Farwell gas rate set for large increase

Farwell will soon be receiving a hefty increase in its gas rates, the Farwell City Council learned on Tuesday. Farwell has participated with more than 20 other Texas communities in reaching a settlement with West Texas Gas.

The group's attorney said West Texas Gas had asked for a \$2.1 million revenue increase, but settled for \$1.1


But because Farwell's rate was lower than the average for the West Texas Gas system, Farwell will get a 17.21 percent rate hike, probably in December (the state Railroad Commission still must ratify the settlement).

Morton defeated the Farwell 7th graders, 42-6, last


Colton Christian continues to play well on defense, recording 8 tackles.

Tractor rollbar saves life of Ag Department staff member

Are you still putting off installing a tractor rollbar? Well, don't.

A local man was saved from injury and possible death by a rollbar that prevented his tractor from rolling on top of him in an accident Monday.

Make sure your story has a happy ending

Follow these rules for all-around farm safety:

- Install a Rollover Protective Structure (ROPS) on your tractor, and wear your seat belt
- Never bypass start the engine of your self-propelled equipment
 Carry a fully-paged 10 IA ARC rated fire extinguisher near the front and
- Carry a fully-charged 10 lb. ABC-rated fire extinguisher near the front and rear of your combine
- When transporting bales, only use approved attachments
- Keep PTO and driveline shields in place at all times
 Never allow riders, except for training or machine diagrams.
- Never allow riders, except for training or machine diagnostics
 Use headlights, flashing warning lights, and turn signals when transporting equipment
- When mowing, wear close-fitting clothes and appropriate safety equipment
- Restrict access to areas which pose risk for electrical shock
 Always relieve the pressure before disconnecting hydraulic boses.
- Always relieve the pressure before disconnecting hydraulic hoses or other lines
 Carefully read and follow chemical labels
- Always turn off the engine before refueling
 Standard and results always turn off the engine before refueling
- Stay calm and move slowly when working around farm animals





LIVE CATTLE: The market had high hopes of seeing cash trade between \$85-86 this week but a sharp drop on the board on Friday morning makes it look like cash may trade between \$83-84? Cattle on Feed report due out later today is expected to show Cattle on Feed at 103%. Placements at 93.7% and Marketing's at 90.9%. Long term, there may be a major low in place, but it will take another leg down to test last week's low before confirmation

FEEDER CATTLE: Prices have seen a substantial improvement since last Friday but prices also came under pressure today with anticipated lower fed cattle prices. Overall, long term charts may have seen a bottom, but it will take a re-test of those lows in order to confirm a bottom?

<u>CORN</u>: The market has continued to move lower over the last few days. News of improving weather throughout the Midwest stimulated selling pressure. Long term weekly charts still show support around the \$2.15 area. Estimates still vary as far as production is concerned, but the market has basically priced in an all time record 11 billion bushel crop at those levels.

SOYBEANS: The market has found some support around the \$5.55 level basis the November contract, but estimates are still increasing as to this year's production. Each new report which increases world stocks has had a negative impact on prices. Odds are good that if these lows hold, prices may see a bounce back up for awhile, but overall, market remains under pressure.

<u>WHEAT</u>: This market is struggling to move above the \$3.40 level basis the December Chicago Wheat. Prices rallied on news that quality and production problems are showing up after an early freeze in many parts of Canada. There have been more short leaving the market than new buyers coming in at this time. A close above \$3.40 may give prices a 20 cent push to the upside.

COTTON: Prices have reacted little to the last hurricane Ivan which came through the Southeastern U.S. this week. Many analysts believe that world production is still negative for prices when looking at the big picture. China is expected to only import around 800,000 bales this year, versus over 2 million bales last year. Prices need to hold above \$47.50 if there's a chance for higher prices.

Texico smashes Clayton

The Texico Wolverines continued their winning streak, extending it to 15, after defeating the Clayton Yellowjackets 47-7 last Friday night at home.

They feasted on the Yellowjackets, scoring 47 unanswered points before allowing Clayton to score with 2:27 to go. It was the first time the Texico defense has allowed any points scored on them this year and the first rushing TD since the state championship game in the 2002 season. The Wolverines have outscored their opponents 141–7.

The Wolverine offense was able to move the ball on the ground, as expected, rushing for 351 yards. Johnny Serrano scored two rushing TDs (44 yards, 1 yard) and sophomore Justin Garrison scored one (41 yards). But, surprisingly the Wolverines, not known for throwing the ball, scored 4 TDs in the air with QB Braden Vaughan connecting three times with Tony Clements and once with Chris Phillips. Vaughan went 4 of 5 for 106 yards

As always, the Texico defense played tough and even though they allowed Clayton to move the ball at times, they seemed to find a way to stop their momentum when they had to. The Wolverine defense is improving each week as the 8 new starters get more playing time under their belts.

Clayton took the opening kickoff and had to punt after two runs for no gain and an incomplete pass. Texico wasted no time when Vaughan ran for 17 yards on the first play, setting up a 44-yard TD run by Serrano

The Wolverines moved the ball quickly down the field on offense again with runs of 30 yards by Phillips and 25 yards by Vaughan setting up a 1-yard TD run by Serrano. A pass from Vaughan to Clements for the twopoint conversion made the score 14-0.

The Yellowjackets fumbled the ball after linebacker Logan Brown put a big hit on the running back. Brown recovered the ball on the Clayton 25 yard line. Vaughan found Clements alone in the end zone on the next play and Brown kicked the extra point making the score 21-0 with 3:07 to go in the 1st quarter.

The Yellowjackets moved the ball to the Texico 39 before they ran out of downs. Seven plays later, Texico scored again on a pass from Vaughan to Clements of 25 yards highlighted by a 31-yard run by Serrano. The Brown kick was good and the score was 28-0.

Clayton moved the ball out to midfield on a couple of big runs, but Clements intercepted a hurried pass and returned it 19 yards to near midfield. In 5 plays, the Wolverines were on the scoreboard again when Vaughan hit Phillips for a 20-yard TD.

Texico came out in the 2nd half and moved the ball rapidly. On 3rd and 15, Vaughan connected with Clements on a 36-yard TD pass. Brown made the extra point and the score was 41-0.

Clayton managed to move the ball to the Texico 12 vard line but good tackles by Aaron Vaughan, Michael Johnson, Blake Smith, and a tackle for a 3 yard loss by Brown gave the Wolverines the ball on downs.






