BTD parade starts building

Have you signed up for the big Border Town Days parade yet?

If not, just call BTD chairman Mike Pomper by noon on Monday -- 481-3681. That way, you are eligible for cash prizes (\$75, \$50, \$35 and \$25) given to the top floats.

This year's theme is Parmer County's 100th anniversary -- moving forward, looking back.

You can sign up after Monday noon, but that means you will not be eligible for prizes and you will be placed at the rear of the parade lineup.

The parade kicks off at 11 a.m. Texas time on Saturday, July 28, at Griffin Street and the highway in Texico.

The highway will be closed to traffic during the parade. A by-pass route

through Texico on Hereford Street has been set up by Texico police. Residents are asked not to park their vehicles on Hereford Street during the parade.

Farwell couple participates in Baptist ministry

About 40 years ago, a group of Baptist men living in Texas started traveling the area, lending a helping hand to those in need. Today, this group has grown into a thriving ministry that shares the love of Jesus everywhere they go.

Farwell resident Joe Hughes and his wife Gwen have been blessed to be a part of this ministry.

They travel voluntarily with other Baptist couples each month serving people and working hard to build new ministries. The couples are usually between the ages of 65 and 80, but that factor doesn't stop them from working relentlessly to get their jobs done.

The term "Texas Baptist Men" doesn't limit this group to working only in Texas. Joe and Gwen have done work in New Mexico, Oklahoma and Kansas as well.

Work usually starts on the second Monday of every month and lasts for about two weeks. Churches in the area where they are working provide "camp grounds" for the volunteers to park their campers. They also provide meals for the workers while they are there.

What kind of work do the volunteers do? They do whatever needs to be done. The group does project building as well as carpentry work. Joe and Gwen are on the cabinet crew, building cabinets for new buildings at whatever location they are at.

"It works like an assembly line," Joe says. "One person will cut one part for the cabinets, and another person will do another part."

While the men are busy with their carpentry jobs, their wives stay occupied with mission work. They make blankets, dolls, and other knick-knacks to give to shelters and children's homes. The women volunteer for various community projects and are always looking for opportunities to help.

Teamwork and motivation gets the work done quickly, giving the volunteers time in the evenings to relax

The registration deadline for the contest is at 4 p.m. on July 26.

The contest will be held one hour before the Border Town Days parade kicks off on Saturday, July 28. The contest takes place adjacent to the Citizens Bank branch in Texico. Entrants need to be here at 10 a.m. Texas time.

After the bicycle contest ends, all participants will ride in the parade to the Farwell City Park.

Prizes will be announced at the beginning of the day in the park activities at 12:30 p.m. Texas time, at the Farwell City Park gazebo.

All participants need to be on hand at that time to receive their prizes. No motorized bikes are allowed in the contests.

The contest is open to all youths who live in the Texico and Farwell School districts. Also, the BTDay committee allows children and grandchildren of local folks to enter also, even if they live elsewhere.

There are two categories - 7 and under, and 8-12 years of age.

Other rules are:

-- All participants ride the parade. Their folks can go along too. The parade ends at Farwell City Park and a bicycle rack will be set up just across the street on the property of First Baptist Church of Farwell.

-- You must be present at the park to receive your cash prizes (or if you win the bicycles!) when the announcements are made during the 12:30 p.m. ceremonies.

Changes proposed for Farwell School dress code

The Farwell School Board will likely vote at its August meeting on proposed changes for the Student Handbook / Code of Conduct. They include:

In regard to the dress code, the following changes are proposed:

a. Remove the fingertip rule that applies to shorts and skirts and change it to mid-thigh.

b. Pants and shorts must fit at the waists. (hip bone)

c. Oversized shirts will be dealt with by each building principal.

d. No frayed or holes in the jeans that show skin.

e. In regards to the hair, we propose the following: a student's hair must be neat and well kept. The hair will not be below the eyebrows. No pigtails or mohawks will be allowed. Any type of coloring must be a natural color consistent with hair-styles of the 21st century.

No visible offensive tattoos will be allowed.

Each building principal will use sound, reasonable judgement in dealing with these issues.

Other changes include:

Putting the requirements of the Chamber of Commerce and the Principal's Scholastic Award in the Student Handbook.

Propose to have a uniform policy in regards to the homework policy dealing with any type of extracurricular activity. The number of days absent constitutes the number of school days you have to complete the missed assignments.

Propose to change the wording on the Tardy Policy to: On the 4th tardy, the student will have a choice between lunch detention and/or a swat.

In regards to the cell phone policy:

Change from the remainder of the semester to either 3 or 6 weeks. The cell will become the property of Farwell Schools. After the time has elapsed, the parent may come to the school and pick up their child's phone.

All sponsors will handle any violations in regards to the use of cell phones. Farwell School policy will be enforced. Again, all sponsors will use sound, reasonable judgement in dealing with each offense.

Farwell High cheerleaders will host Junior Cheer Camp Aug. 7-9 from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. at the high school gym.

It's for kindergarten through 6th grade (2007-2008 school year) and the cost is \$25.

LIVE CATTLE: Cash trade is expected to continue higher this week with most feed yards looking at \$91-92 and although beef prices have improved, beef has yet to catch up with futures or fed cattle cash. Overall, the market may have spiked during mid week after a massive short covering rally sparked some Fund buying, but once buying dried up, prices collapsed back towards the lows of the week. Overall, a positive week, but very flat going into Friday's close.

FEEDER CATTLE: The market also saw what may be called a iblow-off top this week after making a run back towards last year's highs and failing. The market was able to hold lows made earlier in the week, but closing on or near the lows for the week. A close below \$113.50 could signal another leg down into the \$111.25 basis the August contract. Prices are volatile.

CORN: Corn prices are beginning to get back up into a short term resistance level around the \$3.72 level basis the December contract. Prices project into the \$3.80-3.85 area, but it will require some bullish news to get the market to those levels. At this time, there seem to be reports of many areas across the Mid West which are drying out fast and forecast for very hot temperatures next week.

SOYBEANS: The soybeans continue to move up while closing at new contract highs and also on their high for the week. Prices still project up into the \$9.80 area basis the November contract. Hot temperatures forecast across the Mid West next week with little moisture has been supportive.

WHEAT: Wheat prices have become stagnant, but are holding above the \$6.00 level with some help from sharply higher grain complex overall. Production estimates are beginning to surface and there seem to be some very good areas of production which may help to offset the areas which suffered the most during harvest. Analysts believe the market has done enough to factor in the news?

COTTON: Cotton prices have yet to slow their advance as Fund buying has helped to support a long term uptrend. There was long term resistance around the \$66.00 level, but even these levels have been penetrated. Production estimates continue to slid, but export business has not yet picked up enough to see huge stocks begin to drop. Analysts believe that China will eventually begin to buy.

More on the environment

Environmentalists say that alternative sources of energy must quickly be established in order to reduce the impact of human activity on our world's climate.

Whether or not that is the case, our nation's economy depends on reliable energy at realistic prices, and if for no other reason, alternative sources must be determined now.

Five possibilities have been previously discussed, hydrogen, electrical generation by hydro-power and by geo-thermal sources, coal, and nuclear power plants. Each of them will bring their own problems to the table.

The next three possibilities are bio-fuels, wind power, and solar power. All three of these may also offer additional value to our part of the High Plains.

To begin, bio-fuels like ethanol have a lot of support now, including from President Bush in this year's State of the Union Address. Of course, the day after the President's speech saying that America would free itself from its dependence on imported oil by converting corn into ethanol, the world price of corn tripled.

They had riots in Mexico because corn is a staple for its people, and in Cuba, the U.S. was condemned for "stealing the food off our children's plates to burn in the fuel tanks of their limousines."

Also, if 100 percent of America's corn crop last year had been devoted to nothing but ethanol, it would have met only 12 percent of our gasoline demand. In fact, it will require all the farmland in America, plus 20 percent more, to replace gasoline.

Despite the environmentalist optimism, producing the standard mixture of 90 percent ethanol and 10 percent gasoline actually pollutes more than gasoline does alone. Ethanol burns as much energy to produce it as it provides in the tank, so it is not any kind of energy saver either.

While ethanol will reduce imports of petroleum, it will not come close to ending them so our dependence on foreign suppliers won't be relieved either. And finally, unless the government subsidizes it with millions of taxpayer dollars, a gallon of ethanol actually costs more than a gallon of gasoline does. One way or another, the hard-working American driver is going to pay for it, so "cheap fuel" is a myth too.

It's been tried before. The military dictatorship that ruled Brazil before I got there had mandated that the nation convert to gasohol, an ethanol-like mixture of 24 percent alco-

hol and 76 percent gasoline. Millions in taxpayer funds were committed to make it happen using sugar cane, which is a much better source for alcohol than corn.

Today, most cars in Brazil run on either pure alcohol or on gasohol, but Brazil still has to import millions of barrels of petroleum. Gasohol is propped up by taxes, and the portion of the work-year in Brazil just to pay

taxes is more than a month longer than America's. All in all, it did not deliver to expectations in Brazil, and it is unlikely that it will in the U.S. either.

Despite these negatives, American politicians are scrambling to get on the ethanol bandwagon to win votes from greens. It seems likely to become a growth industry in the years to come, providing wider markets and better

prices for our area's agriculture. So, if for no other reason than another market for corn, ethanol is an alternative energy that will be worth watching, particularly on the High Plains.

In the final entry in this series in next week's Tribune, we can look at the possibilities that wind generation and solar generation of electricity might have to offer our nation and our communities in particular.

1918: Texico-Farwell looks to the end of World War I

Here's another in the series of articles from the Texico-Farwell News, which was published in 1917 and 1918.

The Nov. 8, 1918 issue had a Page 1 story that really hit the nail on the head. The article was headlined "German Army is Believed to be Seriously Crippled."

Indeed it was. World War I ended three days later.

As expected, Page 1 was full of war news, including "16 inch American guns now on front", "Older men are to be trained graduating in camp", and "Nov. 9 is proclaimed as gas mask day (for Texans to gather fruit seeds and pits which produce the carbon used in gas masks by U.S. troops).

One article noted that a Texico pioneer, Mrs. Susan Jane Watson, had died at age 66 after a long illness. "Grandma Watson," as she was known, had located in Texico in 1901, making her one of the area's first residents.

Another Page 1 death notice was for J.T. Curtis who died accidentally from a fire explosion while working as a mechanic in South Haven, Kan.

Curtis, 32, had lived in Pleasant Hill, then moved to Texico-Farwell 18 months earlier and was in charge of the Texico Garage.

There were 3 large ads on Page 1. One, for Farmers State Bank of Texico, said, "Your money

is needed for united war work" and asked folks to contribute to groups like the YMCA, The Salvataion Army, the YWCS, the Knights of Columbus and the Hebrew war-workers.

Another ad was for Texico's Red Cross Pharmacy, saying, "Buy sensible gifts for your soldier boy," such as brushes, fountain pens, razors, toiletry, cigars, cigarettes, pipes, pocket knives and watches."

And there was an ad for F.J. Doose, a Farwell distributor for oil, gasoline and lubricants.

Page 2 was a mixture of war news and local tidbits. Articles talked about where Emperor Charles of Austria-Hungary would run to after his abdication, the new war time currency (new "greenbacks" were being issued in Washington) and Turkey's capitulation to the Allies.

A column of "Fairfield Facts" had notes like:

-- W.B. Vaughn and Mr. Lansford are helping Mr. Kennedy gather his crops.

-- Mr. and Mrs. Ole Moore visited the Houston family.

-- Lewis Boone and Edd Huston got their Army notices.

-- Mrs. Galloway, an experienced teacher from below Portales, had accepted the post of primary teacher here.

And there were the "Locust Grove Gems":

-- The broom corn thrasher is running in this neighborhood this week.

-- W.E. Miller has gone

to Kansas City with his car of cattle.

-- Ruth Bell is visiting her sister Mrs. Ebb Randol.

Page 4 of the News was the usual full page ad for the Cannon Ball Motor Co., headquartered in Texico.

Page 4 had another column of tidbits and classified ads mixed together:

-- "If you have a spite at yourself and want to leave the country, O.N. Robison will cry your sale."

-- "For Sale: One house 18x22, boxed and stripped. New. Bargain at \$150. C.G. Hudson at News office."

-- "For Rent: One modern 3-room bungalow with lights and water in Texico. V. V. Knowles."

-- Mrs. Mary Murphy has the flu.

-- D.W. Dunn returned home from a visit to Fort Sill, Okla.

Weather: It's May in July

From Monti Vandiver, Parmer County extension agent - IPM:

May weather continues to dominate July.

What a difference a year makes.

The second week in July 2006 had 108 heat units accumulated, compared to only 50 in 2007. Isolated hail storms took their toll again this week; they were not wide spread but they were very damaging.

Wheat harvest is all but complete. Reported yields, for the most part, have been very good.

Much of the area corn is pollinating. Silking corn is at peak water demand. The most critical period when moisture stress will impact yield is two weeks before and after silk.

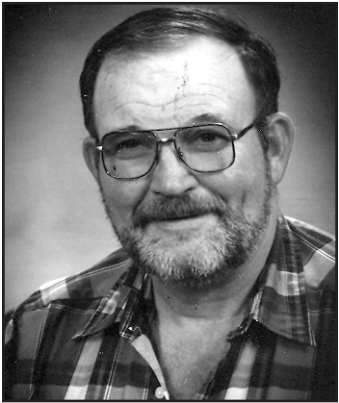

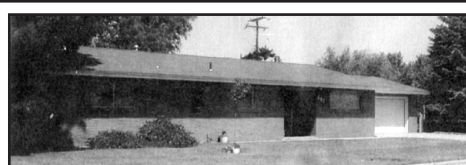

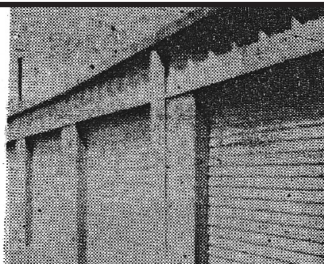

Public hearing held on egg plant plans

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality held a public hearing at the Farwell Community Center on Tuesday on Cal-Maine Foods' plan to bring 2.7 million chickens to the county.

The TCEQ had already granted preliminary approval to the facility, but held the meeting in response to questions raised about the plans.

The plant is planned for CR 3333 three-quarters of a mile south of U.S. Hwy. 60.

Area residents with concerns included Roy Hartzog, David and Pam Norton, Todd and Hayley Christian, and Scotty and Carrie Edwards.

Questions were raised about bird flu, smell, water usage, dust from the feed mill, truck traffic and impact on the residents who live within a mile of the new plant.

They also asked question about flies, constant usage of water as opposed to seasonal irrigation, and possible expansion of the plant.

In each case, Steve Storm, a Cal-Maine vice president, responded with how the company would deal with any problems.

Speaking in support of Cal-Maine were Steven, Jason and Wayne Schilling.

Parmer County Judge Bonnie Heald asked what route trucks would take from CR 3333 to the facility. Storm responded that Cal-Maine will build an asphalt road between the county road and the new plant.

Earl Behrens, from the Conservation Service, asked about water usage.

At this point, the next step is for written comments and questions to be sent to the TCEQ for make a final decision on the egg production facility.

Cal-Maine, based in Jackson, Miss., is the largest producer and distributor of fresh eggs in the nation, according to the company's web site.

Storm said the Parmer County facility is expected to produce four truckloads of eggs a day -- 3,000 cases.

Earlier this year, the Parmer County Commissioners approved tax abatements for Cal-Maine over a five-year period.

Time to move on

Like many of you, I have been listening to the arguing, questioning, finger-pointing, etc., for several weeks now, involving Bovina city officials, the City Council and Economic Development Commission.

I wanted to avoid writing this column, but instead of things cooling down as I had hoped, the innuendo does hurled at last week's City Council meeting show that it keeps going on and on and on.

I pray that all the participants (and I do mean all) step back, take a deep breath, and consider the overall situation: what is best for the community should take precedence over each individual's perspective.

I won't name any names or specific incidents in this column, not because I am afraid to, but because they would infer guilt where there might be none.

The old adage "where there's smoke, there's fire" is not always true.

Here is why: what is "legal" or "illegal", "ethical" or "unethical" often depends on a person's point of view. And we have lots of different perspectives here -- the main problem, I believe.

The District Attorney was informed of a particular situation, and he declined to follow up. That says to me that nothing illegal was done.

And, in my opinion, what has gone wrong is simply due to honest mistakes by well-intended individuals. I know some of the folks reading that statement will be angry

with me for making that statement, but that is my perspective.

Yes, errors in judgment have been made by several of our city leaders. But our folks are just human beings; they are not perfect.

Do they know all the laws completely? No, and neither do you or I. Do they make all the right decisions? No, and neither do you or I.

I believe that all the folks involved in this controversy try to do the best they can for our community and I appreciate that. I believe the errors in judgment were just that -- honest mistakes that are being construed by some in other ways.

That has to stop. I have heard too much apologizing from city leaders lately. I feel that some folks talk too quickly without knowing all the facts, then have to say "sorry." But the damage is done.

What also bothers me is that too many of our community residents are taking sides in these disputes. That should end now! It's one Bovina, not two.

How to get past these bad feelings?

I propose that the City Council appoint a committee to meet with the BEDC and discuss at length the legal guidelines the BEDC needs to follow so the council and BEDC are on the same page and to avoid past blunders.

The purpose should not be to rehash what has already occurred -- but to make sure future situations are handled correctly.

Please, folks, it's time to move forward. Stones have been thrown, and everybody got hit. What has that accomplished? Is it making the community better?

The steps I suggest will help put some of the acrimony behind us, and we can put our focus where it belongs -- on making Bovina the best community anywhere.

It's time to move on.

Council: No special Spicola pact needed

The Bovina City Council on July 10 voted unanimously against entering into an agreement with Old World Tuscany Properties -- the proposed Joey Spicola housing and business development at the city's northern edge.

The council felt that the city code has sufficient guidelines for proposed developments and a special agreement with Spicola was unnecessary, reported City Manager Ernest Terry

What Spicola had been seeking was for the city to pay some of the development costs relating to infrastructure, such as the streets, said Terry.

Terry said the city code says the developer must pay his own costs.

In other business, the council:

-- Discussed changing the city's tax abatement policy and establishment of a Bovina reinvestment zone.

Currently, if a business meets certain requirements, it is eligible for these tax breaks: 1st, 2nd and 3rd years, 90 percent; 4th year, 75 percent, and 5th year, 60 percent.

Terry said eligible businesses must meet at least one of these criteria: \$500,000 expense in setting up; a minimum of 5 employees; or a minimum payroll of \$105,000.

The council might tighten up on the tax breaks. And it may differentiate between the size of the business (have two rules -- one for larger firms and one for smaller ones), reported Terry.

Recommended changes to this policy will be left to whoever the new city manager is.

-- Accepted the resignation of Terry as city manager, effective Aug. 1. He has taken the job as Fritch, Texas, city manager. Mayor Stan Miller thanked Terry for his hard work and dedication to the community, with balanced budgets for his five years here and keeping property taxes down. Each councilman also thanked Terry.

-- Held an executive session to discuss hiring a new city manager or appointing an interim city manager.

After the council went back into public session, a motion was made to appoint Bovina Police Chief Leon Saddler as interim city manager.

The motion failed on a 3-2 vote. Supporting Saddler were Richard Villarreal and Jessie Stone. Opposed were Gaylen Rhodes, Jim Swafford and David Curtis.

No further action was taken.

-- During the payment of vouchers, the council voted 4-0 (with one opposed -- Stone) not to okay a \$7,500

Council to have extra meeting

The Bovina City Council will have a special meeting on July 30 at 7 p.m. to re-open discussion on two topics from the July 10 meeting:

1. Appointing an interim city manager.

2. Having another vote on approving the \$7,500 payment to Larry Hodnett, the Bovina Economic Development director. The voucher was not approved by a 4-0 vote on July 10 and a question of legality raised.

Mayor Stan Miller received an e-mail from councilman Jim Bob Swafford on July 11, saying that Swafford had researched the law and found part of it to say that the BEDC is allowed to get the money for this pur-

pose.

In the e-mail, Swafford suggested the topic needs to be presented again to the council at its next meeting for consideration.

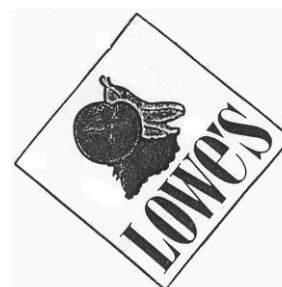
