It was almost like he thought the world might have changed directions or something. He knew exactly which direction to walk to get to the lake. I just looked up at him with a confused look on

We fished for hours, whiling away the waiting for the fish to strike by talking about what was important to a nine year old boy and his grandfather...dogs, baseball, the ways my father used to act in school and how I seemed to be repeating history. 

have you?"

I tried to manage a little laugh that came out more as a gagging cough when I saw how he wheeled around to stare at me in response to my question.

Time stood still as he stared at me. I wriggled in my boots and braced myself for a stream of Dutch words to be rattled off in my direction as reprimand for my being so nosy. Opa didn't like people that minded others' business better than their own and he never hesitated to let you know it.

But after what seemed like an eternity, Opa softened his gaze and patted me on the shoulder.

"Oh, Barty-boy, it is time I told you about my special compass, isn't it?" he heartily asked. "Come, let us walk the clear path home and I'll tell you about this little compass of mine."

I hated to be called "Barty," but I kept my mouth shut.

Opa and his family had moved to America in 1933 from Holland when he was eight years old. They moved to Kentucky, but traveled to West Texas to see a real working ranch one summer and never left. Opa and his brothers got jobs in the oil fields as soon as they were old enough and then, at the age of 18, he was drafted into the United States Army.

"I was trained in just a few short weeks to shoot an Army gun, dig trenches and how to choke down a can of food in nothing flat," Opa said. "Then I was to be shipped overseas to fight the Germans."

"My mother and father knew that the war was a bloody one and that the odds were against us young men ever coming home. They wanted to give me something to keep with me that would remind me of them and home," he softly began.

Opa's family were strong Christians with an almost mystical bond between each of them...the brothers and sisters were best friends and they never picked on each other. The six Sutphen kids were called the "six sweetie-pies" by most everyone in their hometown.

They never fought this label and just took it all in stride. Opa's parents reinforced the strong ties to each other and to their home. Home was a haven for their family, where there was always a song being sung, laughter ringing from the backyard and the smell of fresh baked bread seem to be a permanent fixture.

"My mother and father always told we kids that, no matter how far away we may go, there is always a way back home," Opa stated. "Perhaps this is why they chose to give me a compass as my keepsake from them."

"Is it the same compass, Opa?" I asked.

"It is indeed. But it had a little something special added to it one Christmas," he went on.

Opa stopped for a moment. He fumbled in his pocket and then handed me the compass.

"Oh, wow, this is...nice?" I stammered. It wasn't really anything spectacular. I was less than impressed.

"Open it Barty," Opa urged.

There were words engraved into a sort of poem on the inside lid of the compass. It read:

Life may take you far and wide, But never will you roam. For Christ and this compass will always lead you home.

"So, your parents had that engraved inside of it for you before you left for the war?" I asked.

"No." Opa shook his head. "Mother had written these words on a card for me the day they gave it to me. I must have read that card a million times on the way over to Germany. I always kept it in the same pocket as the compass."

Opa went on to say how many times the words comforted him as he lay in the trenches during battles he fought as an infantryman on the front lines. His battalion moved about all over the Black Forest region of Germany. During the times that he was able to rest he would often take out the compass and think of home. He was scared, but he prayed for courage and endurance to see him through.

Then Opa was shot during a late night skirmish. It was Christmas Eve and the temporary cease fire that had been put into effect was violated by an aggressive German battalion. He vaguely remembered being carried off to a vehicle. The next thing he remembered was waking up in an Army hospital, but he didn't know how long he had been there. When the haze lifted from his mind, the first things he thought of were his parents, brothers and sisters and his compass. Where was his compass? And what about the card his mother had written?

The nurses assured him that his family had been told of his injury and

that he had survived. They couldn't tell him anything about a compass. Several of them thought he was just imagining ever having a non-Army

Several weeks later, Opa had recovered enough to be sent home. He earned the Distinguished Service medal and a Purple Heart because of his injury. While he was proud of the medals, he really wanted someone to find his compass.

"My prayers were answered when a beautiful brunette walked through the door of the hospital ward calling out the name 'Bartemus Sutphen.'

She had something to give Opa. In a brown envelope with no writing other than his name, was Opa's compass. It had been cleaned and polished and the leather strap had been oiled. He held it tightly for a few moment as tears welled up in his eyes. But when he opened it, he couldn't believe what he saw.

Inside, the words from the card had been elegantly etched into the metal lid. Opa asked the young woman question after question about how she had the compass and whether or not she had taken it to be engraved.

"I was talking so fast, she couldn't get a word in at all!" Opa mused. "She finally told me to be quiet so she could explain everything."

Her name was Lisette and she lived in the little village nearby the battlesight where Opa was injured. She and her brothers had gone out to look at the area where the skirmish had taken place and she had found the compass on the ground almost hidden beneath a thick blanket of pine



needles. It was badly caked with mud and she had taken it to the watchmaker in the village to have it cleaned. The watchmaker heard from several American nurses that came to his shop, that there was a young soldier in the hospital asking for just such a compass.

"She called the hospital to get my name and brought it over to me," Opa continued. "But what is so amazing about the whole story is that Lisette swore that the words were already engraved in the lid of my compass when she found it. I explained to her about my mother's card and all she could say was 'Got in Himmel!' at the end."

Opa thanked Lisette and wrote her address down to take with him. Two years later and many letters later, Opa sent for Lisette and they were married in a small church wedding with all of his family as witnesses. He never found out how the words got engraved on his compass.

"One day, Barty, this compass will be yours," Opa remarked as we stepped up onto the front porch.

Oma was waiting inside with a big hug for both of us. She was still a beautiful brunette back in 1973.

The years passed and I grew up into a rebellious teenager that knew everything better than my parents or grandparents ever could. I left home the day after my High School graduation and headed for the big city to make my mark on the world.

I hardly ever spoke to my family, but when I did, I scoffed at my father telling me that the door to the house was always open to me, anytime I wanted to come back home. Both of my parents were extremely concerned about my relationship with the Lord. But I didn't think much about the Lord during these days and, quite frankly, I didn't think that the Lord thought much about me either.

I had managed to keep a pretty good relationship with my Opa. I was just trying to scrape enough money together to catch a bus out to visit he and Oma when I got the news: Opa was in the hospital and wasn't doing very well.

My father sent me a plane ticket and I got to the hospital in just enough time for Opa to weakly hold my hand and motion for me to come closer. He was whispering the words "you," "compass," and "small box."

"Don't worry about your compass, Opa. I'm sure it's around here somewhere," I told him.



Texico puts off baseball decision

Should Texico Schools institute a baseball program? That was a major topic at Tuesday's meeting of the Texico School Board.

About half a dozen parents attended to support the idea. They presented a survey that showed 59 high school boys and 44 high school girls were for it.

The topic had arisen at the board's November meeting when Buddy Vaughan presented a detailed report backing it.

A problem brought out involves federal Title IX guidelines -sports for boys and girls. In New Mexico, there is a girls' softball league. So the questions are:

-- Would girls and boys both play in the baseball program?

-- Or if Texico approved a baseball program, would they have to also approve a softball program for girls?

The board postponed any decisions.

In other business, the board:

-- Heard that Texico Junior High received a "high improving award" from the state due to its improved test scores. As a result, Texico Junior High will receive a grant of \$10,178. A committee of parents and staff will be formed to present their suggestions on how to use this money to the state.

-- Held its annual superintendent's evaluation.

-- Discussed the annual accountability report, which will be published in the Tribune soon.

-- Approved the annual audit.

-- Heard that 24 Texico students are attending the vocational program at Clovis Community College.

-- Discussed revisions of the new gym floor with the architect. Hopefully, bids will go out in February for the new gym.

-- Received a letter from the school's insurance company concerning Farwell students who practiced with the Texico Band or used the Texico School track for practice. Basically, the insurance company said that Texico School insurance did not cover these students and that Farwell Schools would have to provide insurance for them.

So, the board put a moratorium on Farwell students using Texico facilities until they receive certificates of insurance coverage. Farwell Supt. Larry Gregory will be contacted about this problem.

It was a letter from Opa.

I took a deep breath and began to read my Opa's last words to me:

Dear Barty,

I know how much you hate to be called this, but you are and always will be "Barty" to those that love you the most ... especially me. How'd you like to grow up with a name like "Bartemus?" I never told you this before, but I didn't like my name much either growing up. I just wanted you to know that I was proud you were the one to share my name.

I'm not long for this world and I've been giving your situation and my circumstances a lot of thought these last few days. Somehow this scratched up compass keeps coming to me as the answer for us both.

Bart, take the compass and keep it safe. It's been with me through thick and thin, good times and bad, and it's always helped me see the clear path home. When my parents gave it to me, I felt safe, loved and guided. It's always been a mystery to me at how the words got engraved in the compass lid. Somehow, I think a small miracle took place and I was meant to have the words with me forever. Someone knew these words were important to me.

I want you to have it as a reminder of what's truly important in your



I placed the compass on our Christmas tree as a tribute to the love the gift and the day represented. Oma hugged me tightly and whispered, "You're all home now!"





ENMR to award educational scholarships

The ENMR • Plateau Education Foundation will again award educational scholarships in the spring of 2001. Applications are available at local high schools.

Graduating high school students who meet the following

criteria are eligible to apply:

-- The applicant must be in the immediate family or a dependent of an active ENMR Cooperative member receiving landline telephone service from the cooperative. Cellular phone service does not qualify for membership or scholarship

-- The applicant must use the scholarship to attend a regionally accredited vocational school, a college, or a univer-

-- The applicant must have at least a 2.5 cumulative grade point average or equivalent on a 4.0 grade point scale.


-- The applicant must have two letters of recommendation accompanying the application.

-- Applicants competing for the Harris or Patterson Memorial Scholarships must submit a one-page, hand-written essay. Unsuccessful applicants for these scholarships will automatically be placed in the pool for the Banner Scholarship appli-

-- Each applicant has the responsibility to assure that the application form is complete and eligible with all signatures and supporting information. Completed applications must be postmarked by March 5, 2001.

For 2001, the Foundation will offer local students the possibility of receiving the \$2,500 Robert M. Harris Memorial Scholarship, the \$2,000 Evelyn Patterson Memorial Scholarship, or one of several \$1,000 Banner scholarships.

The foundation was formed in 1993. So far, it has distributed over \$200,000 in scholarships, grants to local schools for technology investments, and scholarship endowments at area community colleges. Funding is derived from the telephone cooperative members' donated and abandoned capital credits.







This face became even more apparent when, in little more than a week in March, the Dow gained more than 1,000 points. Why?

Part of the answer may be that the blue chips were suddenly seen as more affordable than the high-flying technology stocks.

Despite the 34 percent correction in the Nasdaq earlier this year, many of these stocks, especially "dot.com" companies, are trading at extremely high price to earnings (P/E) ratios.

That simply means that investors are paying a high premium for the potential earning power of these companies, some of which have yet to show a profit.

Some market experts have suggested that the P/E, along with other traditional valuation measures, should be overlooked when it comes to evaluating the new, high-tech stocks. But other market watchers believe that companies with absolutely no history of earnings are, at the least, pretty risky.

Who is right? It's probably too early to say. In all likelihood, there will be some shakeouts in the high-tech world, particularly in the dot.com sector. But no matter what happens in this area, blue chip stocks will stick have an important place in a welldiversified portfolio. That's because blue chips have at least three major advantages:

· They make money -- a company that knows how to earn money in various economic climates should be of some interest to investors.

 They pay dividends stocks that pay dividends demonstrate that company's commitment to its shareholders. If you don't need the dividends as income, you can reinvest them back into the

· They have a track record -because blue chip companies generally have long track records, you can evaluate how they've performed in a variety of market cycles. This can be useful when you're considering different investment op-

In the final analysis, there is no one "right" category of stocks to own. In making your choices, you will want to consider your needs, your objectives and your tolerance for

BAKED APPLES Elisa Smith

- 4 med. apples
- 2 T. margarine
- 1 t. nutmeg 4 T. brown sugar
- 1 t. cinnamon
- 2 t. vanilla

Preheat oven to 350 degrees, wash and core apples, cut about 1/2 inch peeling from stem end of apples. Place in baking dish, stem end down. Add enough water to cover the bottom of baking dish. Combine margarine, nutmeg, cinnamon, brown sugar, and vanilla. Divide mixture evenly into the apples. Option topping, melt squares of carmel, use low fat if desired, 1 cup chopped nuts. Drizzle over cooked apples or serve on the side. Bake until tender.

ZUCCHINI - APPLE SALAD Jade Mahaney

- 1 small jicama, peeled and coarsely chopped
- 2 red delicious, Granny Smith, or Fuji apples, coarsely chopped
 - 1/2 cup lemon-current vinaigrette (see below)
 - 2 medium zucchini, very thinly sliced
 - 3 cups red leaf lettuce, torn into small pieces
- 8 oz. cheese (pepper jack, mozzarella, cheddar, or blue cheese) crumbled
 - 1 apple, very thinly sliced for garnish
- 2 medium zucchini, made into about 18" ribbons' for garnish

Combine the jicama and apples with just enough vinaigrette to moisten. Layer ingredients in a 8x8" dish in the following order -- 1 layer of overlapping zucchini slices, 1 1/2 cup red leaf lettuce, 1/2 jicama, apple mixture, 4 ozs. cheese. Repeat for second layer and top with a third layer of zucchini slices. Press down gently but firmly and chill for 1 hour or longer. Before serving, drizzle with vinaigrette. Brush apple slices with lemon juice. Garnish with apple slices and zucchini ribbons and serve. Serves 6.

LEMON-CURRANT VINAIGRETTE

Juice of 1 lemon

- 1 T. Champagne vinegar
- 1/2 t. mustard powder
- 1 t. honey
- Dash of salt
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil



Parmer County was taken from the Bexar county territory created in 1876, and remained under Jack, Wheeler, and Oldham county governments until organized in 1907.

The county was named for Martin Parmer, a member of the Texas Constitutional Convention of 1836. Parmer County was part of the 3,050,000-acre XIT Ranch. This was one of the 10 counties which made up the Capitol Syndicate Land Grant which built the present state capitol.

This territory was virtually unknown to any Indians or Mexicans prior to 1876, and no Anglo-American people were permanently located in the county until the early 1880's when the Capitol Syndicate started operating the XIT Ranch. The



In 1898 the Pecos Valley Railway, later absorbed by the Santa Fe Railroad, was built toward Amarillo from Clovis. Soon thereafter the county acquired the necessary quota of voters for organization. Several towns gradually grew up after the railroad was built. The population increased more than 1,000 by 1910.

One of the first towns was Bovina. This site, situated in the heart of the XIT Range, at one time was the largest inland cattle shipping point in the world. For some time it was merely a loading switch on the XIT. In those days many tons of cottonseed meal were loaded there, accidently some of it being spilled upon the tracks, much to the misfortune of the train crews who had to stop and chase the bulls away before the trains could passed. They referred to the switch as "Bull Town." This sounded coarse in the main offices, so officials substituted the name Bovina, derived from Bovine.

The Capitol Syndicate people began to execute their original plan of colonizing the 200 mile territory occupied by the XIT Ranch. During the 1890's, several hotels were built to accomodate home seekers coming to buy land in Texas. Trainloads of people, mostly farmers from the cold northern states, were housed in these hotels while choosing home sites. An 80,000 acre block was sold out of the XIT Range in this manner. Railroads, too, about this time began a similar campaigning to settle the county. Although no railroad crossed Parmer County until 1898, people were coming into the country and gradually pushed into this territory. Prior to 1920, practically all the population except ranch people were emigrants brought in by colonization efforts of land syndicates and railroads through the 1890's and early 1900's.

Parmer County one of the last counties where colonization efforts of land syndicates and railroads through the 1890's and early 1900's.

Parmer County one of the last counties where colonization was stressed, has an area of 902 square miles and is rather thinly settle. There are several small towns in the county. In 1938, Friona, the largest town, had a population of 731, Farwell, the county seat, had a population of 600, and Bovina had a population of 200. Parmer County reached 10,000 population in 1990.

Ranching was an important industry in the county: many large herds of fine Hereford cattle wer seen on the range. As of 1938 the following was written "Farming," however, has taken on new importance with each year. Wheat, row crops, cotton and corn are raised in considerable quantities. Irrigation is a growing field in this territory, a loarge supply of water being available at from two to three hundred feet.'





Irrigation really became a priority between the 1950's and 1960's. Parmer County residents refer to these years as the irrigation age. Since then, Parmer County has always been known for the vast amount of water that it has to offer. Farming continued to grow in Parmer through the 1970's, 80's and 90's. Major row crops in 2000 are corn, cotton, wheat, milo, soybeans, and pes. Cattle have always been a major part of Parmer County. Cattle feeding in feed yards started in the 1950's and has become a large business for cattleman and corporations.

Industry is also very important to the employment of residents in Parmer County and the surrounding areas. Hi-Pro Feeds headquarters and the main plant are located in Friona. Also, in Friona is Excel Meat packing Plant. Sherley-Anderson grain elevators are located in Bovina, Farwell, and Lazbuddie, plus other sites in the area.

With the vast diversification of agriculture in Parmer County cash receipts over 365 billion dollars are produced each year. Parmer County agriculture producers are very innovative and aggressive towards new technology and have beenleaders in agriculture for many years. A steady increase of interest in this endeavor is evident. A true partnership relation between the Extension Service and the people has become wide-spread in recent years.

The program remains effective and successful with the potential to serve the need of farmers thoughout the county.

Parmer County began the Integrated Pest Management program in 1985 with Mike Blanton serving from 1985 to 1989. He was followed by Brant Baugh from 1990 through 1995. Mark Logan followed in the year of 1996 and served until 1997. Cherinell Riley came on board in 1998 and continues to serve the needs of both Parmer and Bailey counties.

Secondary recovery of capillary water viewed as water plan strategy

Capillary water is the water retained in the Ogallala Formation by capillary forces following gravity drainage. Capillary forces are the result of the molecular attraction between formation particles and water.

Test hole drilling and core analysis indicate that the moisture content of the formation material from 10 feet below land surface to the water table ranged from 10 to 40 percent by volume with an average of 25 percent. Using the average value of 25 percent, the 1,443,876,691 acre feet of unsaturated material currently in the Ogallala Formation in the 21county Llano Estacado Water Planning Region would contain approximately 360 million acre feet of capillary water. The amount of capillary water which may remain when the current saturated portion is drained (about 750 million acre feet of saturated material containing about 108 million acre feet of gravity water in 2000) would equal about 187 million acre feet of capillary water, for a total potential of 547 million acre feet of capillary water in the 21county planning region.

The volume of unsaturated formation material from 10 feet below land surface to the 1980 water level was calculated by subtracting the difference in elevations from a regional U.S. Geological Survey land surface topographic map and a map constructed by the Texas Department of Water Resources (currently, the Texas Water Development Board) illustrating the elevation of the 1980 water table. The values where the contour lines crossed were noted on the overlay map. These values were then contoured. The volume of area in acres between the contour lines was calculated by using a planimeter. The feet of formation material between contours was multiplied by the number of acres within each contour interval. The volume of material for all contour intervals was totaled, providing a value for each

The net change in the volume of water in storage in the same 21 county area between 1985 and 1995 was calculated to be 2,565,583 acre feet. Using a specific gravity yield of 15 percent, 17,100,000 acre feet of saturated material would yield 2,565,000 acre feet of water. A further assumption was made that the volume of saturated formation material that was drained of gravity water between 1980 and 1985 should equal about 50 percent of the volume of drained material that was calculated for the period between 1985 and 1995, which added 8,550,000 acre feet to our estimate.

Therefore, the estimated volume of unsaturated formation material from 10 feet below the land surface to the 1995 water table is calculated as follows:

- 1,418,226,691acre feet of unsaturated formation material in 1980.
- 8,550,000 acre feet of dewatered formation material between 1980
- · 17,100,000 acre feet of dewatered formation material between 1985
- Total 1995 volume is 1,443,876,691 acre feet of water

Recovery of Capillary Water

Three field tests were conducted to determine if the injection of air under pressure results in the release of water being held by capillary forces, allowing



it to drain down by the forces of gravity to the current water table where it can be recovered by wells. All three of the field tests yielded positive results. Additional field tests are needed to determine how to design air injection wells with the best opportunity to release the maximum quantity of capillary water at the least cost per unit of water from the Ogallala Formation, which consists of multilayers of different types of material, i.e., sand, gravel, silts, and clays.

Laboratory and field tests indicate that the injection of about 250 cubic feet of air per minute with a pressure head of 10 to 12 pounds per square inch results in the release of significant quantities of capillary water. The centrifugal compressor used in the last test conducted produced 376 cubic feet of air per minute at 18 pounds per square inch and required 18 brake horsepower operating at 3,000 revolutions per minute. The estimated quantity of capillary water released on this field test was esti-

mated to be 13 gallons per cubic feet of air injected. If this rate of release can be maintained, then injecting 250 cubic feet of air per minute should result in the release of 3,250 gallons of water per minute. When the capillary water is released, it drains down to the water table by the forces of gravity. The time required for gravity drainage to occur may be several months. The rate of movement of the water depends on the number and thickness of clay lenses in the formation. The release of capillary water will cost approximately \$50.00 per acre foot. An air compressor and electric motor can be utilized on multiple locations, reducing the per unit cost. Approximately one air injection well per 40 acres should yield the maximum release of capillary water. The page four illustration shows how to construct an air injection well. Additional field demonstrations and tests will likely result in refining the technology to make it more efficient and cost effective.

A Will Anderson adventure

It all started with Farwell's FFA chapter

(Editor's note: U.S. Naval Commander Will Anderson, son of Bob and Carrie Anderson of Farwell, periodically sends the Tribune stories and photos from his various ports of call. Currently, he is serving as an attache with the U.S. Embassy in Quito, Ecuador.)

The U.S. financed Plan Colombia operations are beginning to gather steam, with massive crop-dusting operations to kill the coca plants in the fields and Colombian Army strikes. The goal is to cut the importation of cocaine into the United States by at least half. If that could be done, the price of cocaine would skyrocket on the streets of America.

This is a new way to fight the war on drugs. We manage to catch maybe one of ten of the ships and airplanes and trucks crossing our southern borders loaded with drugs. All the DARE programs and midnight basketball games have not made much of a dent in the numbers of drug-users in America so far.

Now the fight is going closer to the source. If Plan Colombia makes cocaine extremely expensive compared to the prices on the street today, it could reduce the use of illegal drugs significantly because many people could not buy it at that high price.

(If people do not obey the laws of their own accord, just make breaking the law expensive enough that they'll want to quit anyway. That may not make them model citizens, but it will reduce drug-crime and in numerous related areas, and it will cut the financing for the druglords in Colombia.)

The situation is getting more complex and more tense in the northern border regions of Ecuador. The warfare in Colombia is a three-way dog fight between the Colombia Army, the Marxist narco-guerrillas, and the paramilitary forces, all fighting for the control of the country.

So far, the good guys look to be winning, the narcoguerrillas are getting hit pretty hard and starting to scurry in every direction, and the production of cocaine appears to have been hit really hard.

You hear predictions that Colombia will become "another Vietnam" for the United States, but I don't believe that is possible. The funding for Plan Colombia will provide the government forces in that country with the weapons, ammunition, helicopters, and herbicide to do the job. The Colombians are a proud people, and they want to solve the problems they have themselves.

But another big concern is that the bloodshed and chaos in Colombia may be driven into Venezuela, Panama, Brazil, and Ecuador. The problem is particularly worrying in Ecuador for a number of reasons.

Ecuador has endured a number of natural disasters, volcanoes, El Nino, and the near collapse of its economy altogether. Its armed forces are still trying to recover from the lack of funding to buy equipment, and to keep the equipment it holds operating at combat-ready levels.

The northern border areas are the least developed parts of the country, lacking schools, paved roads, clinics, and many other social needs for the people. The narco-guerrillas from

Colombia have used northern Ecuador as a safe-haven for years, coming down to recover from wounds and to obtain supplies to be carried back north.

And while the Colombians have been there, they have launched programs to win "hears and minds" in the least developed parts of Ecuador. They provide services that the Ecuadorian government has not provided, they are always spouting their communist worldview, and they even sponsor soccer leagues for the children in the rainforest villages.

The narco-guerrillas have up to now left most of the bloodshed and crime they commit in Colombia, and the concern is that if they are forced into a corner and forced across the border into northern Ecuador, that could change, and Ecuador may not be ready to deal with it.


