Olivia, Gabbie Schilling to perform at Farwell Chamber banquet

"It was totally a God thing," agrees Olivia and Gabbie Schilling when talking about their newly released album "Aim's Getting' Better."

They feel that God put them in the right place at the right time and their new CD is the result.

"We have always sang together at home, but recently we began singing at church. The guitar player for the church was really instrumental in helping us get a CD recorded."

Their church, Hope Lutheran in Lubbock, encourages people to

sing during services. The girls began singing by themselves and even sometimes together. After a few sessions, the guitar player, Steven Bell, who is a recording artist in Lubbock, suggested the girls put together their own CD. He introduced them to Mount Vernon Studios, enlisted other musicians from church to pitch in for the sound, and the rest is history.

On their first CD, which the girls bill as "Texas Country," they released eight original songs, all written by Farwell Hihh

senior Olivia.

Olivia is not only a song writer, but also lead singer while Gabbie sings harmony on the tracks. The "Schilling Girls," as they are now referred to on radio stations around the country, are the daughters of Todd and Lisa Schilling, of Farwell.

They also have a younger sister, Mallory, who even sings a bit on the CD. The girls laughingly comment that younger brother Xander just wishes that they would play more with him instead of doing so much music.

The girls are quickly getting noticed in the music scene. Clovis Country station 105.9 is playing their first release, the CD title cut, "Aim's Gettin' Better," several times a day now. Even a San Antonio radio station is putting their music out there.

They have tunes available for download on iTunes and anyone can now order their CD on the CD Baby site. For local folks, their mom and manager, Lisa, carries CDs around proudly with her. Their aunt, Sabina Schilling, has them for sale in her Muleshoe clothing shop, "The Closet."


Burial was in Bovina Cemetery under the direction of Ellis Funeral Home, Muleshoe.

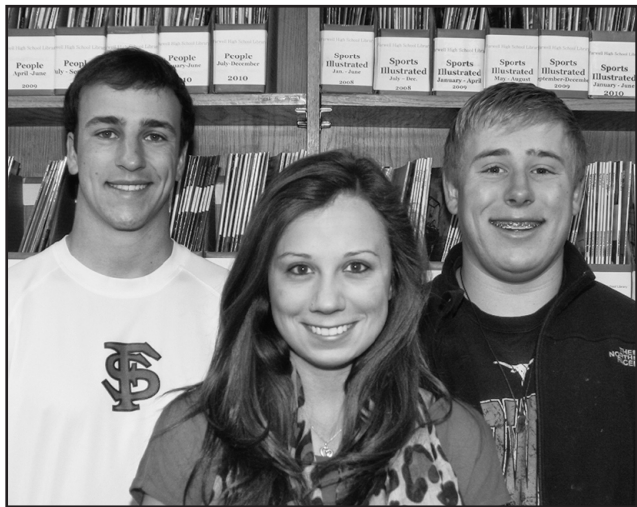

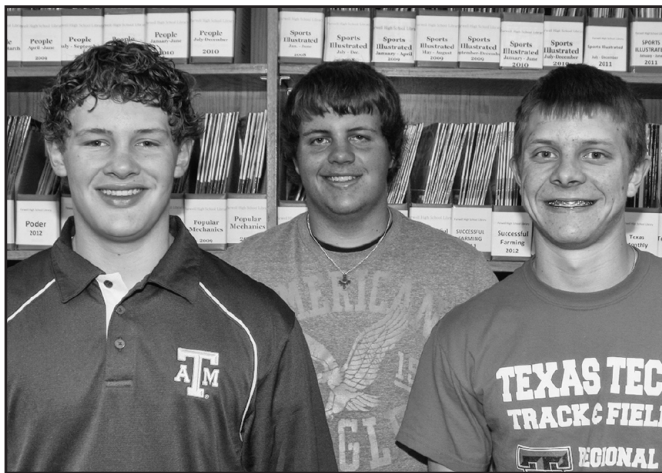

Farwell High School has come in 1st or 2nd in for the last 7 years. This year they were edged out by the slimmest of margins.



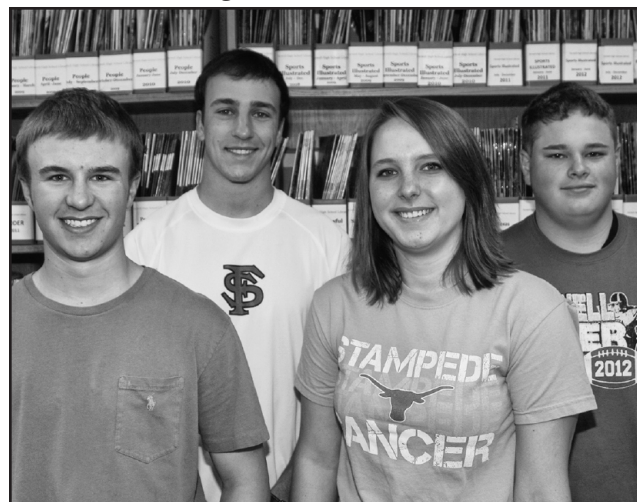

High winds from the

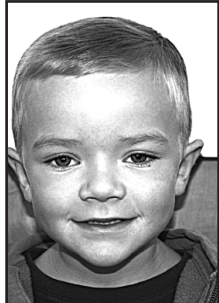
north brought in lots of blowing dirt and dropped the temperature by 10 degrees in the span of a few minutes.

Texico schools change eligibility requirements

The Texico School Board on Monday changed its academic eligibility requirements for students in grades 7 through 12.

These rules involve participating in extra-curricular activities.

Currently, students were allowed to participate in them if they had an "F" in one course.

Starting next fall, students in those grades must have at least a 2.0 grade point average with passing grades in all classes -- no "F's."

The board also approved a new general leave policy for staffers. Currently, the policy for those with 10-month contracts (such as teachers) received two leave policies -- sick leave and personal leave. The determination is done on an hourly rate leading to a total of 9.25 days.

The new policy will simplify that into a "general leave" one. And the rate was rounded off at 10 days.

Those on an 11-month contract will receive 11

general leave days. In other business, the board:

-- Accepted a bid to build a fence behind the vocational education building.

-- Plans to have a school auction on June 15.

-- Extended the contract of Supt. Miles Mitchell to 2015 and rehired the principals.

-- Approved the 2013-2014 school calendar, similar to this one's with spring break again coming after testing.
