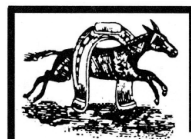

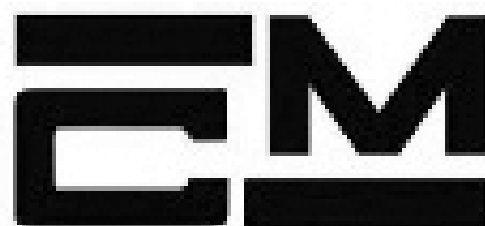

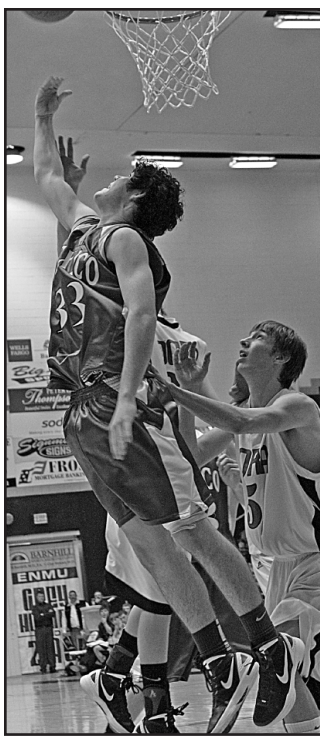

## Texico welcomes new fire fighters

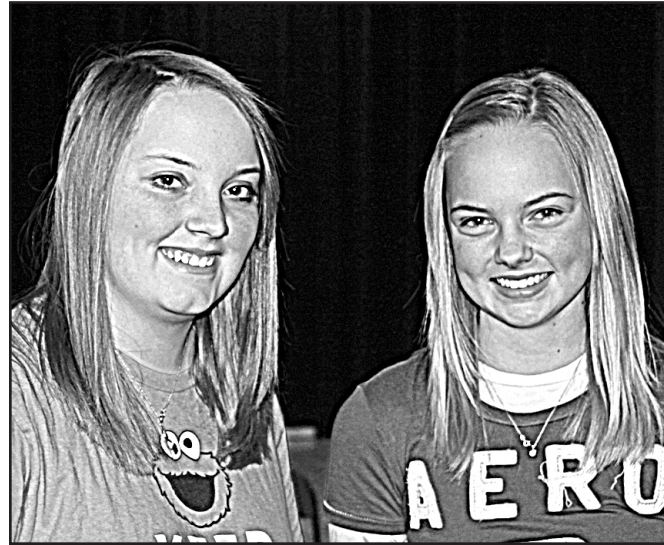

For complete details, see the state school website. -- Heard that the building project is almost totally closed. It came in under budget.

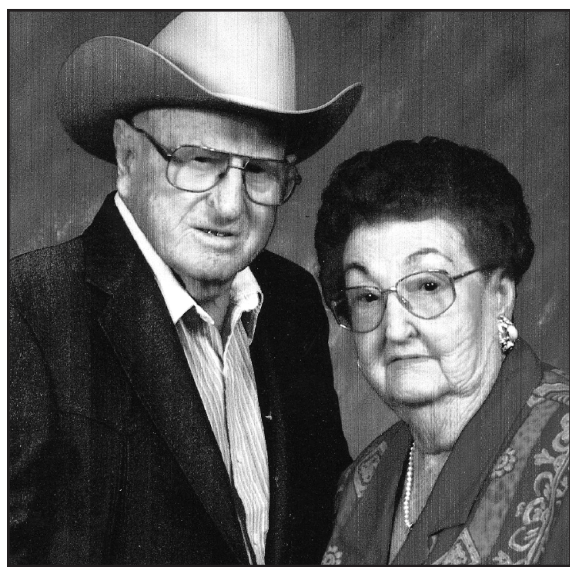


## Super spellers

Kasye Long, an 8th grader, was the grand champion at the annual Texico School spelling bee, and 7th grader Whitney Skabelund was Reserve Champion.

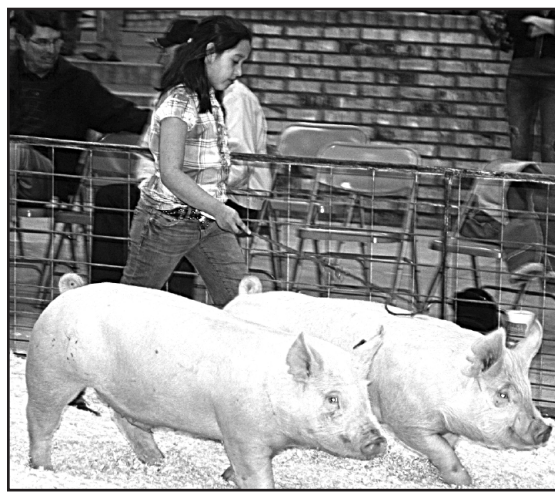

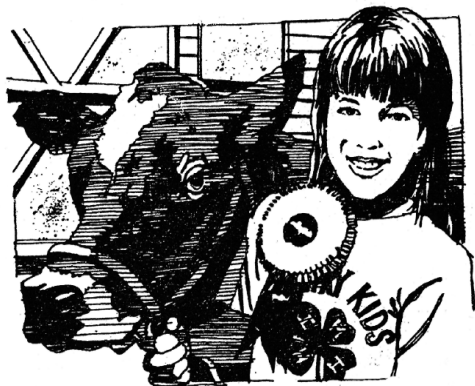

Shana Fleming, Parm-er County home ec extension agent reports it's time to start preparing for the Spring contest:

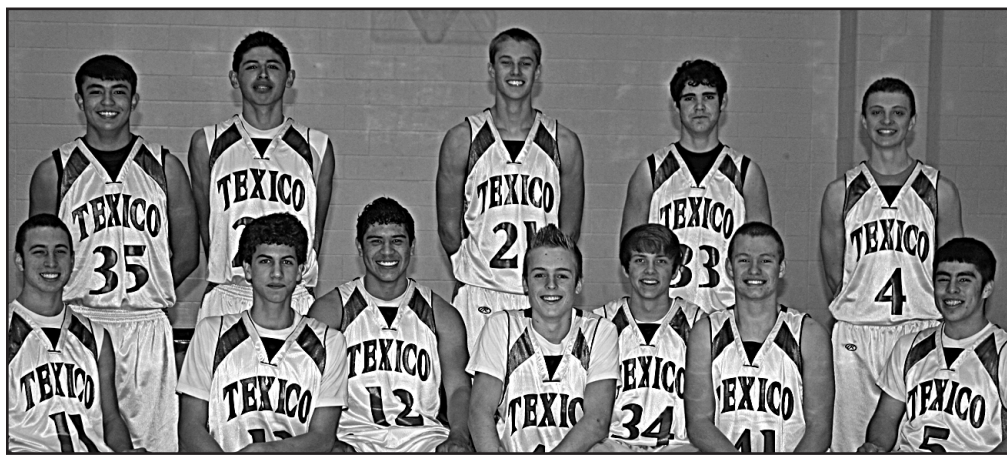
The first contest is "Food Challenge." This is a fun contest that

For this contest there are two age divisions: Jr/Intermediate (the

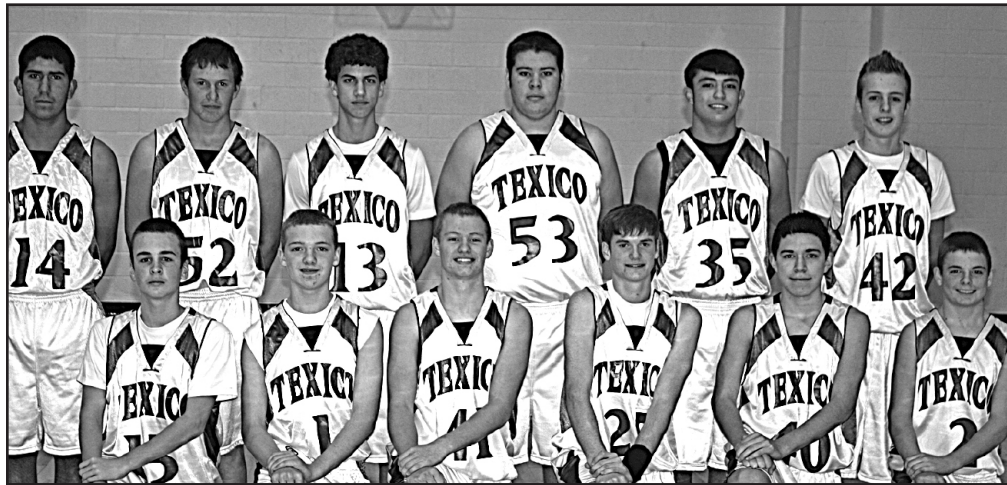

If you have a team and want to participate, get an application form at the county extension office and return it by Jan. 26.



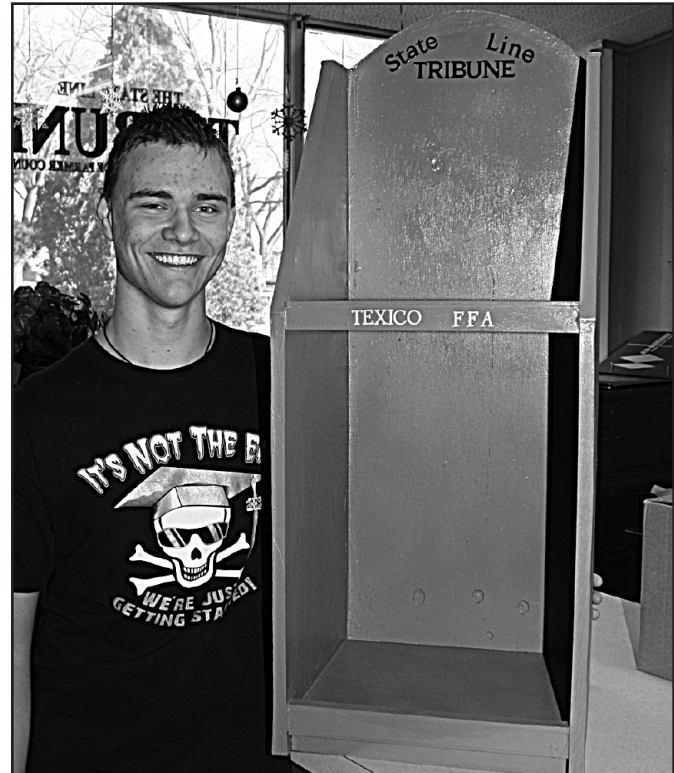

**J.W. Crim: The Lazbuddie weather prophet**

From 1951:  
J.W. Crim, a Lazbuddie resident, is Parmer County's weather prophet.

Once a year, he takes an inclusive look at the weather and makes a sweeping statement about how it will turn out.

A longtime farmer, so the weather means just one thing to him: whether he will or won't make a crop.

Crim doesn't pull any punches. This year's crop outlook is not very optimistic. He just reads the signs and reports accordingly.

There is an old Indian legend to the effect that a fire burning at sunrise on March 22 will give signals through its smoke indicating whether the year will be a good one or not for crops.

Crim goes on say that if the smoke from the fire at this time is carried west or southwest there will be a bumper crop.

If the wind is from the west, south or southwest, that indicates a bad year and the southeast wind indicates a very poor crop is coming.

With all this information at hand, Crim and his three sons got up early last March 22 and lit their fire about 15 minutes before sunrise. His boys take an active part in the ceremony and are given appropriate names.

Chief Big Drink, Dancing Red Eye and the Squaw Man are typically titles assigned to these junior medicine men.

We found the wind to be from the south to the southwest, indicating a bad crop this year, Chief Crim said. He reported that all the readings are taken exactly at sunrise in order to be accurate.

It doesn't matter if you can see the sun or not, he said.

Crim has been building these tell-all bonfires for 26 years in Parmer County and finds his calculations to be quite accurate, generally speaking.

He admits he has missed a few times but then so have some people who take much greater pains for forecasting.

A lot of people have laughed at me, Crim smiled, but I notice that next year they are always coming back to ask me how the crop is going to come out.

The Lazbuddie prophet points out that the forecast deals more with the row crop than the wheat crop.

Last year, when we had a virtual washout in wheat, the row crop turned in pretty well. And the sunrise fire predicted the outcome of the row crop, too.

You see, when the Indians used this means of foretelling the weather for crops, they were most interested in the plants that matured later in the year, Crim said. The forecast may call for a bad crop year and the wheat to turn out well, or vice versa.

How was the legend handed down? As far back as Crim can track, it's in his memory the practice of the late J.J. Wilborn, of Post, Texas, in 1906.

Crim is sure that the story has been in the family for many generations more, however. The legend was given Crim by his father.



## McCallum publishes a best-seller

Have you ever met a New York Times best-seller who told you not to buy his book?

Well, Bovina's Mike McCallum might just be the first.

Mike, who goes by M.D. McCallum in professional circles, is an internationally award-winning commercial graphics artist, 3D animator, project director and webmaster with a freelance career that spans over 20 years and includes over 100 individual and team-based awards.

Last year, he wrote a book to acquaint first-time animators in using the iClone software. The book is also aimed at getting experienced animators up to speed quickly.

Mike wrote from March to September, and even if it sounds like a lot of work, he says it was easy. "I've been doing video tutorials for a long time. I just had to put it on paper."

He got some help from his publishers. They sent him a chapter format to use that would help him keep his notes and chapters in order.

Unfortunately, they sent it to him after the first chapter had been written, forcing him to start over.

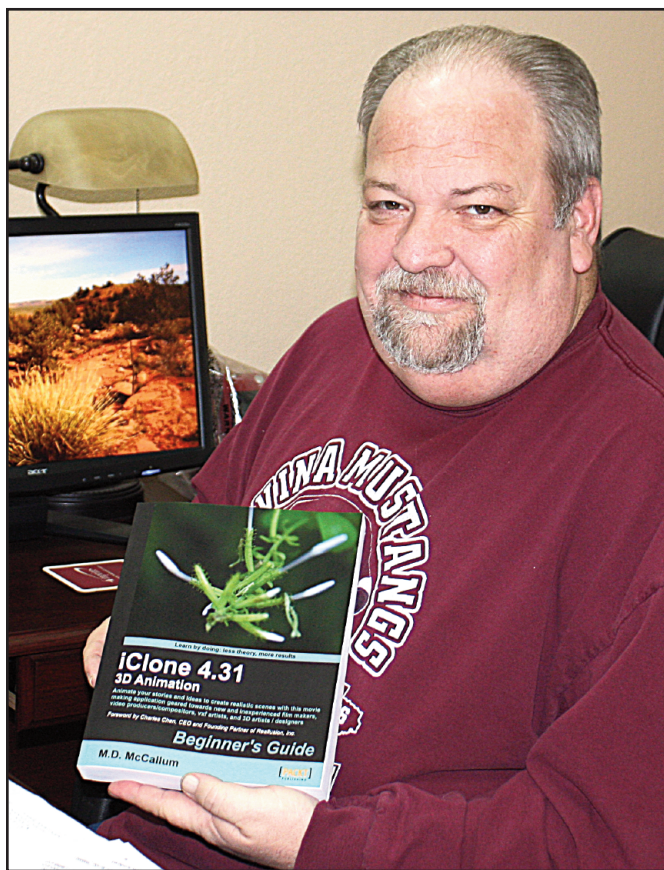
Mike said he aimed to write three pages a day, and it took around 4 months for the first half of the book, and 3 months to finish up.

The writing process did have some bumps along the way. The hard part was figuring out what to cut out of the book. His video tutorials allowed him to fit in as much as he wanted. The book format had to be more precise.

He also had a new version of the iClone program that was released while he was writing, which he had to learn on the go.

He spoke to the iClone software engineers as they readied their new release. He often had to learn about new features, write about them, and then find out they had been changed leading to a rewrite.

When the book came out, it made it to No. 35 on

the New York Times best-sellers list.

The iClone software Mike wrote about isn't the type of animation you'd see in a Pixar film. It is aimed for families and students to make short videos at home.

However, the software has found a home in Hollywood. McCallum and other animators like him are being hired more often to design scenes for major studios.

For instance, in a major movie, there are high-paid

actors, support staff and location expenses on any day they film. If the director can't figure out where to put the camera, or how big to make the explosion, or even how the actors should cross the set, it costs a lot of money.

A program like iClone can help the director imagine the scene several different ways and be prepared beforehand, saving money and time.

Mike has worked on several major movies and commercials, but said his work is kept confidential by contracts, so he can't talk about specific projects he has done.

When asked about getting work in the industry, Mike said that gender equality in the graphic artist world has been getting better over the years and the internet is becoming a place that an aspiring artist can find employment.

He said the hard part is getting the work done. Many folks have problems with deadlines, which is why he has been successful.

He has spent years building a trustful reputation and has made sure to get his work done on time.

So far, his book has had very positive reviews. It has been picked up as a textbook for students in China and Taiwan, and they are currently negotiating with schools in German and France.

The book is being translated to Standard and Mandarin Chinese, and Taiwanese, and other language translations are coming.

Mike said this was truly an international project, as the editors and software engineers came from India, England, Taiwan, and of course, the writer was here in Bovina.

What's next for him?

Mike said that he has been in talks with a publisher for a possible science fiction novel and he still has plenty of work to do in animation.
