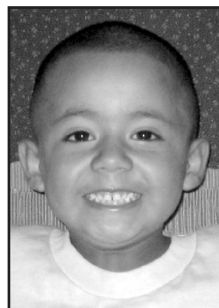

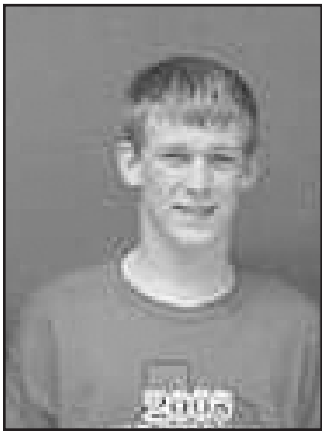
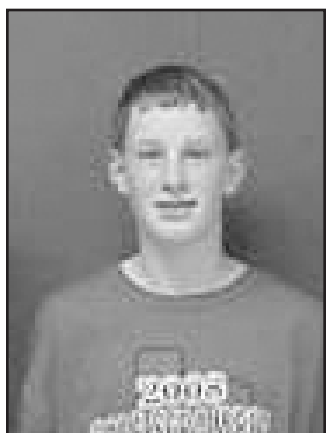

'50's calf roping stories needed

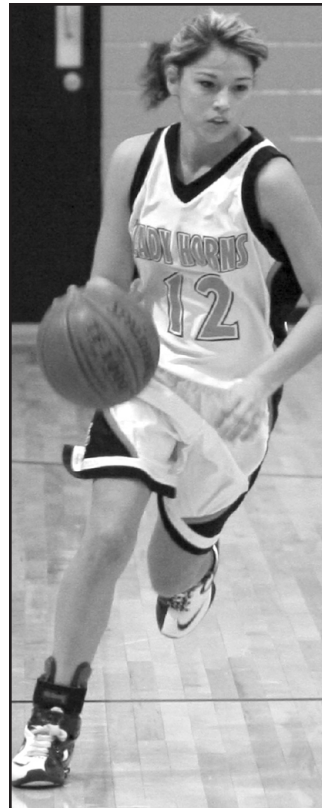
Back in the 1950's, Clovis hosted a good number of calf ropings and matches, drawing some of the biggest calf ropers in the country.

Farwell police chief resigns

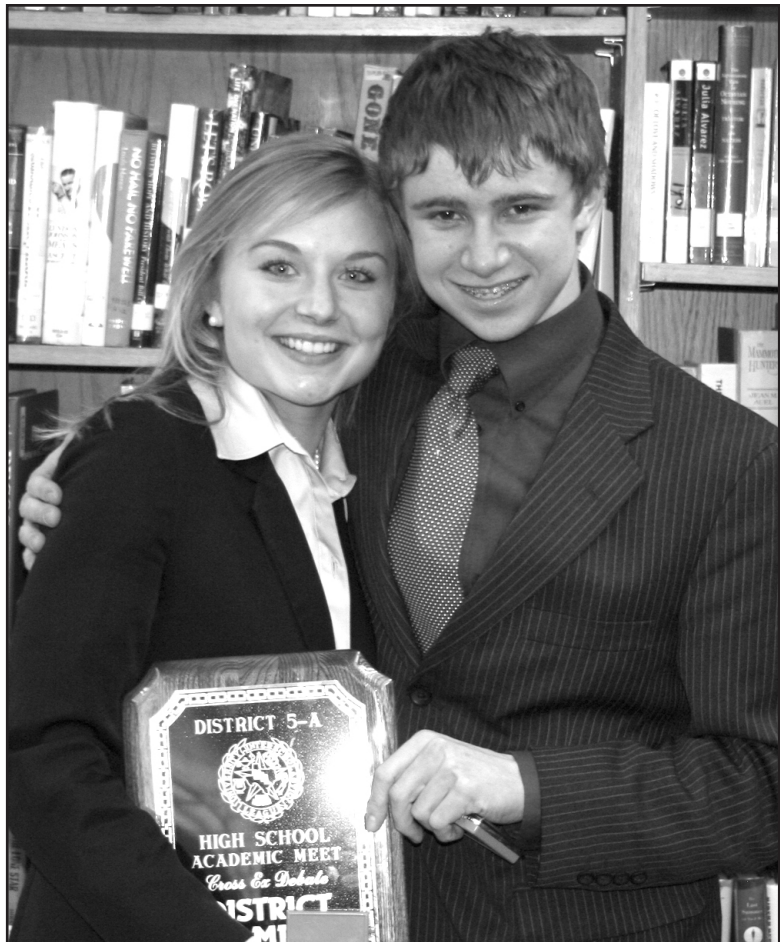
Farwell Police Chief Scott Burton has resigned, effective March 1.

In his resignation letter, he said he plans to go to work for another company which has a current opening.

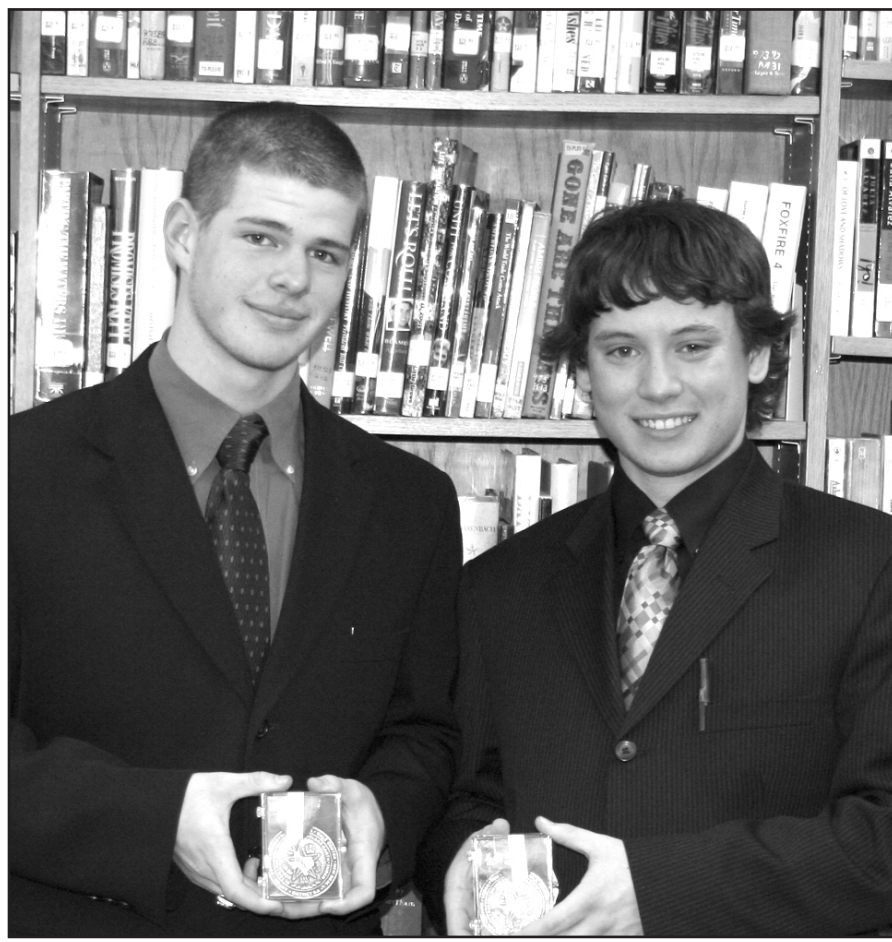
He was hired as police chief in September 2006.

PROPOSED AIR QUALITY REGISTRATION NO. 55567L007

APPLICATION SRJ DEVELOPMENT I, LTD., has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for an Air Quality Standard Permit, Registration No. 55567L007, which would authorize construction of a Concrete Batch Plant located 0.5 miles east of the intersection of County Road X and County Road 7, said intersection is 2.0 miles north of the intersection of County Road 7 and FM 145 which is 6.0 miles east of Farwell, Parmer County, Texas. The proposed facility will emit the following air contaminants: particulate matter including (but not limited to) aggregate, cement, road dust and particulate matter less than 10 microns in diameter.

This application was submitted to the TCEQ on January 28, 2008. The application is available for viewing and copying at the TCEQ central office, the TCEQ Amarillo regional office, and the Parmer County Courthouse, County Clerks Office, 401 3rd Street, Farwell, Parmer County, Texas. The facility's compliance file, if any exists, is available for public review in the Amarillo regional office of the TCEQ.

The TCEQ executive director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application.

PUBLIC COMMENT/PUBLIC MEETING You may submit public comments, a request for a public meeting, or request a contested case hearing to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below. The TCEQ will consider all public comments in developing a final decision on the application. **The deadline to submit public comments is 15 days after newspaper notice is published.**

The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or ask questions about the application. A public meeting about the application will be held if the executive director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

If only comments are received on the application, the response to comments, along with notice of the executive director's action on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted comments or is on the mailing list for this application.

If a hearing request is timely filed, the executive director will complete the technical review, issue a preliminary decision on the application, and a Notice of the Application and Preliminary Decision will be published and mailed to those who are on the mailing list for this application. That notice will contain the final deadline for submitting public comments.

After the final deadline for public comments following any required Notice of Application and Preliminary Decision, the executive director will consider the comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. If any comments are received, the response to comments, along with the executive director's decision on the application, will then be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments or who is on a mailing list for this application.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING

You may request a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court. Unless a written request for a contested case hearing is filed within 15 days from this notice, the executive director may approve the application. **If no hearing request is received within this 15-day period, no further opportunity for hearing will be provided.** A contested case hearing will only be granted based on disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material to the Commission's decision on the application. Further, the Commission will only grant a hearing on those issues raised during the public comment period and not withdrawn.

A person who may be affected by emissions of air contaminants from the facility is entitled to request a hearing. To request a hearing, a person must actually reside in a permanent residence within 440 yards of the proposed plant. If requesting a contested case hearing, you must submit the following: (1) your name (or for a group or association, an official representative), mailing address, daytime phone number, and fax number, if any; (2) applicant's name and Registration Number; (3) the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing;" (4) a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the application and air emissions from the facility in a way not common to the general public; (5) the location and distance of your property relative to the facility; and (6) a description of how you use the property which may be impacted by the facility. If the request is made by a group or association, the one or more members who have standing to request a hearing, and the interests which the group or association seek to protect, must also be identified. Requests for a contested case hearing must be submitted in writing within 15 days following this notice to the Office of the Chief Clerk, at the address below.

If a hearing request is timely filed, additional notice will be provided. Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the executive director will forward the application and any requests for contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting. **If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact relating to relevant and material air quality concerns raised during the comment period.** Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the Commission's jurisdiction to address in this proceeding.

LIVE CATTLE: Cattle prices have continued to move up into new contract highs last week when looking at the back months, but the nearby April contract has remained under pressure and has struggled to move above major resistance levels around \$96.30. Technically, until the April contract can close above this level, long term trends will remain in question.

FEEDER CATTLE: Feeder prices have remained inside a tight range for almost two weeks while waiting on news to give prices some direction. Higher Live Cattle prices have helped to offset some of the advances seen in the soybeans and corn prices. Cash seemed to soften up a little last week mostly on concerns of higher corn prices. Support is \$106 basis the nearby April contract.

CORN: Corn prices were able to break out to new highs last week with prices now projecting to test the \$5.70-5.80 level basis the May contract. There were several announcements last week to cancel plans to build some fairly large ethanol plants and some bankruptcies, but this had very little impact on corn prices. Markets have reached levels which are now negatively impacting major industries such as livestock, dairy and energy.

SOYBEANS: Soybeans have also continued to work highs while making new contract highs along the way. South American harvest pressure was expected to place some pressure on prices, but rumors of Chinese demand has helped to step up the price. Pick a number for a high?

WHEAT: Wheat prices experienced some major blow-outs last week which could have placed a top in the market. The extreme volatility seen will normally indicate that prices are close to a top, but prices should move back up into last weeks range and either signal weakness or more strength. It would probably take another blow-out along last weeks scale in order to push the July KC Wheat up into last weeks high around the \$13.20 level?

COTTON: Cotton prices have gained some support from a higher grain complex and the market has now moved up above all major resistance levels. Expect to see prices continue to move higher alongside the grains. There has been little fundamental news to support this rally, but competition for acres seems to be a good enough reason to push the market higher.

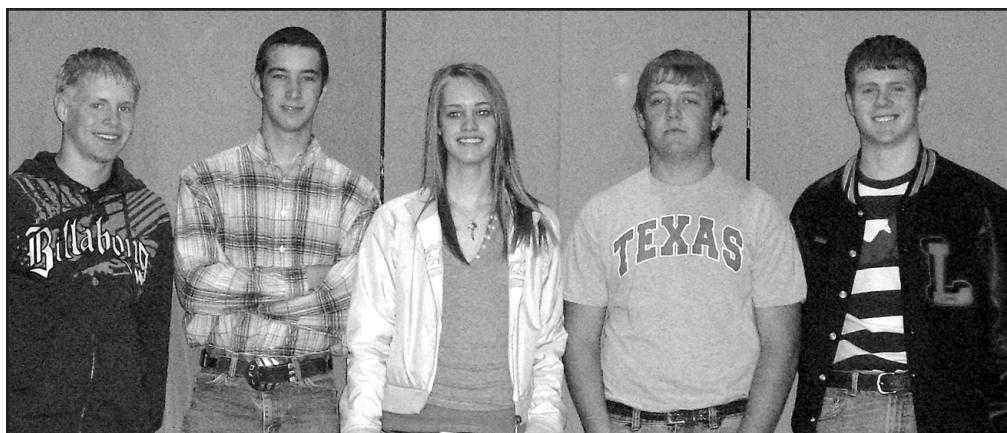

Clinton carries Parmer County

The big news in Texas' elections on Tuesday was that Hillary Clinton beat back Barack Obama in the Democrat primary for President.

Parmer County followed that trend, with Clinton getting 367 votes and Obama 248.

Seventeen Parmer County residents voted for folks who had stopped being candidates: Bill Richardson, 5; John Edwards, 8; Chris Dodd, 1, and Joe Biden, 2.

On the Republican side, John McCain already had the votes to win the GOP Presidential primary. In fact, after Tuesday's vote, the challenger, Mike Huckabee, dropped out of the race.

In Parmer County, McCain got 395 votes and Huckabee got 386.

Ron Paul got 9.

Twenty-three Parmer County residents voted for non-candidates: Fred Thompson, 5; Mitt Romney, 7; Duncan Hunter, 2; Rudy Giuliani, 1; Hugh Cort, 3; and Alan Keyes, 5.

On the statewide referendum for controlling government growth, Parmer County voted 612 yes and 62 no. On the immigration referendum, Parmer County voted 682 yes and 20 no. On the photo ID referendum, Parmer County voted 651 yes and 53 no.
