The youthful Texico Wolverines capped off a great season with a tough battle against the No. 1 rated Tularosa Wildcats Friday in the state semi-finals Tere, falling 41-19.
Tularosa started at its 35 . On the first play from crimmage, Brandon King tackled the ball carrier for loss. Great tackles by DJ Griego and Donovan tarily. A great play by Jesus Rivera kept Tularosa out of the end zone but on the next play the Wildcats sored.
