A BIG MIRACLE FOR A LITTLE GIRL IN LAZBUDDIE

Jayci Joy Nickels was 14 months old when doctors diagnosed her with stage 4 cancer.

Her parents, Kimberly and Guy Nickels, of Lazbuddie, had taken her to a pediatrician two months before and had been treating her for pneumonia.

A cold brought her to the Parmer Medical Center in Friona where a doctor found a baseball sized mass below her lungs. It was touching her heart and compressing her right lung.

She was sent to Amarillo immediately.

Doctors there told the Nickels to prepare for the worst.

Kimberly said they sat there waiting, curled up on the floor when something told us to get up and pray.

"It was a God thing."

The Nickels prayed through the night; the prognosis stayed the same.

For days, doctors told them it would take a miracle for Jayci to pull through. She quit breathing and had organ failure during the procedures.

She couldn't have surgery because of where the cancer was.

Jayci held on for her life, and made it.

A doctor told Guy it wasn't medicine, it was a

miracle.

Six months of chemo treatments left her basically paralyzed, but alive.

Kimberly said Jayci couldn't move or eat, but one day she moved her tongue and made a noise. Hope was raised for them.

From that point, Jayci had to start over from scratch, re-learning how to eat, move her arms, crawl, and eventually walk again.

Five therapists came

monthly to help with everything from movement to speech.

Jayci Joy turned 3 in April and her parents couldn't be happier with her progress.

The cancer has been reduced to a spot the size of a fingernail, and is a type that usually doesn't recur.

Guy said she might not be ready to start for the Lady Longhorns basketball team, but she is

ATV racing has turned into an event for the Steinbock family

Have you ever heard of a berm or holeshot?

A berm is a dirt pile that forms as riders take a turn over and over again forming a bank, and a holeshot is being in the lead after the first turn.

This is called ATV racing lingo, and we have a senior at Farwell High who knows all about racing ATVs.

Kyler Steinbock is the son of Tanya and Dennis Steinbock, and he grew up living on a farm. When he was only 9 years old, he wanted to give dirt bikes a try.

Within his first year of learning to ride his bike, he was entering races. "I've always been competitive," he said.

It didn't take long before Kyler realized dirt bikes weren't for him. "There were just too many people, and it was too crowded. I just didn't like it."

A couple years later, he found his talent. Because he lived on a farm, Kyler rode 4-wheelers all the time. He decided on giving competitive ATV racing a shot instead, and fell in love with the sport.

When he first started, he was in the beginner class and raced at local events around the area. Even though he wasn't having much success, he still enjoyed racing.

After he began getting the hang of things, he advanced to the amateur class. "After I moved up, all I wanted was to place," he said.

Since then, he has won 47 races and only lost 3.

"It's kind of a coincidence," he said. "I moved up to a harder class, but I'm doing better than I was in the easier one."

Racing ATVs is not an easy task. It requires time, talent and experience to be successful.

Because Kyler is a busy high school teenager, he has learned how to juggle school, sports, and racing.

He's discovered the best time to get in quality practice is on weekends, where he usually practices between 4 to 6 hours. Also, he does not have a track to practice on where he lives, so he has to drive to his uncles' house in order to have a track.

Practice is not the only thing that consumes the time. Traveling to and from races and the races themselves take a big part of the time frame.

For example, during school this previous

year, Kyler had a football game in Whitharral, Texas. After the game was over, his family loaded up and headed to El Paso for a race the next day.

They drove from 11 p.m. to 5 a.m. before finally reaching their destination.

"I would get leg cramps in the middle of the night, so dad would pull over and I would jump out and run down the highway," he said. "Then I'd get back in and we'd keep driving."

The furthest he has traveled is about nine hours, and usually focuses on races in New Mexico and Texas.

Getting to the race is only half the battle though.

About 8 or 9 in the morning, competitors begin arriving at the track. They then must wait in a line to practice, which can sometimes be up to 4 hours.

up to 4 hours.

After practicing, racers then compete in a heat race which determines who qualifies for the main event that night.

If they qualify, they have to wait all day until their race, which is usually the last of the night, around midnight.

"It's a long day," he said. "Because I have to wait so long, I start to get nervous."

Kyler loves racing because it's an individual sport.

"If I mess up, it's my fault," he said. "I have to do it myself, and I can't blame anyone else."

Racing is an adrenaline rush, and he said the best feeling is after the race is over and he knows he did his best.

He recently competed in Munster and achieved

a great accomplishment. Contest officials decided to bump him up to the pro class, and he ended

up winning the entire competition.

On July 25, Kyler won the Quad-Amateur in

Gallup, N.M. The next day, he "turned pro" and placed 3rd overall.

A fun fact about Kyler's racing experiences is the only broken bone he's had is his nose, but his own bicycle gave him that not his 4-wheeler. The only serious injury he's suffered while racing is a concussion.

ATV racing has turned into an event for his entire family. They all travel together to races and have the chance to hang out and spend time with each other.

"It's like one big get together," he said. "I just want to thank my parents for hauling me around and allowing me to race, and anyone else who has made this possible for me."

Texico gets \$3.8 million for school projects

Texico Schools received some great news from the state late last week, reports Supt. R.L. Richards.

The Public School Capital Outlay Council approved \$3.8 million in state funds for Texico's planned remodeling and construction projects.

Dr. Richards credited Texico community involvement in being the key to getting this important grant. Here's why:

The council planned to

fund some requests from schools that were ranked in the first hundred. Texico was No. 109.

But the council called Texico's project "shovel-ready" and gave them the funding needed. Texico's project was ready because the community already had approved a bond issue for the project and the school board had moved ahead with its planning.

Thus, with the state funds Texico has just

under \$7 million available. This will be used for:


A new cafeteria and pre-kindergarten building; a vocational career center; and bathroom upgrades and other selected upgrades in all the campuses.

Next up is for the architect to finish the specifications so bids can go out, hopefully by October. And the new building would be ready for use in the next school year.



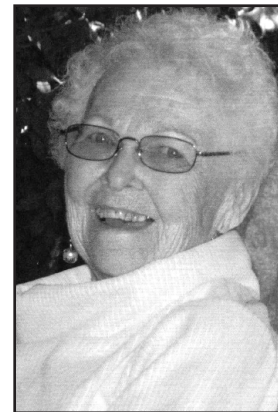

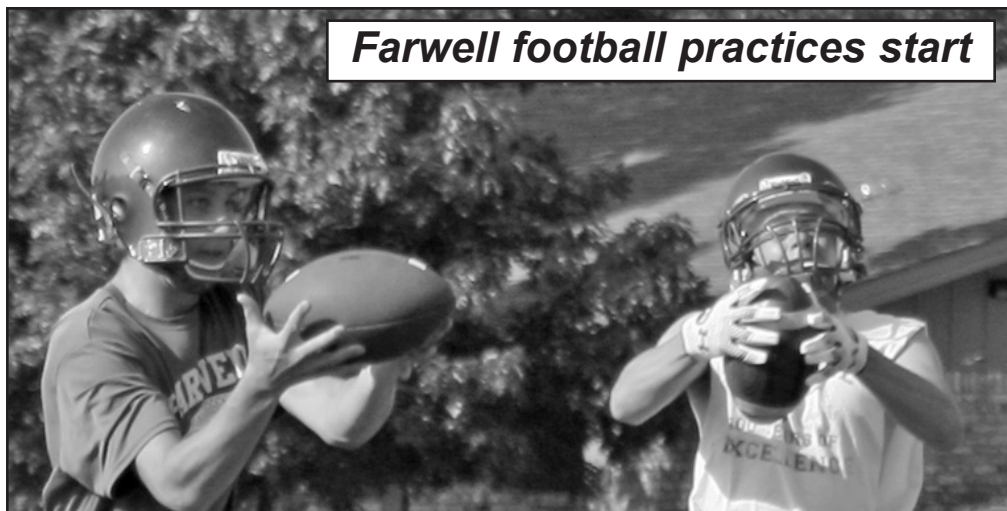

Farwell School proposes slightly-lower tax rate

The Farwell School Board proposed to reduce the tax rate for the coming school year on Tuesday night.

The tax rate is proposed at \$1.0932, down from \$1.1031. The proposed budget is \$5,186,364, which is around \$290,000 higher than the current budget.

Farwell finished the last school year with an average daily attendance (ADA) of 501. Most state funds funneled to schools are based on ADA. The previous year's ADA was 459.

In other business, the board:

- Heard that all three school campuses were qualified as 'recognized' based on TAKS scores from last year. The overall rating for the school was 'academically acceptable.'
- Approved changes to the student handbook. Students must be enrolled at Farwell for 4 semesters in order to be eligible for Mr. and Mrs. FHS.
- Changed Junior High and High School policy to ban hats and caps during school hours and set guidelines for attire during prom and graduation.
- Hired Sandy Fuentes as the new Elementary School English as a Second Language teacher.
- School starts on Aug. 24.

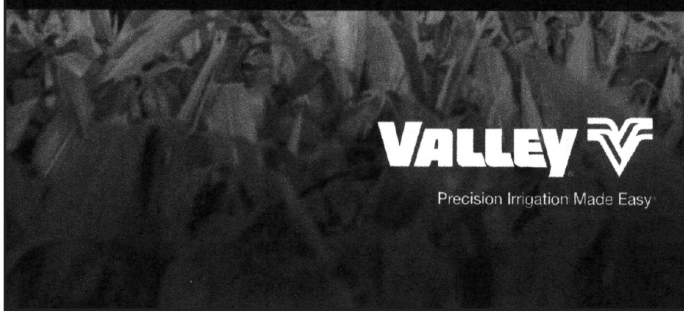

Keegan attends Catholic youth conference

That is only one word describing Tuscon, Ariz.

I drove 12 long hours to Arizona for a Catholic youth conference on July 23-27 with my youth group called Steubenville West.

This event is held for teens around the U.S. to grow together in their faith journey and come closer to Christ.

The trip began with an early start with mass at 7 Thursday morning. We then loaded up the charter bus and headed out, with cinnamon rolls and orange juice in our hands.

Two things all teenagers require on long bus rides are food and sleep. Though, on the way up, it's mostly just food.

My sister, Kristin, and I both decided on a necessary snack, goldfish.

These weren't just any plain old goldfish; they were rainbow colored goldfish that came in a huge gallon sized carton. I sure loved those goldfish.

The sleeping part doesn't really work out due to that fact that crazy boys decide to pester, poke, and yell when everyone else on the bus even attempts to shut their eyes.

For example, while a friend and I were calmly relaxing and trying to take a short nap, another friend (a guy, of course) decided he was going to just lay on top of us.

This was not a small guy, folks, I thought my legs were about to fall off, and when he finally decided he was done torturing us, my other friend let out a lovely war-call type yell sound.

When teenagers are stuck in a bus for a long period of time, they are going to have to use the restroom. Charter buses have restrooms, but ... I would advise all folks to steer clear of bus restrooms if at all possible.

In the case that the restroom is absolutely needed, resort to pouring Downy fabric softener into the toilet to aid the odor. It helps!

After our long drive, we finally arrived at our hotel, where we all immediately changed into our swimming suits and jumped into the pool. The temperature that evening was around 97, which is cool for this time of year.

Arizona's time is 2 hours behind Texas, which can throw a person off. For example, Friday morning, I woke up to discover the sun streaming through our window at 5:30 a.m. For those of you who don't know, teenagers do not get up at 5:30 unless we absolutely have to.

Because I'm used to waking up at 7:30 for work, I couldn't go back to sleep which made for a long day ahead.

After breakfast, we headed down to the mall to kill some time and then made our way to the campus of the University of Arizona.

This is where the conference was held, and most teens were housed in dorms.

The dorms were an experience in themselves. The first thing we discovered was the air conditioning vent was located in the middle of the room on the very top of the wall.

Because of this, the beds, which were against the walls on the side, received no ventilation whatsoever. At this time of day, it was probably around 105 degrees outside. My roommate and I came up with the clever idea of pushing our beds right smack dab in the center of the room.

Our room looked like one big maze with suitcases and beds and food, but it was worth it.

We next found our bathroom. Key word is bathroom, not bathrooms. There were approximately 18 girls in one hallway, and we all shared one bathroom.

This bathroom only had two showers; you can imagine how long it took for 18 girls to take showers.

These facilities weren't the best quality, but hey, it's better than sleeping outside where it's 90 degrees at midnight.

The conference began Friday night around 7:00 with the opening ceremony. I will describe how this works.

There are about 3,000 teens from around the U.S. waiting at the doors of the auditorium to open. We were split up into four different colors, which were marked by wristbands that we wore at all times.

When the doors opened, people went crazy. It is basically a mosh pit. People push and shove and run to claim a good seat.

The auditorium was split into sections by colored flags, each group ran over to the section where their color was and the rule is: If two people are on each end, the entire row is saved.

Thankfully, my group had some fast runners and we ended up on the front four rows the first night, which was amazing.

Our emcee for the weekend was a man called Righteous B. He is a Christian rapper with an amazing heart and had great communication with teens. That Friday night, he came out and rapped for us, and the song he sang was the "Fresh Prince of Bel Air."

Then our singer/band for the weekend was introduced, and it was Matt Maher. We were in full out "jam" mode when he came on stage.

Right off, I knew we were in for a great time. There's just something incredible about 3,000 teenagers singing and praising God with all their hearts at one time.

The conference had many different and unique elements that allowed each person to grow spiritually.

"Time flies when you're having fun" was a very true statement that weekend. Before we knew it, Sunday arrived and the conference was coming to a

close.

That night, my group traveled to Mesa, Ariz., where we attended mass at St. Timothy's Church.

We stayed at a hotel and crammed into an extremely small outdoor pool that night. Since it was the last night, sleep was minimal and waking up at 5:30 a.m. to drive home was not an easy task.

This was the "sleep" part of the bus ride. Our entire bus looked comatose for about the first three hours of the drive. People were laying on top, across, and under each other.

The drive home was a lot longer than the one up there. After getting the required amount of sleep, we then became extremely stir crazy. There were people jumping on top of each other, piling into one seat, yelling, singing, and taking goofy pictures.

We stopped at a random truck stop in the middle of the desert to get gas and lunch. One friend spotted some of the biggest, scariest crows I have ever seen in my entire life. They looked evil, and my friend threatened everyone that if they got too close, they'd get their eyes pecked out.

The long drive finally ended, and we were back in the church parking lot at Nazareth. We all had an amazing time, and I'm now closer to my youth group than I ever was before. This was an unforgettable summer experience, and I can't wait to go again next year.

The weekend was extremely fun and was over way too fast. This conference allowed my youth group to become more than just a group; it allowed them to become my family. We cried together, laughed together, sang together, and acted crazy together.

We learned about each other in new ways, and experienced the love of each other and God.

Next time, we're going to St. Louis. Hopefully it won't be hot, hot, hot there. If anything is hot, it'll be my brothers and sisters in Christ because we're on fire for God.
