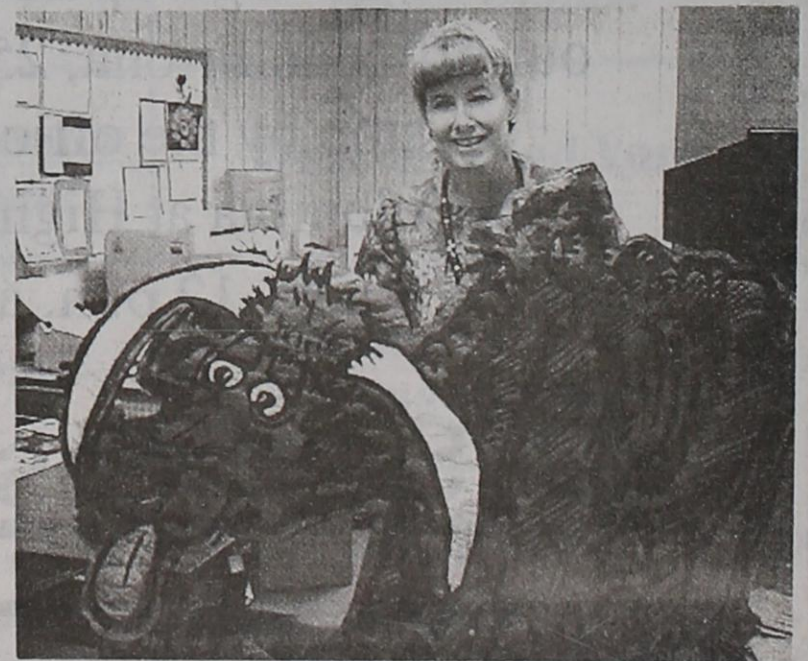

So, Lazbuddie went into halftime with a huge 54-12 lead.

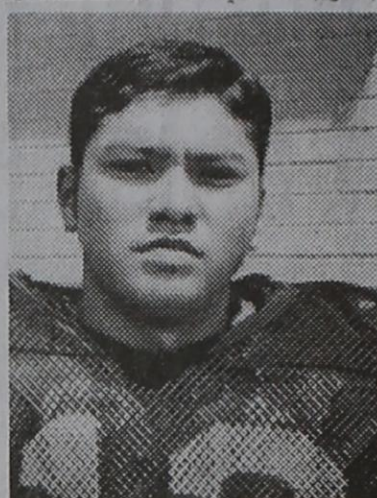
After Southland scored in the third quarter on a 55-yard run, the game ended after DeLeon scored from 30 yards out, and St. Clair plunged over from the 4.

Water district holds hearing on proposed water plan

A public hearing was held by the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District No. 1 on Tuesday in Lubbock as a forum for the exchange of ideas and voicing of concerns and opinions over a proposed water plan drawn for the region.

The full water plan and executive summary are available for viewing in the County Clerk's office at the Parmer County Courthouse.

If you have Internet capabilities, you can view the plan on the District's web site at www.llanoplan.org.

Once the web page is pulled up, link to "Published Information," then to "Executive Summary."

The plan is in pdf file format and requires Adobe Acrobat or other pdf format readers in order to view the file.

Those wishing to add their ideas to the plan for bringing

more water to this region are urged to submit their ideas to the district by Oct. 13.

What is proposed for Parmer County is for water to be brought down from either Hartley or Roberts counties by pipeline to Vega, then south to Hereford, Friona and Muleshoe.

Lateral pipelines would be extended to serve other towns, such as Farwell and Bovina.

Water from the new distribution line would be made available to feedlots, dairies and other industries along the route.

plunge. QB Robbie Tabb then scored on a 60-yard scamper. Michael Johnson followed with a 2-point conversion.

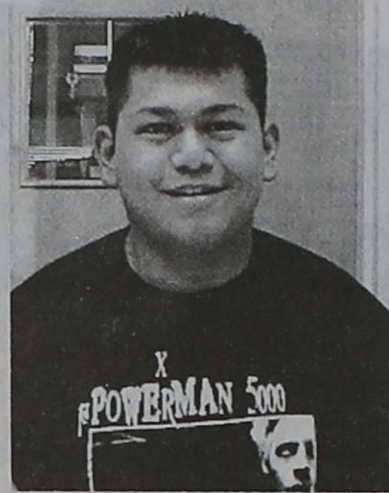

HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

On Friday, September 15, traffic was returned to a divided 4-lane on US 60/70/84 from Norris Street to 1/2 mile West of Cook's Truck Stop. Only minor construction will be encountered in this area after that date. Traffic will still be detoured to a 2-way, no passing work zone from 1/2 miles West of Cook's Truck Stop to the end of the Project at Texico. Access to all businesses is being maintained with control by flagmen where construction is in progress. The entire length of the project should be returned to a divided 4-lane by the end of the year. The project will be temporarily suspended after that date until warmer weather in the Spring of 2001. When weather permits, there will be one more application of surface material placed on the entire project. 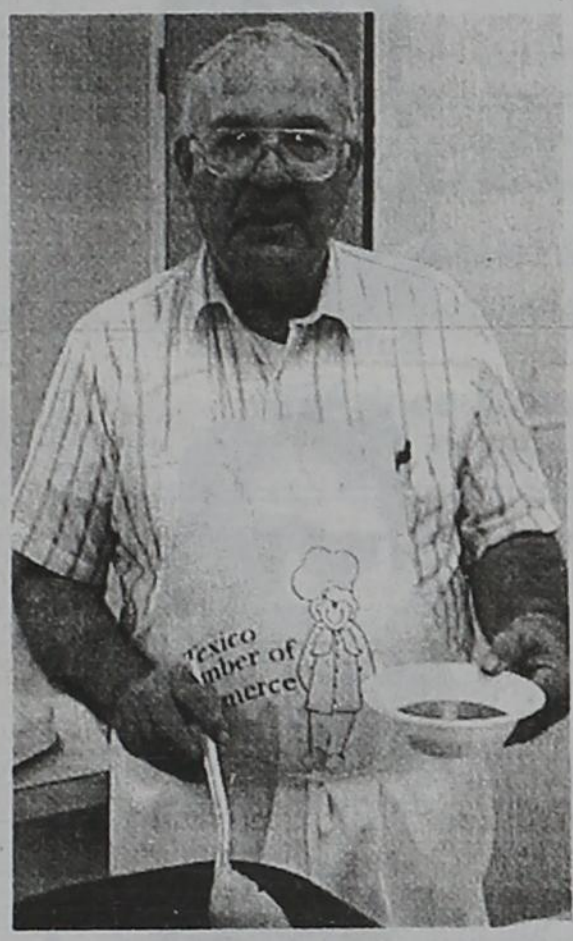

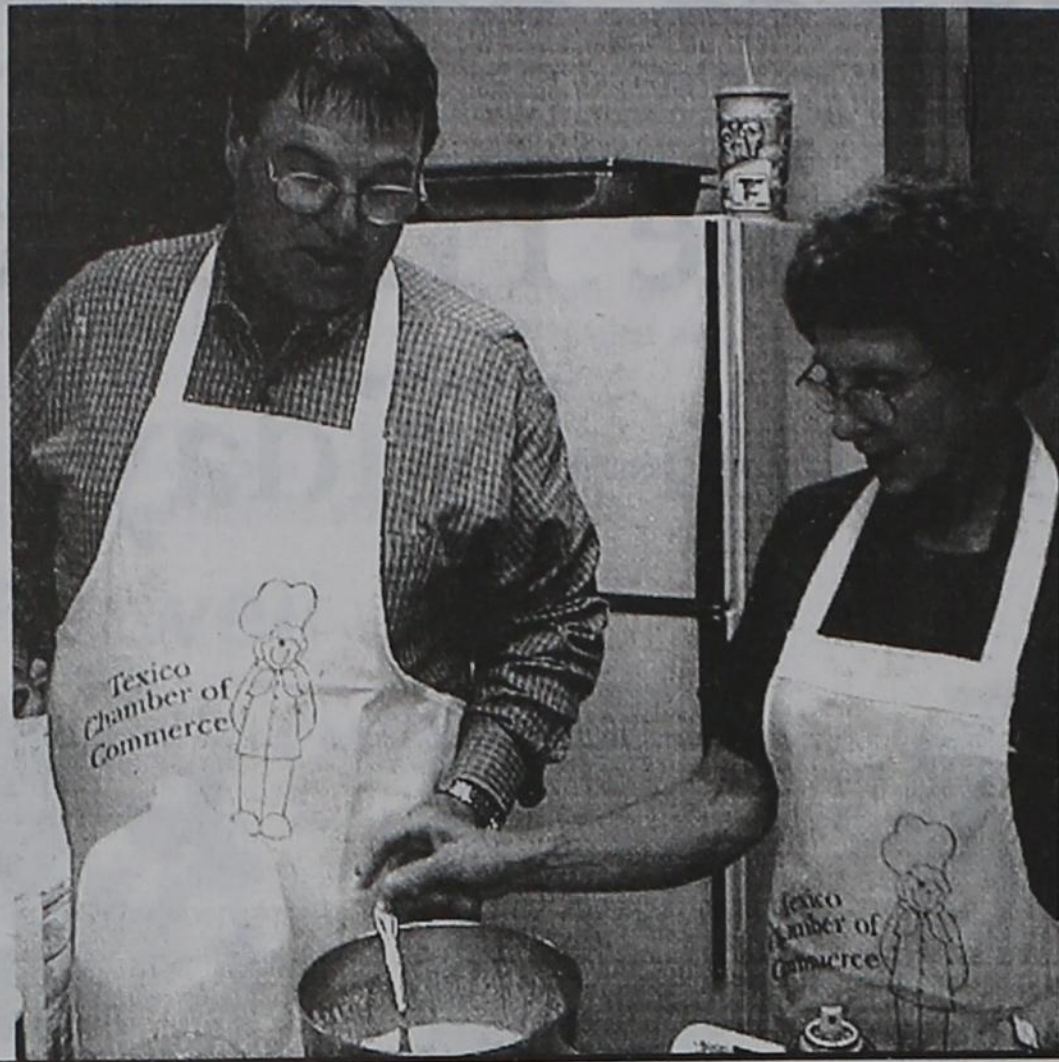

Ordinance No. 146
TRUCK ROUTE
I. VEHICLE DESIGNATION AND PROHIBITION
 It shall be unlawful for any truck, tractor, trailer or other heavy vehicular equipment in excess of twelve thousand (12,000) pounds to use, travel upon or driven over any street, avenue, or highway within the city limits of Farwell, Texas, not designated as a truck route as herein described.
 The above prohibition shall extend to all vehicular traffic which is traveling through, around, or in the city, except that this prohibition shall not be made to deny the legitimate pickup or delivery or merchandise, goods and passengers to and from locations within the city. A truck making such pickups and/or deliveries shall traverse the designated vehicle route, taking the most direct routing from the designated commercial route to the point of pickup and/or delivery. A bill of lading, routing sheet or other such documentation portraying the specific address from which the merchandise, goods and/or passengers are to be picked up or the address to which the delivery is made is prima facie proof of legitimacy.
 Trucks coming to and from the Farwell Grain Exchange located on Third (3rd) Street are granted an exception to this truck ordinance upon sufficient proof of legitimacy. Trucks acquiring water at the city well located on Third (3rd) Street are granted an exemption to this truck ordinance upon sufficient proof of legitimacy.

II. DESIGNATION OF TRUCK ROUTE
 The following streets and highways or portions thereof, are hereby designated as authorized truck routes, to-wit:
 (A) US Highway 84, also known as Avenue A.
 (B) John Aldridge Loop, also known as 9th Street.
 (C) US Highway 60, also known as the Amarillo highway.
 (D) Avenue A south on First Street to Avenue D turning west to the state line highway.

III. POSTING OF NOTICE AND SIGNS
 The public works director of the City of Farwell, Texas, shall cause to be placed within the city limits appropriate signs indicating authorized truck routes as approved by the City Council.

IV. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS
 Any vehicle transporting hazardous materials shall follow the truck routes designated in paragraph II of this Ordinance. The term "hazardous materials" is defined by Title 49 Code of Federal Regulations Section 173 or as follows:
 1. radioactive materials
 2. explosives
 3. poison
 4. flammable gas
 5. non-flammable gas
 6. flammable liquid
 7. oxidizer
 8. flammable solid
 9. corrosive material
 10. combustible liquid
 11. etiologic agent
 12. other regulated material
 13. hazardous waste
 Any vehicle carrying such hazardous materials shall not be allowed upon any other city street of the City of Farwell without the escort of the city police or other peace officer. Vehicles needing transportation through the city limits on streets other than the designated truck routes shall contact the Farwell Police Department at 806-481-3600 with its office located at the corner of First Street and Avenue A.

V. ENFORCEMENT
 The Chief of Police and the city police force shall have the authority to require any person driving or in control of any commercial vehicle not proceeding over a truck route or street over which truck traffic is permitted to proceed to any public or private scale available for the purpose of weighing and to determine whether this Ordinance has been complied with.

VI. NO STREET PARKING
 Except in an emergency, no truck, tractor, or other heavy vehicular equipment in excess of twelve thousand (12,000) pounds, shall be parked or left unattended upon any city street, state or federal highway within the city limits of the City of Farwell. Citizens of the City of Farwell shall be allowed to proceed to their residence within the city limits in any truck or tractor exceeding twelve thousand (12,000) pounds and park said truck or tractor on any private property within the city limits. Trucks or tractors with trailer in excess of twelve thousand (12,000) pounds will not be an exception to this ordinance regarding citizens travel to their residence inside the city limits.

VII. VIOLATION OF ORDINANCE
 Any person who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a Class "C" Misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$200.00. Each violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense and shall be punishable as such.

VIII. MODIFICATION
 The City Council shall have the authority to amend and modify this Ordinance from time to time as it sees fit.

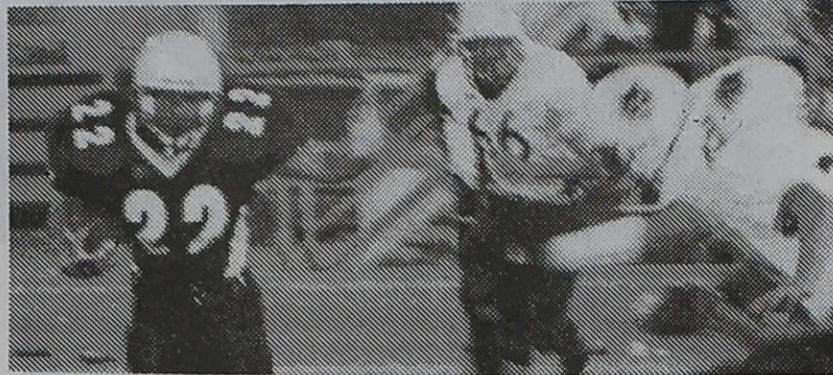
Farwell was stymied again and punted. Nichols had good pass defense. Farwell got the ball back but fumbled it away at midfield.

In the middle of one of the worst droughts in Texas history, cotton growers in the Northwest Plains Eradication Zone (which includes Parmer County) have at least one thing to celebrate -- boll weevil numbers have been drastically reduced.

The Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation reports that the results of the eradication program in the zone, which began with a diapause program about a year ago, continues to show a marked reduction of boll weevil numbers compared with last year.

Through mid-September, trap captures in the zone averaged .45 weevils per trap per week.

Foundation personnel will be aggressive in treating for weevils this fall, in an attempt to reduce the number of weevils that hibernate for the winter.

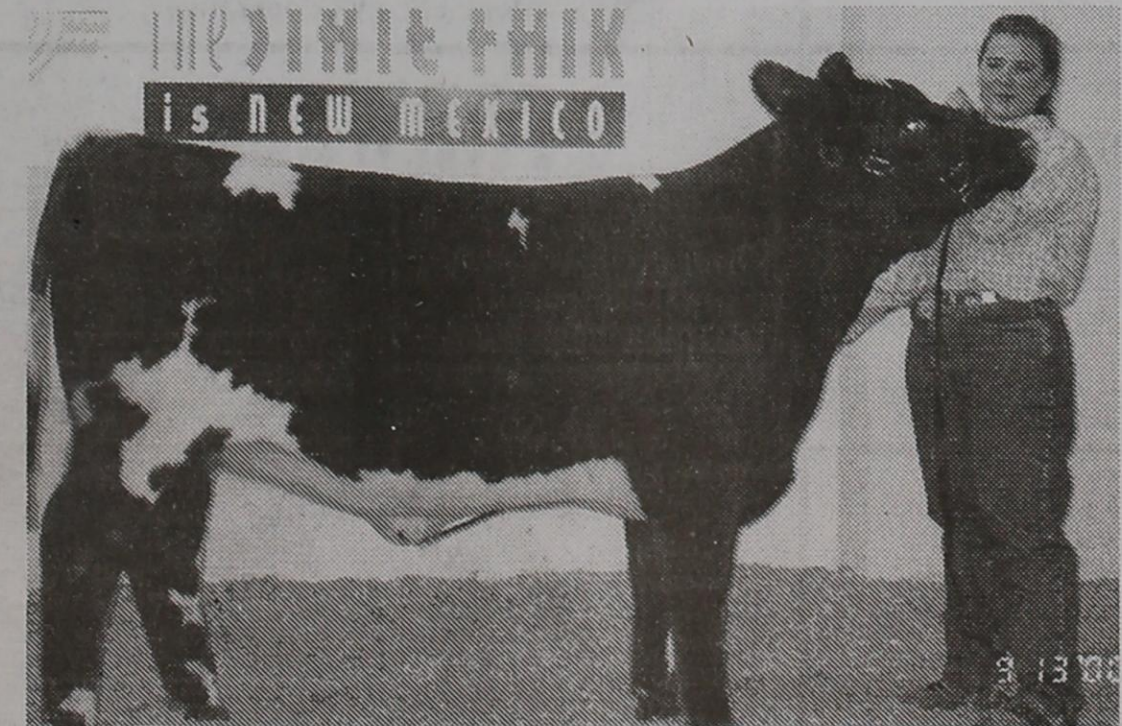

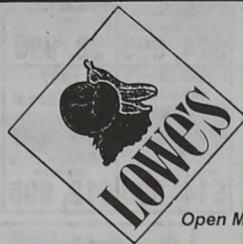
