## U.I.L. realigns sports districts

Every two years, the Texas UIL realigns high schools into different classes and districts. On Feb. 2, they announced their changes, and here's how it affects our area schools.

The football district for Bovina and Farwell remains the same as it has been, with Nazareth, Sudan, Hart and Springlake-Earth.

But the basketball district has changed. In one district with Farwell and Bovina are Springlake-Earth, Hale Center, Olton and Sudan.

The districts for Lazbuddie have changed dramatically.

In football, Lazbuddie has been placed with Groom, McLean, Samnorwood and Matador (Motley County).

In basketball, Lazbuddie's district includes Happy, Hart, Kress and Nazareth.

Friona will be in a district with Muleshoe, Amarillo Highland Park, Amarillo River Road, Bushland, Tulia and Dimmitt. Muleshoe has moved down from Class 3A to 2A.

Under the new UIL format, the top three teams in the Farwell and Bovina districts will move into the basketball and football state playoffs.

But since the UIL sliced up the smaller school districts into two classes (of which Lazbuddie is a member), only the top two teams in these districts will qualify for the state playoffs.

## Bass wins national contest for 2nd consecutive year

Chris Bass of West Camp, placed first nationally in the conventional till, irrigated category of the 2005 national Sorghum Producers Yield and Management contest. It was his second year in a row!

He will be honored at the North American Grain Congress, the joint conference of the National Sorghum Producers (NSP) and the National Association of Wheat Growers (NAWG), in San Antonio Feb. 4-8.

Bass' contest plot yielded 10,762 pounds per acre, out-yielding the 5-year Bailey County average by 7,161 pounds.

Bass said that his planting rate depends on available water. On the contest plot, he used a planting rate of 42,000 seeds per acre. Bass says

that he spaces the seed precisely and is "planting less and less population with any crop."

Because of a hail-storm, Bass said he opted for conventional tillage on the contest plot, which was previously planted to cotton. Based on a soil test, he applied 100 pounds of nitrogen.

Bass said it was an average year for moisture.

"Our average is about 18 inches. It wasn't the 40 inches from the year before, although I'd like to see some of that now." Bass said that keeping the field wet was a challenge. "We went six weeks without any additional moisture besides irrigation. But, if we get behind on water or have pump problems, sorghum is a lot more durable than corn." He applied 11 inches of

water by sprinkler.

Bass said that input costs for sorghum are lower in comparison to other crops. "Sorghum is more stable, more reliable than other high-risk crops. But as far as pumping cost, diesel fuel, and labor,

# Border Banter

## On oil

I received an e-mail from my best friend Dennis a couple of weeks ago that I wanted to share with you.

I thought his comments were very mind provoking. Consider how what he writes will affect you down the road.

Here's what he wrote:

This morning, you may have caught the quote from the Saudi oil minister. To paraphrase, he said, "We have no control over the price of oil."

If you have studied oil history, politics, and policies in the Middle East, you know that Saudi Arabia has been the moderating force in the world price of oil. They were able to do this because they have had the largest oil deposits and the sparest capacity.

This means that they could easily increase oil output by simply opening the wellhead valves and putting more raw crude in the system. They also had excess pipeline and refinery capacity. For whatever combinations of reasons, they were willing and able to act as a moderating force in a very volatile industry. The quote this morning signals a change in their willingness or abil-

ity or both to act as this moderating force.

Since the late 1990's the output of the Saudi oil deposits has been a secret. There is some evidence to put this output near 8 million barrels per day. The energy markets have had a kind of nirvana situation where disruptions in price could be discounted because the Saudis find it in their interest to intervene to keep the markets stable.

They have increased production up to a bit over 10 million barrels per day for short periods of time. Well, there comes a time to pay the piper. Basically, the Saudis have been pumping 4 super giant oil fields that are all very mature fields.

There is some perfect or optimal rate of depletion that will enable the most efficient and cost effective rate of pumping which is specific to each field. Today's quote is tacit admission that the Saudis cannot simply open the wellhead valves to increase production.

Technically, when you simply open the valves, you lose pressure. You then must pump more water into the field to increase the pressure which also increases the gas cap pressure which makes it more difficult to extract oil. It is becoming apparent to those who study this sort of thing that the Saudis have not operated their super gigantic fields in the most efficient manner and that they are having very serious problems maintaining

their present output.

It is costing more and more to extract oil. The quality of oil is degrading. More and more water is coming up with the oil. Actually at present, more water is being produced than oil because they are pumping about 10 million barrels of sea water into the wells each day.

There are no new super giant oil fields identified or found in the Saudi Arabian desert. The best guess is that Saudi oil production has peaked. Today's quote seems to be an admission of that fact.

The social and political consequences of declining or even stable oil production are enormous.

There has been a general belief that the Saudi oil fields have plenty of reserves and that there is more to be found. Saudi Arabia has allowed that thought to exist and has

enforced those ideas with its actions.

The sad truth is that of an estimated 100 oil fields, only 4 account for over 80 percent of production. The last giant oil field, Shaybah, came on line in 1998. It was the 28th field discovered. None of the 72 fields discovered after Shaybah are classified as

"Super Giant."

If, as it appears that Saudi oil production has peaked and our quote from this morning is correct, there will no longer be a moderating force in world oil pricing.

bonds, etc.? Do this for a determined set years to build up the dollar base.

"I am of the opinion the BEDC needs to have someone working as a part-time representative to be successful in developing the economic status in Bovina. But until the BEDC has more funds available, growth will be inhibited.

"Even though the city has made progress in the past several years, the BEDC board may want to consider investing tax revenue dollars for growing the tax dollar base. To do so, will require volunteers for coordinating city projects, or have the BEDC board coordinate the city's economic development."

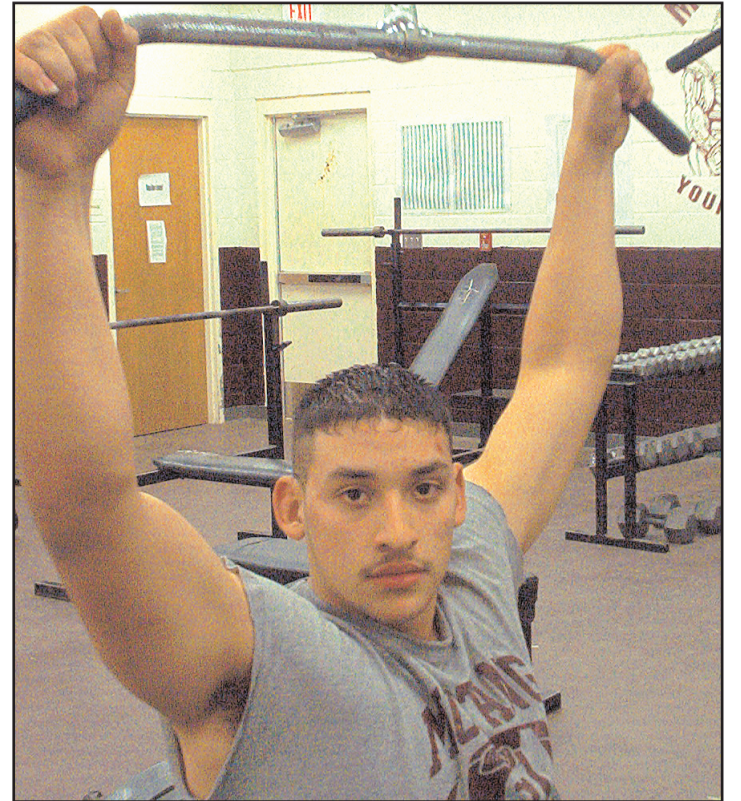

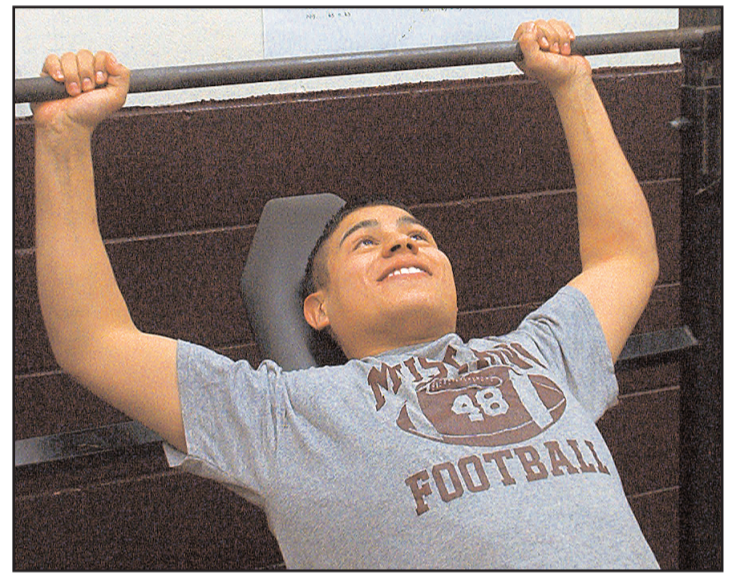
