It was all Farwell from the get-go. Zac Stancell tackled the kick returner at the AC 29. Tyler Steinbock recovered a fumble two plays later at the AC 40. Landry Actkinson passed to Colby Read for 9, then Read ran for 15. Lincoln Devault connected on a 30-yard field goal at 9:07 for a 3-0 lead.

On defense, Mason Howard had a huge hit on the kick returner. Read had a QB sack for minus 9 yards, forcing a punt. Farwell was held and Devault kicked into the end zone.

Caleb Christian and Stancell had good tackles. Julian Cuevas intercepted and returned the ball to the AC 33. Behind a great block by Rane Carpenter, Read scored from the 15. The Devault kick made it 10-0 as the first quarter ended.

Stancell had a QB sack for minus 5 yards. Then Actkinson intercepted but lost a fumble at midfield when he was tackled. Read and Carpenter combined on a QB sack for minus 8 yards so AC punted.

Hunter Black caught a 15-yard pass. On 4th and 5, Farwell tried a fake punt, with Actkinson hitting Caleb Christian for 9 yards. The drive ended in a 6-yard TD run by Read at 4:14 with Farwell ahead 16-0.

Collin Christian intercepted an errant AC pass. Read ran for 10 and 7, and caught a pass for 10 more. Devault took in a 10-yard pass. On 4th down, Collin Christian caught a pass but it was short of the first down marker. Howard had a big tackle and Steinbock had an interception as the first half ended.

Farwell opened the 3rd quarter at its 34. Actkinson hit a bomb to Devault for 35 yards, then struck again on a long pass to Kolten Morris to the AC 1. Read scored the TD.

The Steers recovered a fumble at the AC 44. A 40-yard field goal try by Devault was blocked.

On defense, Black had a strong tackle. Actkinson intercepted at the AC 30. The short drive ended with an Actkinson 3-yard TD.

Mason Coburn intercepted a pass that was deflected by Stancell at the Steers 39. Caleb Christian ran for 45 yards as the 3rd quarter ended.

After Actkinson ran for 10, Howard scored the TD at 10:43.

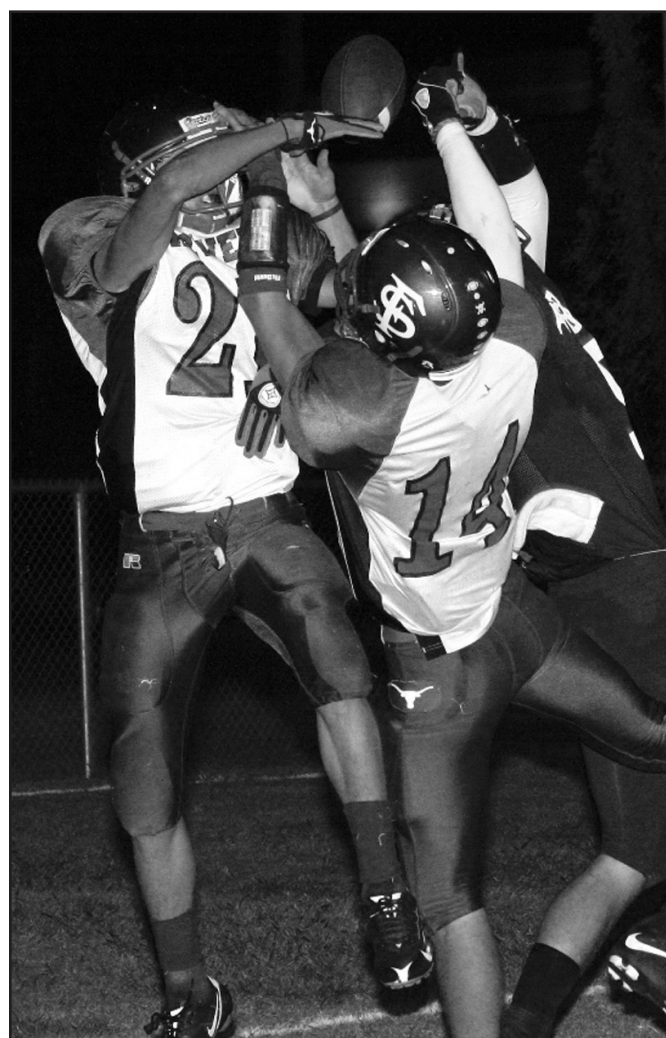
On defense, Ubi Trevizo had a strong tackle. Victor Mendoza suffered a leg sprain in the game.

Watching on TV, I couldn't believe it. It's as if nobody was coaching the Cowboys. Surely after three quarters, Coach Phillips would have figured out that his front four was unable to pressure the Giants QB and blitzes were mandatory.

And this was especially true after the Cowboys rallied to take the lead toward the end of the 4th quarter. But no, no blitz. And Manning had more than enough time to put a dagger into the hearts of all Cowboys fans.

I was stunned, watching that fiasco. Where were the Cowboys linebackers during the drive where Manning threw pass after pass for the Giants comeback win?

Were the linebackers blitzing? Nope.

Were they seen around the receivers? Nope.

I will tell you where they were - in no man's land, accomplishing nothing. The Giants coaches must have laughed their heads off watching Coach Phillips

basically take his linebackers out of the game by having them twiddle their thumbs.

Folks, I am not a football coach. Normally, I don't believe in criticizing football coaches because I am merely a fan, and don't know all the ins and outs of the game.

But I do know this: Coach Phillips needs to be replaced at season's end, regardless of how the Cowboys do.

I was saddened by what I saw at a high school football game last Friday.

To make a long story short, I felt that some athletes of the Christian school playing Farwell did not display good sportsmanship.

And this from young men attending a "Christian" school. Sad.

Farwell will not be scheduling that school again.

Folks, I realize that football is a contact sport, a sport of violence. You don't go onto the field with a smile on your face. You play to win. And all this is okay with me.

As I've written in this column over the years, I put a high importance on football for high school boys. I believe football helps boys mature into young men from all the great lessons it can teach.

As with anything, there's always a negative side. And sometime that occurs. When it does, I feel it is the coach's responsibility to put the young man on the right track again.

I know that Vince Lombardi's theme was "all that counts is winning." Well, I view "winning" in perhaps a different context that Coach Lombardi did.

To me, "winning" does not mean having the best score. Rather, it means that you gave it your all, did the best you could, and didn't quit. Any athlete meeting those criteria is a champion in my book.

From watching our area teams over the years, I would like to think that our area teams have practiced good sportsmanship on a consistent behavior. For example, Texico School got a state award for that last year. That was outstanding.

I hope any athlete reading this column understands that there should never be a need to practice poor sportsmanship.

Never.

7. Prior to approval in the program applicants must apply for any other private, state or federal assistance program for which they are potentially eligible and must apply for employment opportunities at the Texas Workforce Commission. The program is payer of last resort.

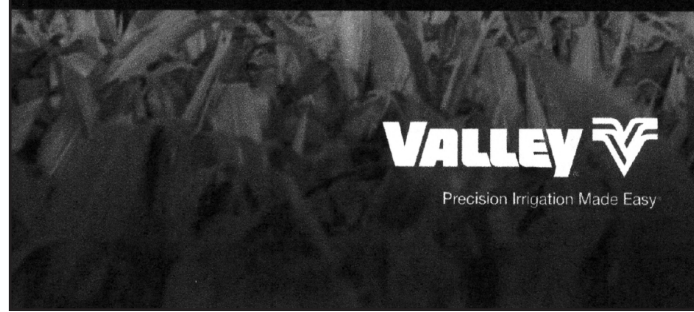

Texico stays undefeated

The Texico Wolverines beat the Hagerman Bobcats last Friday there, 21-7, to go 5-0.

The Wolverine defense made their stand early as Sean Rusk caused a loss of 3 yards. Humberto Burciaga recovered a fumble on a bad snap, and the Wolverines took over on their 23.

Edgardo Meza ran for 12. A Bobcat penalty gave Texico a 1st and 10 the their 46. Behind the blocking of Burciaga and Jose Posada, Meza swept right for 9 to Hagerman's 40. The offense pushed behind blocks by Matt Vasquez, Jairo Lozano, Garrett Garrison and Burciaga, but was held a yard short on 4th down at the Bobcats 31.

Marquez Pena and Jonathan Hill defended passes, and Hagerman punted.

Texico was held and punted to midfield where Quinn Winkles delivered a stunning blow. Hill halted a QB keeper. Seth Bailey and Posada had strong tackles. But Hagerman moved the ball downfield and hit a pass on 4th and 11 for a TD. The kick put Hagerman up, 7-0 as the 2nd quarter began.

Brandon King recovered an onside kick at the Texico 45. Vasquez, Burciaga and Rivera blocked for Meza and Bailey rushes.

Bailey connected with Winkles on a 17-yard pass at the Bobcats' 31.

Meza ran right on 4th and 2, gaining a first down behind Garrison and Rusk. Bailey hit a pass to Rivera for 11 yards. Meza scored from the 3 behind Vasquez and Burciaga. The kick failed and it was 7-6.

On defense, Donovan Johnson had a strong tackle. Hill and Garrison teamed up to hold the Bobcats at a short gain, and Garrison sacked the QB for a loss of 12.

Texico took over on Hagerman's 46. Bailey's pass to Posada gained 28 yards but the drive was halted.

Posada recovered a Bobcat fumble and ran 10 yards for a Wolverine TDn. Bailey ran for the 2-point conversion behind Garrison, Lozano and Rusk, as Texico was up, 14-7, with 1:07 left in the half.

King stopped the kickoff return at Hagerman's 20. Posada broke up a pass play, and Meza brought down a receiver after a short pass. Pressured by King, the Bobcats QB was intercepted by Garrison.

Hagerman intercepted at their 30 as the first half ended.

The 2nd half opened with King returning the kickoff to the Texico 20. Texico moved the ball downfield well with short runs. But the drive was stopped and Bailey quick kicked to the Hagerman 5.

Vasquez and Hill had good tackles, and Posada intercepted a short pass to take over at Hagerman's 24. Texico was stopped but got the ball back quickly as Rusk brought down their scrambling QB for no gain, and Winkles intercepted. Offsetting penalties negated the interception. But Winkles again intercepted, to set up Texico on Hagerman's 24.

Texico lost a fumble at the Bobcat 15. Rivera, Bailey, Hill, Vasquez and Burciaga had good defensive efforts as the 3rd quarter ended.

Hill and Rivera defended two short passes, and Winkles and Bailey pressured Hagerman into punting. Texico's intense conditioning and perseverance were paying off again in the final quarter, as Texico controlled the line of scrimmage.

Winkles returned a punt to the Wolverine 33. Texico moved the ball on runs by Bailey, Meza and Johnson to the Bobcats 31.

Meza gained 11, and Bailey executed two QB keepers, resulting in a 17 yard TD. Posada kicked the extra point, making the score 21-7.

With 1:58 left, King recovered a fumble on the kickoff.

Then, he had to rush back to Langley, Va., to make sure the CIA knew that he was a bigger enemy than Al-Quaeda.

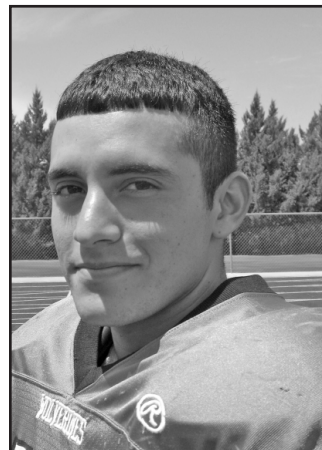

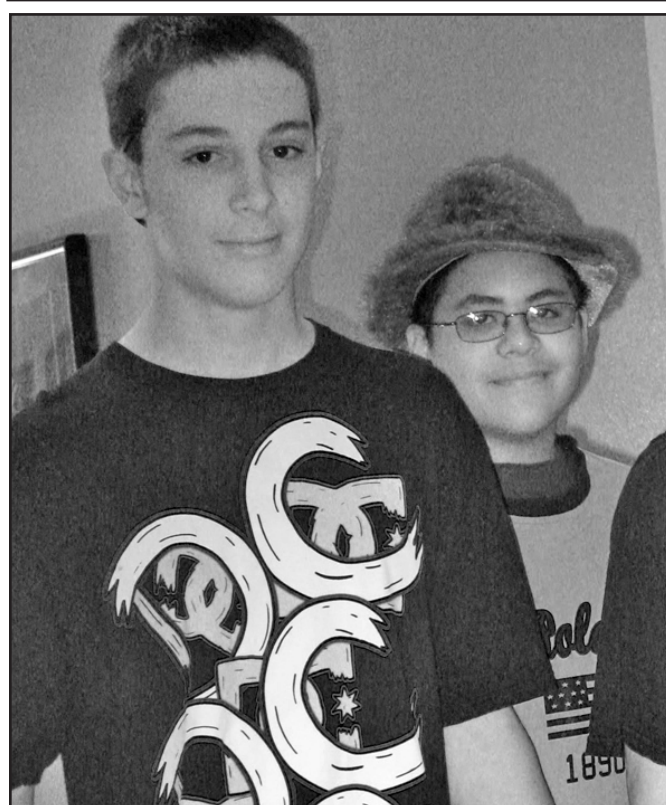

Ben Harris scored on a 30 yard run and a 10 yard pass.

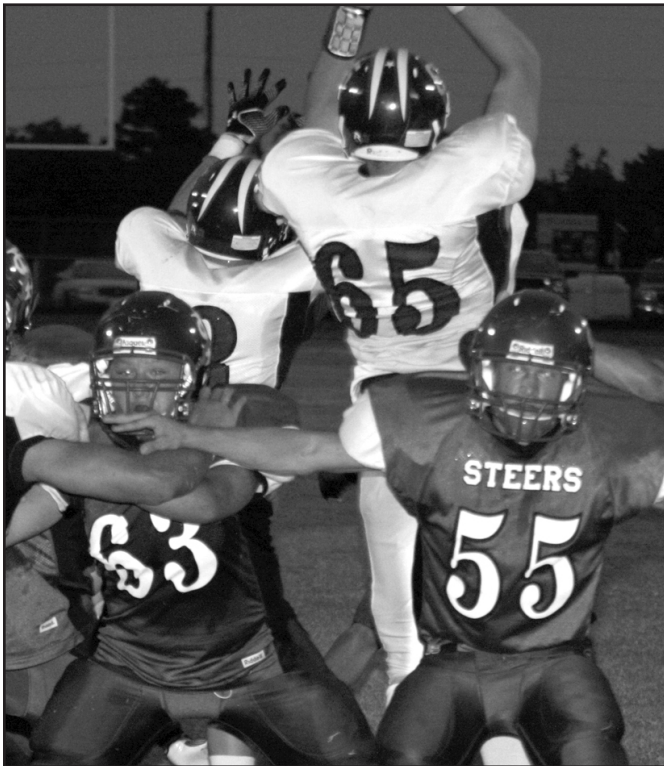
Mitchell Pinnell ran 15 yards for a TD and threw 2 TD passes, including a 50 yarder to Gentry Doolittle.

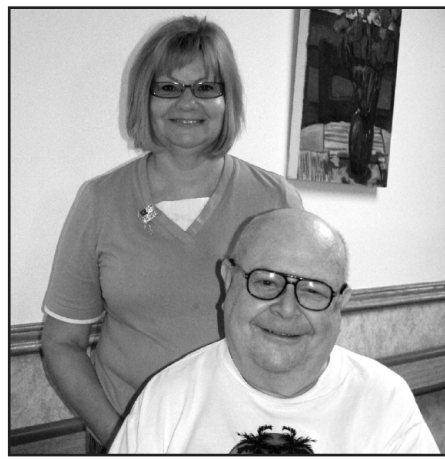

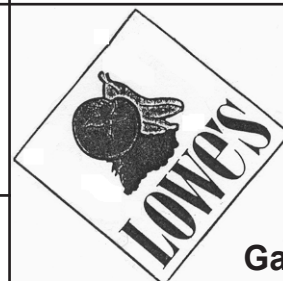
