They include requiring 65 percent of students to 60 percent, for example, and it refers to each of the 60 percent, for example, and it refers to each of the
student groups -- African-American, Hispanic, White and economically disadvantaged.
It also included limited English-speaking student scores and completion rates as "evaluation categories.'
A check of the 63 school districts in the Texas Panhandle show these totals for 2011 (with 2010 otals in parentheses):
2011 -- exemplary, 3 (20); recognized, 24 (26); acceptable, 31 (17); and unacceptable, 5 ( 0 ).
