





LIVE CATTLE: Live Cattle prices fell apart late last week once cash cattle traded at \$83 up north. Most all support levels were also taken out which attracted a ton amount of selling pressure. The market was able to trade back down to test the October lows before turning back up on Friday. The cattle market has remained on of the weakest markets all year. Cash prices at \$88 did very little to support a strong rally.

FEEDER CATTLE: Prices also remain weak while following the Live Cattle market down. Selling pressure was also quick late last week and the market was able to penetrate their October lows. The market tried to turn back higher to some degree on Friday, but all eyes will remain on the next move in the Live Cattle price. Higher corn prices have played a much smaller role, but has also had some impact.

CORN: Prices turned their short term trends down round mid week, but did little to confirm a change in direction on Friday. The market has had a strong tendency to trade higher on Sunday nights. Monday may help to shed some light on the next direction? Harvest has progressed, but not to the degree weive seen bean harvest improve. Resistance should come in around \$4.03 and support at \$3.82 basis the December.

SOYBEANS: Soybean prices rallied for the duration last week, but were unable to take out any major resistance levels. Harvest did see some progress as weather improved considerably. Prices continue to trade inside a down trending channel with prices now trading in the top end of this channel.

WHEAT: Prices were unable to break out to new highs on the week and closed fairly strong on Friday. This should be some fairly strong resistance, but a close above these levels would project a test of the highs made several weeks ago around the \$5.75 level basis the December KC contract. Wheat has been surprisingly strong compared to the rest of the grain complex. World stocks are still large and demand has remained weak. The market is fundamentally out of sink, but trends remain higher for the time being.

COTTON: Prices were able to reach one of their targets on the upside last week around the \$70.60 level basis the December contract. For the most part, the market continues to trade in a sideways range which began back in early October. Resistance levels are around \$70.60 with support at \$66.00. A break out of either of these levels should lead to another leg in that direction. Domestic supplies are expected to remain

The Municipal Clerk will accept completed absentee ballots delivered by mail, or in person by the voter casting the absentee ballot or by a member of the voter's immediate family, or the caregiver of the voter until 7:00 p.m. on March 2, 2010.

Absentee ballots may be marked in person in the office of the Municipal Clerk during the regular business hours and days of business, beginning on Tuesday, January 26, and closing at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, February 26, 2010.





Wellington tops Bovina

The Bovina Mustangs lost to the Wellington Rockets in the Bi-District game, 63-27, at Canyon on Nov. 12.

Wellington, one of the top-rated teams in Texas, controlled most of the game, but the Mustangs got in some shots in as well.

Bovina received the opening kick off and things looked good as Frankie Guevara converted a 4th down with a run up the middle. Andrew Marrufo also caught a pass, but the drive stalled and Bovina punt-

On defense, Guevara had a big hit on the Rocket QB, and things looked great when an illegal block penalty pinned the Rockets with a long 3rd down. Rodrigo Zapata then caught the QB behind the line of scrimmage and brought up 4th down.

Wellington went for it and scored. The Rockets tried to kick an extra point, but fumbled the ball and Ricardo DeLaRosa recovered it.

Later in the quarter, Desmond Fox and Dorian Vela knocked down a deep Wellington pass on defense.

In the second quarter, Daniel Rivera hit a 65-yard punt that was almost stopped inside the one yard

The defense bottled up Wellington and forced them to make another 4th down play.

Fox and Guevara had runs for first downs at the end of the half, and with less than 30 seconds left in the half, DeLaRosa caught a 35 yard pass, and was horse collared to the ground, a penalty which brought an extra 15 yards. On the following drive, Guevara had a 15 yard run, leading to Fox breaking out for 40 yards and a TD. Riveia kicked the extra point.

Wellington got the ball back and Bovina's defense stopped them. The drive ended when Marrufo recovered a fumble on the 18 yard line.

Dorian Vela hit a 17 yard pass to DeLaRosa for a TD, bringing the score to 47-14.

As the Rockets tried to drive again, Fernando Banuelos stripped the ball from a running back and Matt Knoll jumped on the fumble, but a referee gave the ball back to Wellington, saying the runner was down. After scoring, the Rockets went for a 2-point conversion.

The Mustangs finished the 3rd quarter as Vela connected with DeLaRosa for a 36 yard pass and Fox had a 15 yard run in traffic.

Marrufo caught a pass on the 9 yard line to start the 4th quarter, and Guevara took the ball in from the 4 to narrow the margin to 55-20.

On the next Rocket drive, Ronaldo Garcia caused a fumble and Fox picked it up and out ran Wellington for a 78 yard TD.


