The Farwell varsity girls will play at the regional tournament at Abilene Christian University this weekend.



They are looking at putting slurry seal on various city streets, including Avenue F.


--Approved paving Hereford Street to the truck stop. They are going to chip seal Hereford Street from Opal

Team members decided when to buy and sell these products to achieve the greatest economic gain. Orders are called in to a commodity broker and the trade is recorded. Current prices and market comditions are utilized, however no money

Each FFA chapter may have up to four teams consisting of an unlimited number of team members.

Winners are determined by combining the team's trading and final exam scores. The team, from each participating state, with the highest combined total will be presented with the State Winner's Plaque. A cash award will be given to the teams placing in the top ten of the nation.

The CMA is sponsored by the Stewart-Peterson Advisory Group, the Chicago Mercantile Exchange and Data Transmission Network Corporation as a special project of the National FFA Foundation.

Head Start requires proof of participants meeting federal income guidelines so income verification, such as check stubs, should also be available for review. Verification of other types of public assistance should also be available for review.
