## An understatement: area needs a lot more rain

From Monti Vandiver, Parmer County **Extension Agent-IPM** 

To say the area needs a good soaking rain would be an understatement but for many wheat producers that concern has been superseded by potential freeze damage their crop may have sustained as a result of unseasonably cold weather the last week of March.

Symptoms of freeze injury to area wheat has ranged from light to severe with most surveyed fields falling into the moderate to heavy category. Local weather stations recorded temperatures as low as 23 degrees F for the high and 14 degrees F for the low over a 24 hour period.

-- Kelsay said he solved two of three burglaries recently, and all three thefts that were reported.


-- Heard Mayor Jimmie Mace report that he and councilman Mitch Walls have visited other communities' dog pounds and a report will be made later.

-- Kelsay said he solved two of three burglaries recently, and all three thefts that were reported.


-- Heard Mayor Jimmie Mace report that he and councilman Mitch Walls have visited other communities' dog pounds and a report will be made later.
