On this day, the 100th Anniversary of Parmer County will be celebrated in grand style.

A lot of work time has been put in and the fun is about to begin. Everything is in place for the blow-out and many fun programs are planned.

Be prepared for some comprehensive good speeches highlighting the good folk of all the communities of Parmer County. That is as it should be because we are celebrating our heritage and our people are our heritage.

Refreshments will be available during the day. They will include: Friona Noon & Evening Lions. hamburgers, fries, funnel cakes, drinks; Lookingbill's, roasted corn: First Bank Southwest-Hereford, BBQ plate: Southwest Dairy Producers, free ice cream; First National sausage Bank, Friona, wraps; and St. Teresa's, Friona, BBQ plate and faji-

Several new developments have been added to the entertainment. Brenda Wilson has talked with a gentlemen who has a climbing wall as well as a bungee jump to bring here.





Wheat crop promising

From Monti Vandiver, Parmer County extension agent

A promising wheat crop continues to develop in the Northwest Plains. Producers should check their crop closely as moisture stress signs are beginning to

According to the Texas High Plains PET Network, our wheat crop is using .25-.30 inches of water per day. Moisture stress signs could also be a result of damage to the stem resulting from the hard freeze the weekend of April 8.

Stems with freeze injury may appear discolored, swollen, and/or split.

These stems limit the plants ability to move water and nutrients up the plant.

Most stem damage locally has been observed in early planted fields and within 4 inches of the soil surface. Not all fields are showing signs of damage. It is difficult to predict the final impact on yield, but grain fill and lodging could be a problem.

Russian wheat aphids have been observed in local wheat, some of which had previously been treated with an insecticide. Russian wheat aphid is a potentially devastating pest with a relatively low economic threshold. Rust symptoms have been reported in a few fields on lower leaves.

Texico approves higher fines

The Texico City Council on April 24 approved changes to an ordinance to help clean up the city. Ordinance 317 was originally written to give the police the ability to ticket home and business owners who let weeds get out of control and who keep junk vehicles on their property.

The fines were a maximum of \$100, but often were low enough that some owners felt paying the fees were easier than cleaning up the problem.

The new ordinance has a minimum fine of \$100 and up to \$500 for each ticket. The amount of time the owner has to comply has also been changed from 5 days to 10 days.

- Set a date of May 15 for city employees to look at the city's policy on employment reviews and make suggestions for changes. The council had been asked to select an oversight committee to make sure the reviews were fair to employees.

- Agreed to move a water line that goes beneath the house of Auty Martin. When the pipe was put in, there was no easement recorded, and the council felt they should move the

pipe before it was damaged and caused property damage to Martin's residence.

- Will look into water pipes on Craig Street where dirt settles. The pipes were not put in by the city, but they are tied into the city water. Since the pipes only connect to one part of the city water line, dirt is often trapped and forced into property owners' houses. City Street Supt. Daryl Stanton will look into different plans to stop this from happening.

- Signed a Memo of **Understanding with Curry** County to distribute funds from DWI fines in the county. A total of \$10,277 was received last year and will be split between Texico, Clovis and Melrose to be used for supplies for the police departments. Each person convicted of DWI in the county has to pay \$75 into this fund.

- Heard from Police Chief John Mares that the city will probably receive \$17,000 from the drug money seizure last year. The police department found over \$340,000 and will get to keep 5% of it. The rest of the money will be split between other police offices.




ENMR officials reported as highlights of the year:

-- Matching grant awards given in 2006 included \$10,000 to the air ambulance service for Pleasant Hill.



Section 2: It shall be unlawful for the owner, and every occupant, lessee, tenant, guest or agent of the same of any lot or tract of land within the City of Texico to suffer or permit any weeds to grow and/or remain upon such lots or tracts of land, or to suffer or permit the accumulation of trash or debris, including but not limited to wrecked, non-operational and/or abandoned motor vehicles upon the same, or to permit the growing of such wees or the accumulation of such trash or debris, including but not limited to wrecked, non-operational and/or abandoned motor vehicles in the streets or alleys abutting any such lot or tract of land. Any owner, occupant, lessee, tenant, guest or agent of the same of such lot or tract of land who fails, refuses or neglects to cut, remove or destroy such weeds, or to remove such trash or debris, including but not limited to wrecked, non-operational and/or abandoned motor vehicles, after ten (10) days written or printed notice from a duly authorized official of the City of Texico shall be fined in a sum of at least \$100.00 and not to exceed \$500.00. 





Crist and Bailey homered for Texico.





LIVE CATTLE: Cattle prices have basically remained steady over the last 2-3 weeks with cash prices trading between \$96.00 to \$98.00. At this time, both of the longterm and short term trends have remained down. A close below \$91.90 basis the June contract would turn trends lower with a price objective of \$90.00. A break above the last two weeks high's at \$93.60 basis the June contract could give rise to another rally into the \$94.50 range.

FEEDER CATTLE: Feeder prices have also remain relaively stable over the last 2-3 weeks. Cash prices have seen little variation and is apparent when looking at futures prices which have been trapped inside a range between a \$107.00 to \$1.09.50 basis the May contract. Although short term trends have remained down, long-term trends of our still pointing higher. A close below \$106.00 would turn long-term charts down basis the May contract.

CORN: It has been difficult to determine whether corn prices are at levels which indicate a bottom or just waiting for another leg to the downside? At this time, it would take a close above \$3.93 basis the July contract in order to project prices back into the \$4.25 range. On the other hand, a close below \$3.55 basis the July contract would only project another leg down into the \$3.00- \$3.25 range. Normally, prices are expected to react to changes in weather conditions between now and July.

SOYBEANS: Long-term trends also turned down in the soybean complex about two weeks ago and have yet to show any sign of recovery. Some of this pressure is due to the fact that planting delays in corn could translate into increased planted acreage and soybeans. Whether or not this takes place, we would expect little will be known until we reach the end of planting season.

WHEAT: The extreme volatility seen in the July Kansas City wheat price has continued into this week. Long-term trends turned higher a couple of weeks ago on fears of massive losses throughout the winter wheat belt due to freeze and heavy snow. As the volatility indicates, there are still few facts and many rumors causing prices to fluctuate in very large trading ranges on a daily basis.

COTTON: Cotton prices have basically continued trendng lower for the last several weeks. New contract lows seem to occur every day or two. Although the long-term outlook remains much more favorable for prices, excessive stockpiles will need to show signs of decline as well as increasing demand from China in order to support a nigher market. This is expected to take several months.
