Texico expands school day

The Texico School Board voted unanimously on March 13 to extend the regular school days on a trial basis starting next semester.

The regular student day will run from 8:15 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Currently, it's from 8:30 a.m. to 3:15 p.m. Thus, an additional 30 minutes has been added per day. This translates into about 6 more minutes per classroom period.

Supt. R.L. Richards said the school will try this for a year to see if it helps with instruction. If it doesn't seem to, then the board may return to the current schedule.

By having these extra hours built into the calendar, it also gives the board and administration some leeway into having more days off if found necessary, such as for a state tournament game or state fair.

For example, when the Texico Lady Wolverines were in Albuquerque the previous week, so many students went to the games that instruction was difficult here. It might have been better to close school for those days.

As part of the calendar changes, READ Days will be instituted starting next semester, also.

READ Days are for students who are having academic difficulties. READ Days will be Sept. 20, Nov. 1, Dec. 6, Feb. 7, March 28, and May 2 and 9. READ Days will be half-days. If a student has a certain grade point average (on a class by class basis), then he doesn't have to attend school that day (junior high school and high school students). Elementary school students will go to READ Days after their testing period is over.

School starts Aug. 21 for students and ends on May 16. Vacation dates are: Labor Day, Sept. 2; October break, Oct. 7-8; Thanksgiving, Nov. 27-29; Christmas, Dec. 23 - Jan. 7; M.L. King Day, Jan. 20; Presidents Day, Feb. 17; Spring break, Marcy 17-21; and Good Friday, April 8.

In other business, the board:

-- Heard that the National Honor Society induction will be April 9.

-- Heard Dr. Richards report that math next year will be offered at Texico High School for high school and college credits. This is due to teacher Buddy Little receiving his master's degree in math. He can now teach courses for Clovis Community College at Texico school.

Bovina firemen were paged at 4:50 a.m., and were able to save at least two other buildings.



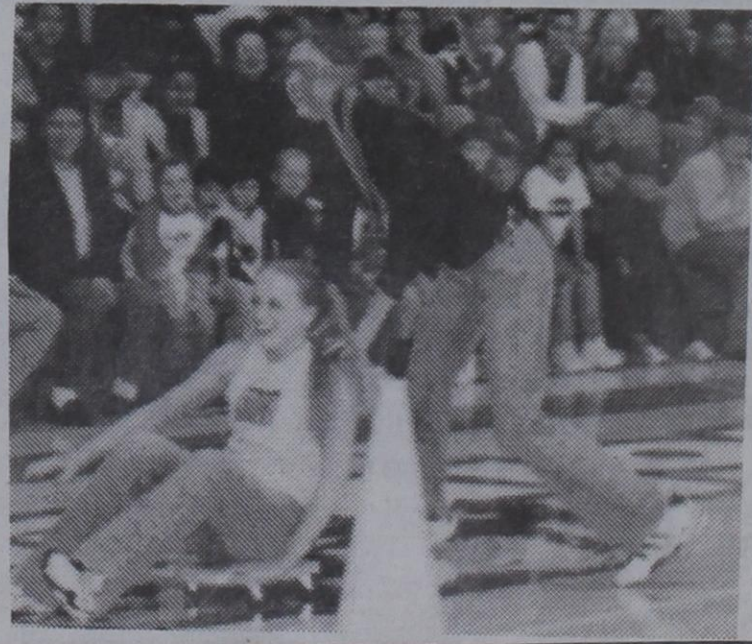
FFA auction held

Re-elected as directors were Charles Christian, Oklahoma Lane; J.B. Noland, Summerfield; and Pat Robbins, Frio. Only Robbins had an opponent -- Tommy Sparkman. Robbins is board vice president.

WTRT General Manager Thomas Hyer reported that capital credits will be sent soon to cooperative members of 1980.

Also, the Co-op will increase the rural scholarship fund. This year, seven \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded. In the past four years, 30 scholarships have been handed out.

The co-op reported a net margin for the last fiscal year of \$385,975.

Some interesting agricultural stats for Texas: Texas is the second largest agricultural state in the U.S., accounting for about 7 percent of the total U.S. agricultural income, and 16 percent of the gross state product.

Texas ranks 1st in the nation with 130 million acres of farmland -- 80 percent of the land in Texas is in some form of ag production.

The top five ag-producing counties are Castro, Deaf Smith, Parmer, Erath and Lamb.

Texas farmers grow more than 60 different commercial fruit and vegetable crops.

Texas is the leading beef-producing state, ranking 1st in the U.S. in the number of cattle and calves (14 percent of the U.S. total).

Texas traditionally produces enough cotton each year to make almost 1.3 billion pairs of denim jeans.

Each Texas farmer grows enough food and fiber for 128 people -- 94.3 in the U.S. and 33.7 abroad.

Although agriculture employs 1 out of every 5 working Texas, less than 2 percent of the population is involved in day-to-day farming or ranching.

Besides cattle, the state's other top crops are vegetables, citrus, corn, wheat, peanuts, pecans, grain sorghum, hay and rice.

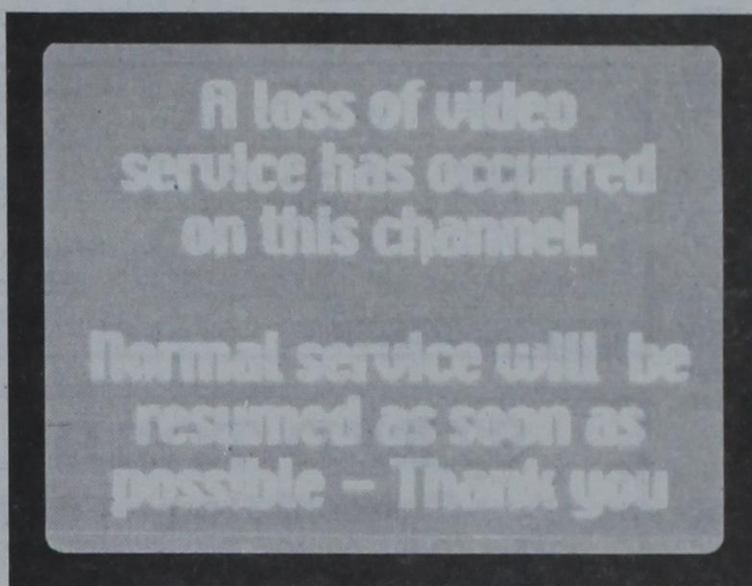

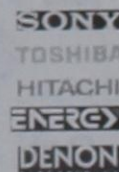

FIRE CALLS

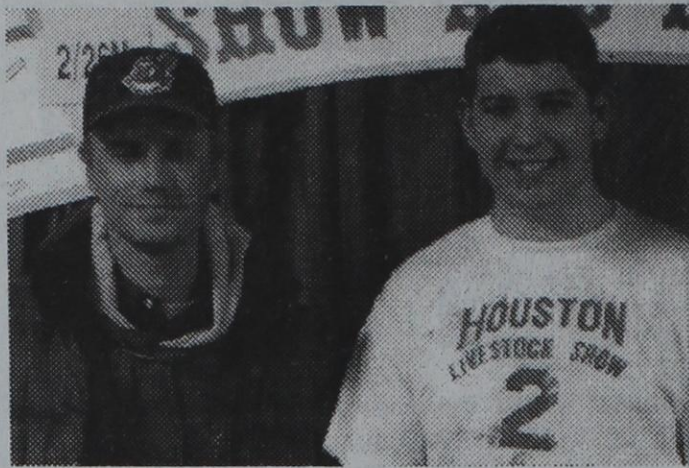
The Farwell firemen were called to a structure fire at Avenue C and 7th Street on March 13.

Actkinson: Lazbuddie probe ongoing

Parmer County District Attorney Johnny Actkinson told the Tribune on Tuesday that the investigation into the Lazbuddie marijuana processing facility raised by police in October is actively ongoing.

William Vernon Puckett, of Lazbuddie, pled guilty on Jan. 22, to manufacture of a controlled substance (marijuana), and was sentenced to 10 years in the Texas Department of Corrections, probated for 10 years; \$293 court costs; \$5,000 fine; 300 hours of community service, obtain substance counseling at own expense, and loss of driver's license for 180 days.

He had been arrested Oct. 18 after the Parmer County sheriff's office staged a raid on the farm,

about 1½ miles from Lazbuddie School.

After a search warrant was issued for the barns on the property, sheriff's deputies found a facility for processing, manufacturing and distribution of marijuana.

Parmer County Sheriff Randy Geries said it took deputies five hours to remove drugs from the facility.

A recent editorial in the Lubbock newspaper, followed by a letter to the editor in that publication from a Muleshoe resident, questioned how much interest Parmer County law enforcement officials had in pursuing the case.

But Actkinson said the Lubbock paper had

quoted the defense attorney, Floyd Holder, as saying that one condition of the plea agreement required Puckett to provide names of other people involved.

Actkinson said that occurred on videotape.
