long as you continue to earn income, you can contribute up to $\$ 2,000$ a year to a Roth IRA And if you have at least $\$ 4,000$ in earned income, you also can contribute to your spouse's Roth IRA, even if he or she
doesn't have any earned income.
- You won't be forced to make withdrawals. Once you reach $701 / 2$, you have to mak minimum withdrawals each year from a traditional IRA,
even if you don't need the money. Plus, you'll have to pay income taxes on your with drawals. A Roth IRA has no such requirement; you can keep the money in your ac count for
choose.
- Your family pays no inIRA funds. You may not outlive the money you have accumulated in your Roth IRA. If that happens, you can leave the assets in the account to your pay income taxes on it (However, Roth IRA proceeds may result in increased estate taxes.) On the other hand, your heirs would have to pay regu lar income taxes on any money
they withdraw from an inherited traditional IRA.
Of course, you may already be contributing to a traditional IRA. Should you convert this account to a Roth IRA you plan to continue earning income

## Here are probable long-range water plans

## for cities in Parmer County

While the Tribune has been carrying articles lately about Texico's participation in the Ute Lake water project, designed to provide long-term water usage for that community, little has been said about Farwell's situation.
Here is what is happening on the Texas side of the border according to a report in the July issue of "The Cross Section" published by the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District No. 1
The Llano Estacado Regional Water Planning Group has developed a conceptual project which includes purchasing ground water and transporting it via pipeline within the region Feasability studies and preliminary investigation into the proj ect cost have begun.
Under the proposed project, ground water rights would be purchased in either Hartley County or Roberts County. A pipeline would be built to transport the water to Vega, then
south to Hereford, Friona and Muleshoe.
The new pipeline would be connected to the City of Lubbock pipeline, which conveys water from Bailey County. The

Lateral pipelines could be extended from the main feeder line to serve other towns, such as Farwell and Bovina, in the region. Water from the new distribution line would also be made available to feedlots, dairies and other industries along the route.
"The volume of ground water anticipated to be purchased would be adequate to supply the demand for 100 years. The project would be designed so that no more than 50 percent of initial 50 -year weriod," said Wayne Wyatt, Llano Estacad the gional Water Planning Group chairman

As for financing the project, several ways will be looked at, wying each participating entity paying a pro-rata share. Wyatt said it should be possible to complete the pipeline project in five years.
the cost water will depend on the that needs to be purchased, the size and length of the pipe Wye cost of wells, and the pumps/pump stations required. Wyatt said preliminary estimates are that the cost of the delivered water to each entity will be in the range of $\$ 1.50$ to $\$ 2.50$ per 1,000 gallons. As a comparison, the City of Lubbock currently charges $\$ 1.52$ to provide 1,000 gallons of treated waer to residential customers.
