Dairy heifer show added to county stock show

For the first time ever, a dairy heifer show will be part of the Parmer County Junior Livestock Show in January.

The dairy heifer show will start at 6 p.m. on Jan. 14. Complete details are available from school ag teachers or the county extension agent. Rules include:

-- The show is open to any dairy breed or cross-

breed. Ownership deadline is Nov. 1.

-- All heifers must be calfhooed vaccinated against brucellosis. All Texas animal health commission rules must be followed.

-- Class sizes will be determined a the superintendent's discretion.

-- General show rules apply; entry fee is \$15 a head.

-- Age verification will be by registration papers or dairy comp cow page.

-- Exhibitors will show under PDCA code of ethics.

Here are the classes:

- Class 1 - June 1 - Aug. 31, 2012.
- Class 2 - March 1 - My 31, 2012.
- Class 3 - Dec. 1, 2011 - Feb. 28, 2012.

Farwell restricts watering schedule

The City of Farwell is asking all residents to immediately comply with a restricted water schedule.

Due to dipping water levels and some mechanical well problems, the city's Public Works Department is implementing Stage 1 of their drought contingency plan.

Several city wells will need repairs before

water usage can return to normal. City officials believe that a recent small earthquake near Vega, Texas, could have caused the drastic reduction in water output in our area. Apparently, the shift in earth could affect wells in a 200 mile radius from the quake site.

Farwell Mayor Jimmie Mace said that Farwell water use needs to be restricted to a "have to

only" basis until the water levels can be improved. The city has shut off watering many properties including the city park until wells are operational again. Following is the mandated water schedule:

-- If your street address is an even number, (for example 24), your watering days are Monday, Wednesday and

Farwell police assist in arrest

In last week's Tribune, the Parmer County sheriff's report noted that on Sept. 23, Fabian Fabela, 29, of Muleshoe, was arrested on charges of driving with an invalid license, deadly conduct, prohibited substance in a correction facility and evading arrest with a vehicle.

Two of those counts are pending in county court and two others pending before the grand jury.

The Curry County's sheriff's office has released a report on the background for these charges.

About 2 a.m. that day, Curry County was notified of the pursuit of a pickup by the Bailey County sheriff's deputies, who had ended their pursuit around the area of Curry Road G.

A Curry County deputy spotted the pickup and set up spike strips at 21st and Norris street in Clovis to try and stop it. But the suspect avoided the strips and headed back onto county roads.

A short time later, New Mexico State police began pursuing the pickup on U.S. 70 in Roosevelt County where Fabela allegedly attempted to ram a state police officer.

Again, spike strips were set up around the area of Curry County 3 and F, but the sheriff's report says the suspect veered off the road and attempted to run over the deputies, one of whom fired two shots at the pickup.

A short time late, Farwell police officer Jared Romero saw the pickup and began pursuing Fabela southbound on U.S. 60. This pursuit ended in Texico when the pickup crashed into a fence behind the Dollar General store, where Fabela fled on foot.

Fabela was located and taken into custody in Parmer County. He was then charged as stated above. Charges for the offenses committed in Curry and Roosevelt counties are pending.

Also, a Clovis police K-9 alerted to the presence of narcotics on Fabela's vehicle. A subsequent search warrant located meth, drug paraphernalia and a partial 30-pack of beer, to include an open container.

- Declined allowing a resident to move a 12' wide trailer from one property in town to another. Martin said the minimum size for a trailer in town is 14'. The resident said they would appeal to the council, but did not show up.

- Heard from Fire Chief Lewis Cooper that several lawsuits filed by the city of Logan to stop the Ute Water Project have been dismissed, and Cooper said he felt the rest would be dismissed as well.

Reasonable Notice of Open Meeting Law

The Texico City Council met in a regular session on September 25, 2012, and decided that reasonable notice to the public as required in Open Meetings Act (NMSA 1978, Section 10-15-1 to 4) would be as follows:

Unless the business before the City Council dictates otherwise, the City Council conducts open meetings to take formal action on the second and fourth Tuesdays of each month at 6:30 p.m. However, when that Tuesday is a City holiday, that meeting will be held on the next business day.

The City Clerk and staff were authorized and directed to publish an annual schedule of regular meetings as legal advertisement in the State Line Tribune.

Emergency meetings will be called only under circumstances, which demand immediate action to protect the health, safety and property of citizens or to protect the public body from substantial financial loss. The City of Texico Council will avoid emergency meetings whenever possible. Emergency meetings may be called by the Mayor or a majority of the members upon four (4) hours notice, unless threat of personal injury or property damage requires less notice. The notice for all emergency meetings shall include an agenda for the meeting or information on how the public may obtain a copy of the agenda.

The Mayor or majority of the council members upon three (3) days notice may call special meetings. The notices shall include an agenda for the meeting or information on how members of the public may obtain a copy of the agenda. The agenda shall be available to the public at least twenty-four hours before any special meeting.

All other meetings which may be called for informational purposes at which no action is taken shall be held only after written notice is issued to the State Line Tribune no later than 12:00 noon of the day of such meeting, of four (4) hours before such meeting, whichever is greater.
