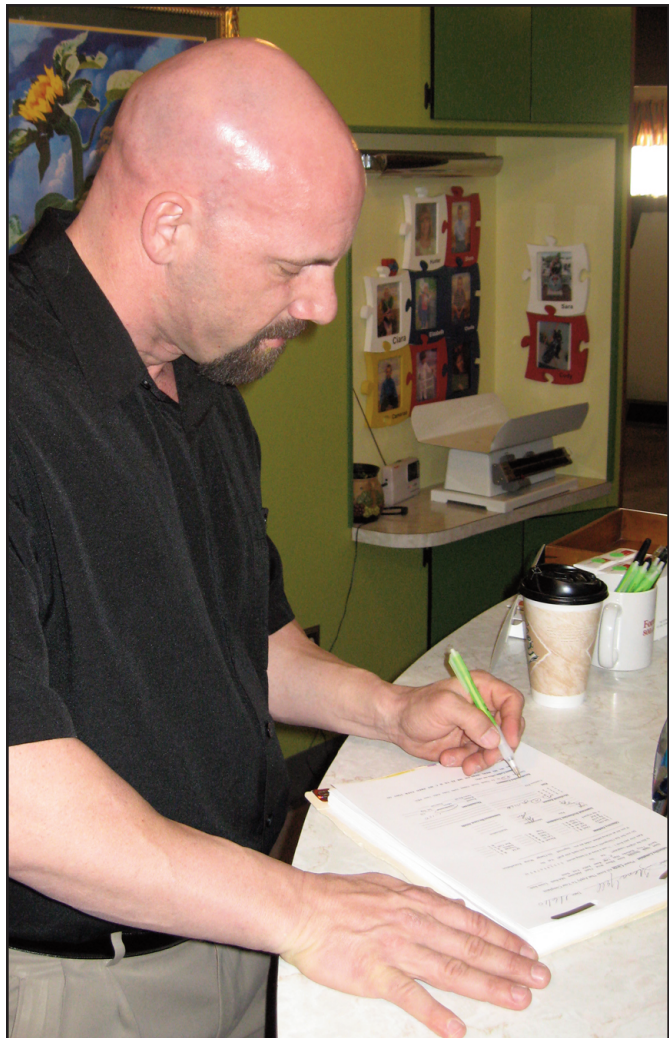

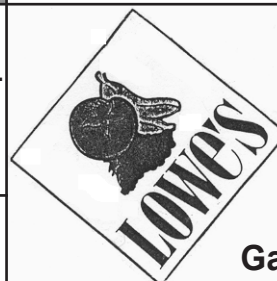
