Farm Facts

| Spring is really herel Frult trees, spring flowering bulbs, flowering shrubs, and early blooming flowers are truly breath taking. Before long the all time favorite roses will be in full beauty. <br> Incidently, have you checked the new tender leaves of the rose bushes and other shrubs? If not, the tiny aphids have had a feast. Before it's too late the new buds and leaves. <br> These tiny insects can suck the buds and leaves untll they become stunned of growth or buds never open. Still one of the best insecticides to kill aphids is malathion. Weekly applications of the spray should thrips under control. <br> Be very careful in measuring and mixing 2 tablespoons of malathion to each gallon of water needed. Use measuring spoons that you have for measuring too careful when working with chemicals. Spoons or cups used in measuring insecticides or fungicides for the garden just should not be used in measur- ing food in the kitchen. ing food in the kitchen, the rose When spraying bushes, any shrub, or garden vegetables always spray the insecticide with the wind direction. Be sure to wear clothing that will protect you from any drift of the chemical. If any mixture does get on your skin do wash it off and change clothing if they become dampened. Many people are seriously allergic to any insectof insecticides on a high shelf or locked out of the reach of young children who cannot read warning labels. <br> This malathion mixture is good to spray the arborvitae shrubs that attract flies, in the spring. Aphids suck the tender | new leaves of this evergreen shrub leaving a honeydew residue on the shrub to suck the honeydew when aphids are present. When spraying the arborvitae you'll make it healthler and get rid of the flies. <br> Guess you have the "garden bug' too as you watch the shrubs and flowers of spring. This you'll have many fresh vegetables for salads, vegetable dishes, canning, and freezing. I know many of you have onion plants aiready plan. start in the garden. <br> Before planting a garden the soll should be broken to a depth of 8 to 10 inches, If you had now you are ready to pulverize the rough surface. <br> Barnyard manure should be used extensively on vegetable gardens. It should be plowed or spaded well into the soll, and used as a heavy topdressplanting. Use well decomposed manure so as not to burn the decomposed should have been applled broadcast over the garden last fall or several weeks before planting time. <br> Be cautious when using poultry or sheep manures, since they contain more nitrogen than other manures and may burn the plants.
