Tribune to salute county centennial

The State Line Tribune, in coordination with the Parmer County Historical Commission, will publish a special salute to the county's 100th anniversary on April 26.

This keepsake issue will feature a history of Parmer County and a host of historic photos. There will be other county history-related articles, too.

Extra copies of this special Tribune issue will be published, then distributed at the Historical Society's day-long celebration at the Parmer County Courthouse grounds in Farwell on May 5.

In trying to make this commemorative issue really special, the Tribune invites every business,

family, farm, organization, etc., to participate by placing ads in it.

These ads will be available at a large discount. By doing that, Tribune publisher Rob Pomper said it is his hope that more folks can participate that way. Ads will cost as little as \$20.

Last week, most businesses in Lazbuddie, Bovina and Friona were contacted by the Tribune. This week, contacts have started with Farwell businesses.

"We realize that it is not feasible to personally contact 100 percent of the businesses in Parmer County, so we hope that this article will serve as an invitation to every business, family, organization

and farm for their participation," said Pomper.

The deadline for ads in this special issue will be March 31. It's an early deadline for the centennial issue because of the large amount of work that needs to be done before it can be printed.

Pomper emphasized that in addition to businesses, ads may be purchased by families, civic and social groups, and farms.

Those who wish to have an ad (cost is \$20 and up, depending on the size), need to call the Tribune at (806) 481-3681 or come by the office at 404 3rd St., Farwell. The Tribune's e-mail is tribune@plateau-tel.net.

"We realize that some folks and businesses would like photos with their ads," said Pomper. "So we ask that they come by with the pictures they want used, or e-mail them to us with the appropriate information."

Pomper suggests that ads for businesses include:

1. The date they were established.
2. The name of the manager and/or owner.
3. Telephone number and address.
4. Any historical information they would like to put in it.
5. Photos.

larger and cost more, again depending on the size. The same goes for a lot of historical information.

"We already have contacted many businesses, and the reception thus far has been outstanding," said Pomper. "Since this issue will be a keepsake, we want it to be as broad-based as possible. We don't want to miss anyone in Friona, Farwell, Bovina, Lazbuddie, Rhea, Hub, West Camp, Oklahoma Lane or any other part of this great county."

Businesses are only being contacted once apiece. There won't be any "follow-up."

"We don't want to 'bug' folks about ads," said Pomper. "We have passed out the information, and pointed out the March 31 deadline. Now it's up to the you. 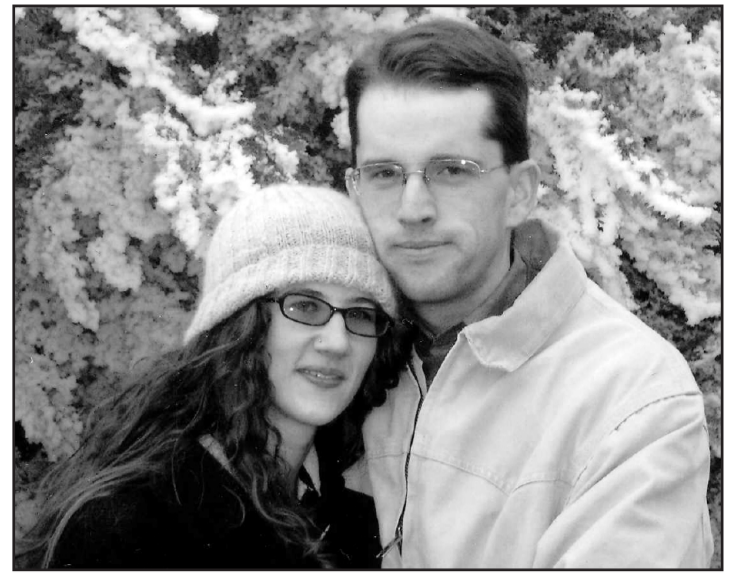

Kirkland, Beaubien head to state CX Debate meet

From Angela Hall, Farwell debate team sponsor: Farwell High School hosted its first District CX Debate Tourney on Feb. 8. Competing were Farwell, Sudan, Olton, Hale Center and Smyer.

For the third year in a row, Farwell dominated. Even though they did not place first, the Farwell teams took 2nd, 3rd and 4th, very similar to two years ago.

Jourdan Kirkland and Lauren Beaubien placed 2nd in the finals, losing to Sudan in a 2-1 decision. Thus, they will advance to the CX Debate state meet in Austin in March. They have also qualified for the TFA state meet as well, in Carrollton, Texas, later this month.

Sophomores Black O'Hare and Alicia Porter placed 3rd, making them the alternate team to the state meet. They have also qualified for the TFA state tourney and will head to Carrollton.

Sophomores Kade Foster and Cameron Kirkland placed 4th. They were topped in the semi-finals by the Kirkland-Beaubien team.

But our accomplishments don't stop there! All three Farwell teams were the only three teams out of the 10 participating that had perfect 3-0 records in the preliminary debate rounds. This means that Farwell won all of its nine prelim rounds. Farwell had the top three ranked teams going into the outrounds.

Also, the CX District debate tourney kicks off the UIL academic spring contest. In CX debate, schools may receive points through 4th placed. Sudan received 20 points for first, and Farwell received 16 for 2nd, 12 for 3rd and 10 for 4th -- a total of 38 points toward winning the academic contest in March.

As of now, Farwell is in 1st place thanks to all our CX debate teams.

Proposed legislation would affect Texico graduation rules

The Texico School Board on Monday received a report from Supt. R.L. Richards on possible new state legislation.

It looks like high school students will have to receive four math credits. This legislation is likely to pass.

Another state bill calls for schools to offer two foreign languages, even though students only need to take one.

And a bill calls for dual high school diplomas to be given out at graduation -- one type for students who get the four math credits, and the other type for students who don't.

In other business, the board:

-- Added three persons to the substitutes' list -- Ashley Denton, Shannon Fallis and Sandra Hudson.

-- Received the resignation of Breanna Green, junior high school science and ag teacher, effective in May.

-- Assigned Michael Littlejohn as junior high school track coach.

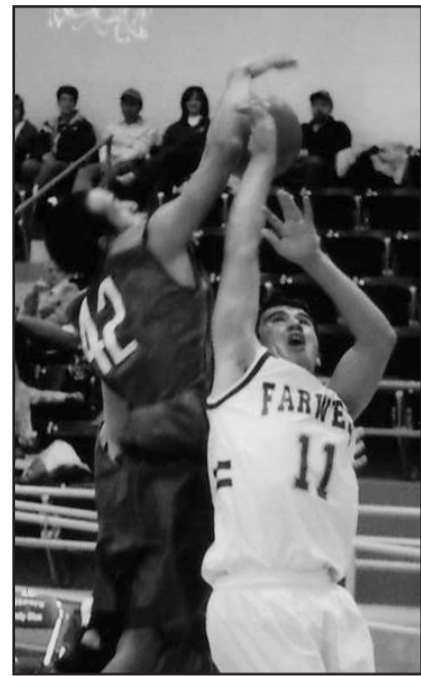
-- Met with Margie Crooks, representing the Texico Cemetery Board. She asked if some extra dirt might be available for placing at the cemetery. The board agreed to have extra dirt from the baseball field project sent to the cemetery.

-- Scheduled the math and technology textbook meeting for parnts for March 19. School officials are looking at new books.

-- Will send board members Cary Crist and Tim Foote to a state training session for new board members.

-- Will seek a state grant on repairs to current parking lots. Funds are available.

-- Got updated on the baseball field. Dirt is being dug up and cinders being put in the infield. A work day likely will be held on a Saturday in March. The first baseball game will be played in April there.

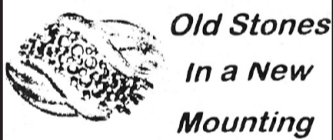

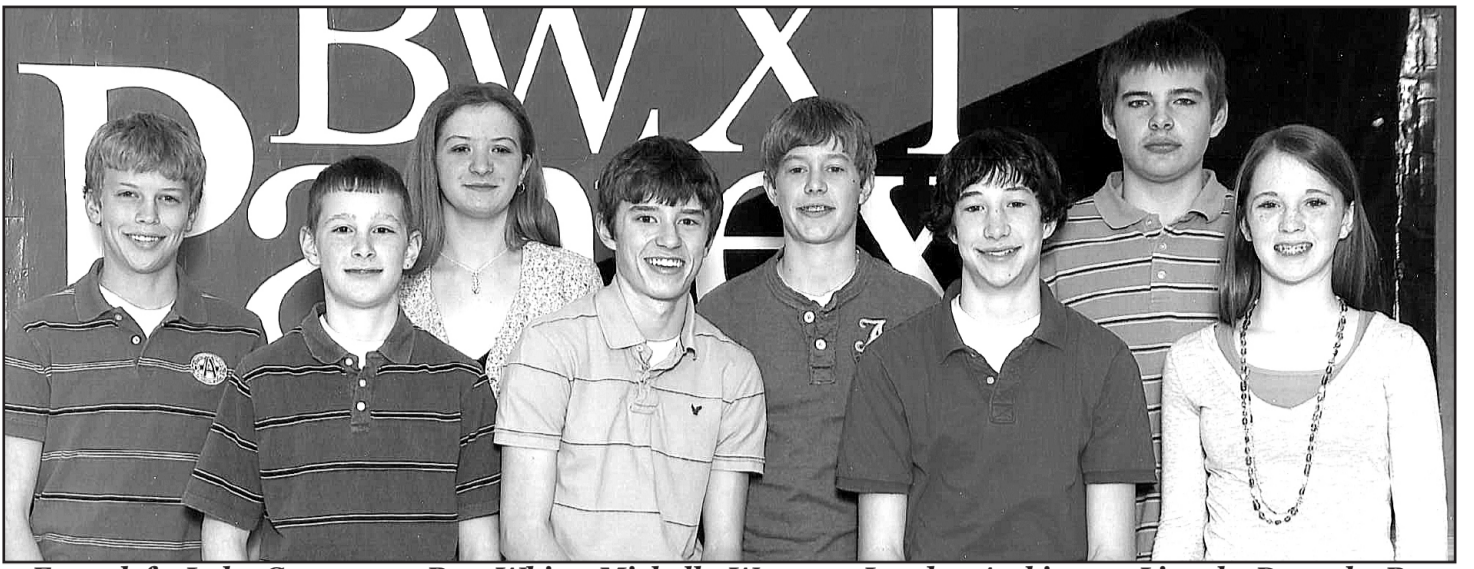

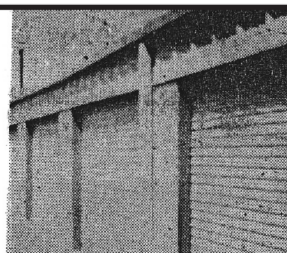
In Texas, it's playoff time for the high school basketball teams.

That was the last time I ever played in a baseball game. I went out on top.
