## ENMR awarded grant

ENMR•Plateau was awarded an $\$ 11.2$ million grant from the Department of American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. It will help to fund a $\$ 16$ million project to install high capacity broadband equipment on 1,600 miles of existing fiber that reaches into central and eastern New Mexico and west Texas. Also, ENMR•Plateau is completing a multi-year, multi-million dollar project to enable higher speed broadband servic es for rural mea
its serving area

This project, which included cojstruction of 900 miles of new fiber 900 miles of new fiber, end of 2010 and will enable DSL speeds up to 20 Mbps, depending on distance from equipment and line conditions.

## Ordinance No. 150

An ordinance revising Ordinance No. 1240, regulating the keeping of dogs and/or cats he City of Farwell, Texas; providing for the number of animals a person may keep; providin or the registration of animals; providing for a pound; providing for the position of Anima Control officer; providing it unlawful for any person who owns or controls an animal to permit
such animal to run at large; providing for the redemption of dogs and/or cats and the dispos lt thereof if not redeemed; providing for quarantine and testing of animals having rabies; and providing a penalty for the violation of this ordinance.
Section 1: Definitions
"Dog" or "puppy" shall be intended to mean both male and female of the canine
family.
B. "Cat" or kitten" shall be intended to mean both male and female of the feline family. "Vicious or Dangerous Animal" means:
capable of inflicting serious physical harm or death to human beings and would ponstity
danger to human life or property. (2) Any animal which has behaved in such a manner that the owner thereo
( $)$. knows or should reasonably know th
bite human beings or other animals;
bite human beings or other animals,
(3) Any animal certified by a doctor of veterinary medicine, after observation hereof, as posing a danger to human life, animal life or property upon the basis of a reasonable medical probability
(4) Any animal that commits an unprovoked attack on a p
public or private property; or
(5) Any animal that attacks or threatens to attack a person

"Wild animal" means any mammal, save and except the common domestic species (dogs, cats, horses, cattle, swine, sheep, and goats) and any amphibian, reptile, or fowl which is not naturally tame or gentle but is of a wild nature or disposition and which, because of its size, vicious nature or other characteristics, would constitute a danger to human life or prop erty including, but not limited to, lions, tigers, leopards, panthers, bears, wolves, alligators ocodiles, bobcats
E. "Onimal.
F. "Animal Control Officer" means the person, designated by the City of Farwell to rep resent and act for the city in the impoundment of animals, controlling of animals running a
large, and as otherwise provided and required in this chapter.

"Running at Large" means
hain of sufficient strength ises: (a) any dog which is not restrained by means of a leash of such animal while off premises; (b) any cat which is off the owner's property.
(2) On premises: any dog not confined on the premises of owner by a substan fial fence of sufficient strength and height to prevent the animal from escaping therefrom. A dog intruding upon the property of another person other than the owner shall be termed "a large." Any animal within an automobile or other vehicle of its owner or owner's agent sha ot be deemed "at large." The term shall not include any animal while under the immediate diate compliance with all vocal commands of the person.

At such time as a dog has been declared "vicious," the owner will be given three (3) days obtain the required structure and during this period the animal must be kept indoors or conained in an enclosed area sufficient to hold the animal (deemed adequate by animal contro or law enforcement).
Section 2: Num
A resident of the cer of animals that may be kept and registration:- (dogs and/or cats) over the age of four months; nor 10 puppies or 10 kittens under the age of 4 month unless they operate a licensed kennel, cattery or veterinarian facility. All animals kept within such registration. A one time $\$ 10$ fee shall apply to each animal so registered. Any anima fund within the city limits without such registration tag shall be impounded and the owne thereof shall be subject to a fee of $\$ 30.00$. All animals already kept within the city limits shal have until Sept. 1, 2010, to be registered
Section 3: Notice to Owner and Redemption:
Not later than two (2) days after the impounding of a dog and/or cat, the owner shall be otified, or, if the owner of the animal is unknown, written notice shall be posted for three (3) days at a conspicuous place at the city hall in Farvell, Texas, describing the animal and the animal upon the payment of a fee of $\$ 30.00$ for the initial occurrence. If the animal is impound ed a second time, the fee will be $\$ 60.00$. If the animal is impounded a third time, the fee wil be $\$ 120.00$. If the animal is impounded a fourth time, the animal shall be euthanized at the expense of the owner. Additionally, the owner will be responsible for all costs and charge ncurred by the City of Farwell for impounding and maintaining such animal plus all costs ood, shelter and handling
(a) Any currently vaccinated animal which has been impounded may be reclaimed by o for its owner upon payment of all fees
(b) Any impounded unvaccinated animal may be reclaimed by or for its owner upon pay路
Section 8: Dangerous and vicious animals and violations of this ordinance: (a) Complaint: Should any person, including employees of the City of Farwell, desire file a complaint concerning an animal which is believed to be a vicious or dangerous anima or an animal which is in violation of any portion of must be filed with the City of Farwell, as follows:
