FJH students learn science in a unique and creative way

Farwell's new science teacher is really not new to the classroom.

After spending 25 years teaching everything from theatre to English and science in Clovis, Keith Ingram retired.

It took him all of five weeks to realize that he was not finished with his teaching career.

"I knew something was missing," said Ingram. "I was spending my time riding my motorcycle, but it just wasn't right. I missed being in the classroom."

With that realization in mind, he applied for the science position in Farwell. "I really enjoy seeing the creative side in students. I view my role as a business. The

students are my customers and I am selling knowledge."

Ingram recently assigned a creative project to all 8th graders at Farwell. He asked them to come up with a unique presentation of the periodic table and the elements for science class. He did not give them any examples or parameters, but only said to use their imaginations.

The groups of students came up with some very interesting and fun ways to learn the elements in the table.

For example, one group presented the elements in rap form. Danny Dyck, Romeo Reyes and Lee Roy Cervantes wrote an original rap to describe ele-

ments to their classmates.

Another group made up of Mason Byrd, Carley Johnson and Alexis Olmos wrote an elemental parody of the Three Little Pigs story. Different elements were worked into the original tale for a fun, playful version of the periodic table.

Most of the students agreed that this creative assignment was difficult, but more interesting than studying straight from the science book.

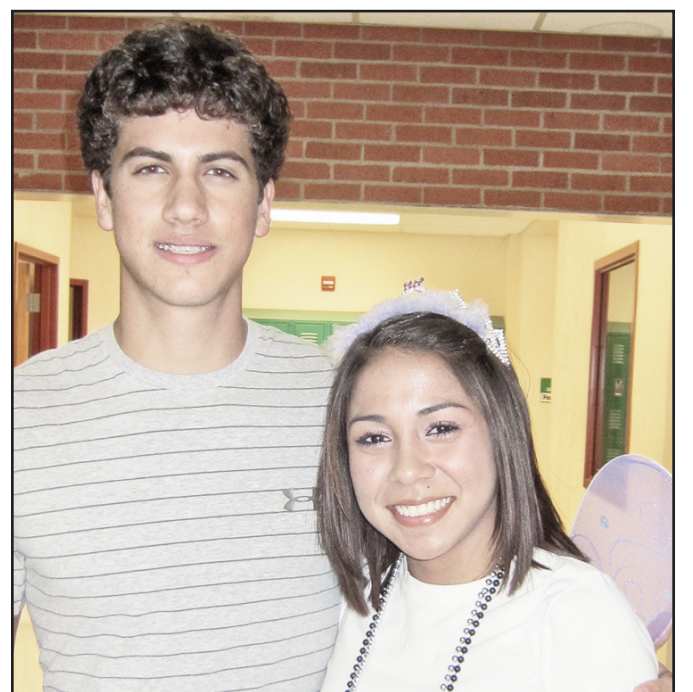

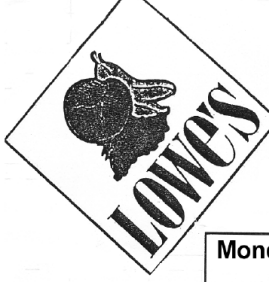

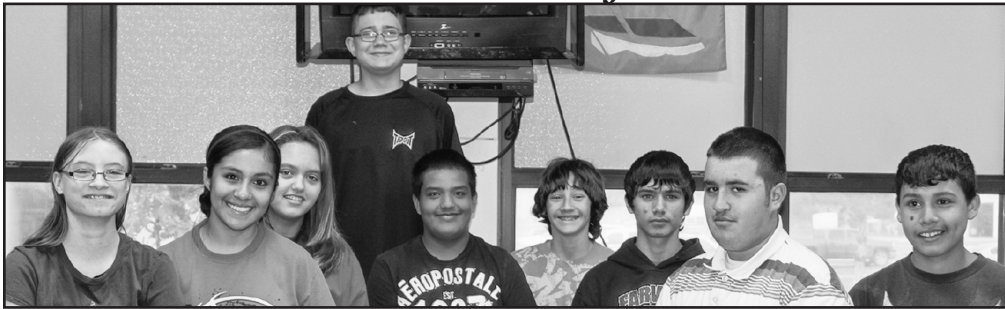

For an assignment on chemical formulas, the students were asked to simplify normal things.

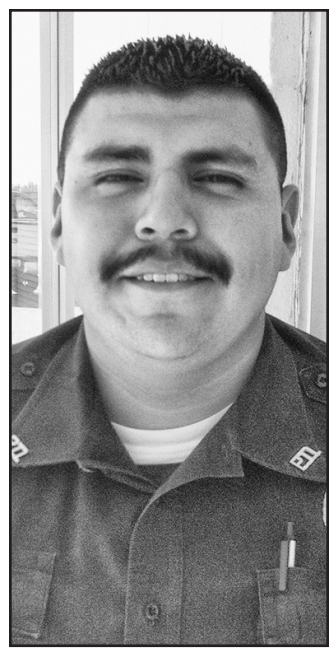

Texico wins in overtime

The Texico Wolverines were involved in their second overtime game of the young season and this time they were on the winning side.

They topped the Clovis JV, 28-21, on Sept. 26 and are now 2-3 on the year.

The Wolverines opened on defense with Adrian Gomez defending against pass But the Wildcats scored on a 44-yard pass for a 7-0 lead.

The Wolverines started at their 42. Justin Rucker hit an 8-yard pass to Gomez. Mason Golden then ran for a first down. Rucker completed a pass to Mitchell Pinnell, followed by a Golden run for a first down.

Pinnell rushed for 8, then Rucker burst through for a 20-yard TD run. Josh Tredway kicked the extra point -- he was 4 for 4 in that category.

On defense, the Wolverines had a QB sack for minus 6. Texico quickly got the ball back, and Pinnell scored from 51 yards out as time expired in the first quarter, with the Wolverines up, 14-7.

Clovis started near midfield but turned the ball over at the Texico 39. Pinnell gained 5, then John Myers added 9. Rucker hit a 12-yard pass to Gomez.

A QB sneak made it 1st and goal at the 5, then Golden finished the drive with a 2-yard TD run. Texico was up 21-7.

On defense, Rucker had a good tackle as Clovis was forced to punt. Rucker ran for 9, then hit a long pass to Gomez but time ran out in the half.

Pinnell returned the 3rd quarter kick to the Wildcat 36. Texico was held and Golden punted to the 4. On defense, Myers, Gomez, Zach Harrison and Jesus Maldonado had good tackles.

Clovis scored on a 2-yard run and closed the gap to 21-14.

On offense, Pinnell burst up the middle for 15, then for 9 more. As the final period opened, Rucker ran to the Clovis 33, then Pinnell gained 11. The drive ended at the Clovis 25.

Matt Odegaard had a big tackle but Clovis moved the ball well, scoring on a 15-yard pass to tie the game.

Texico lost a fumble at midfield. Clovis hit a long pass and got 1st and goal. Pinnell intercepted in the end zone, and returned it to the Texico 44 before regulation time ran out.

In overtime, Texico rode Pinnell's rushes to a TD, from 3 yards out.

The Wildcats had two short gains before throwing a pass that Gomez intercepted for the Texico victory.

Individual stats: rushing yards- Pinnell, 20 for 117; Rucker, 8 for 45; Myers, 6 for 25; Golden, 5 for 16. Rucker hit 6 of 13 passes for 53 yards. Gomez caught 4 passes for 31, and Pinnell, 2 for 22.

Texico Junior High lost last week to Clayton, 28-22.

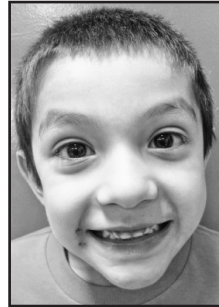
Tyler Romans scored a TD on a 40-yard run. Shad Mayfield added a two point conversion run.

Brayden Wines then scored with a 5-yard run. Dalton Thatcher added a 10-yard TD. Romans capped off the scoring with a 2-point conversion.

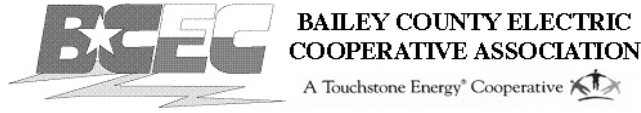
Brayden Wines and Kaleb Naceanceno recovered fumbles. Romans blocked a punt.

Texico discusses property problems

The Texico City Council on Sept. 24 discussed several properties around the city:

-- The property at 502 Florence. The Estrada family has moved a mobile home onto the property a month ago.

In August, the council determined that the trailer must be moved off the property because it doesn't meet city rules, but nothing has happened yet.

Evania Hernandez, speaking for the family, said that the Estradas do not have enough money to move the trailer off the property.

The council gave them until Nov. 24 to move the trailer.

The council also stated that no other mobile home could be moved onto the property as long as the smaller trailer home is still there.

Mrs. Hernandez asked that neighbors Bill and Vonnie McIntosh fix a wooden fence on their property, but the council pointed out that the fence was on the Estrada property.

-- Shalom Towing at 220 Wheeler. It allegedly has several junk vehicles on the city right of way. Councilman Doug Scioli said some of it has been there for over six months, and needs to be removed.

Scioli said the city had been told that the material would be removed after the owner rented another building in town, but they have filled up the other property and haven't cleared the right of way.

Councilman Oran Jay Autrey said that he was worried the city would have to condemn the right of ways and clean it up themselves, as it is against the law to bring vehicles to wrecking yards without titles. Autrey felt those wrecked and crushed vehicles were unlikely to have titles.

City Inspector Terry Martin said that he will give Shalom Towing a week to clear the right of way.

-- At 720 Turner is an unoccupied house that Scioli said has become a safety hazard. Children have been seen entering the home and Fire Chief Lewis Cooper said he has heard a rumor that some kids had built a fire in the basement.

Martin said the owner has repeatedly promised to board it up.

The council will seek bids for securing the property if the owner does not complete the work in a week.

-- The used car lot on Wheeler Street still has a half-built fence. They had taken out a building permit over a year ago, but the work was left unfinished.

In other news, the council:

- Discussed paintings held in a back room at the

Community Center.

The paintings were originally bought as part of the grant agreement that paid for the building.

The paintings were routinely taken down by folks who rented the center.

City Clerk Carolyn Johnson said the Senior Citizen Center was also built as part of that grant, and she will look at hanging the paintings in that part of the building.

That way they can be appreciated, but they won't get further destroyed by renters putting them up and taking them down.

- Heard that the Ute Water Commission has a new chairman. He has asked for a new sustainability study to see if Ute Lake can handle supplying water to Eastern New Mexico.

The Water Authority has stated that work on the project will not be stopped for the study.

- Passed a resolution on city infrastructure. The city has ranked its "wish list" for 2015 in this order: A new fire truck; upgraded water lines; wastewater treatment plant upgrades; sewer line expansion; and reconstruction of city streets.

- Received a request from David Parmer who owns the property at 200 Lamar St. to work on his property.

He has recently bought the property and while remodeling the floors realized that water from the drainage ditches had backed up under his home.

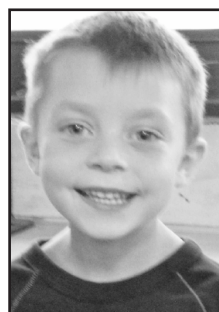
A survey showed that the city right of way comes almost up to the wall of the home.

Autrey said the streets going east and west should only have a right of way 25 feet from the center of the road, which shouldn't be that far, but also suggested that Parmer bring in dirt to build up his yard.

The council said that any work on the drainage ditch needed to be overseen by city personnel.

- Heard that the city audit has finally been caught up. The audits have been behind since 2005 as two different auditors had problems finishing the work they had bid on.

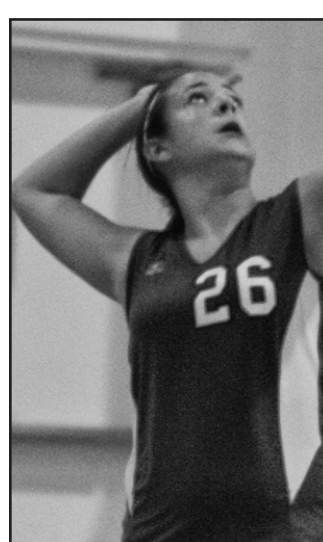
