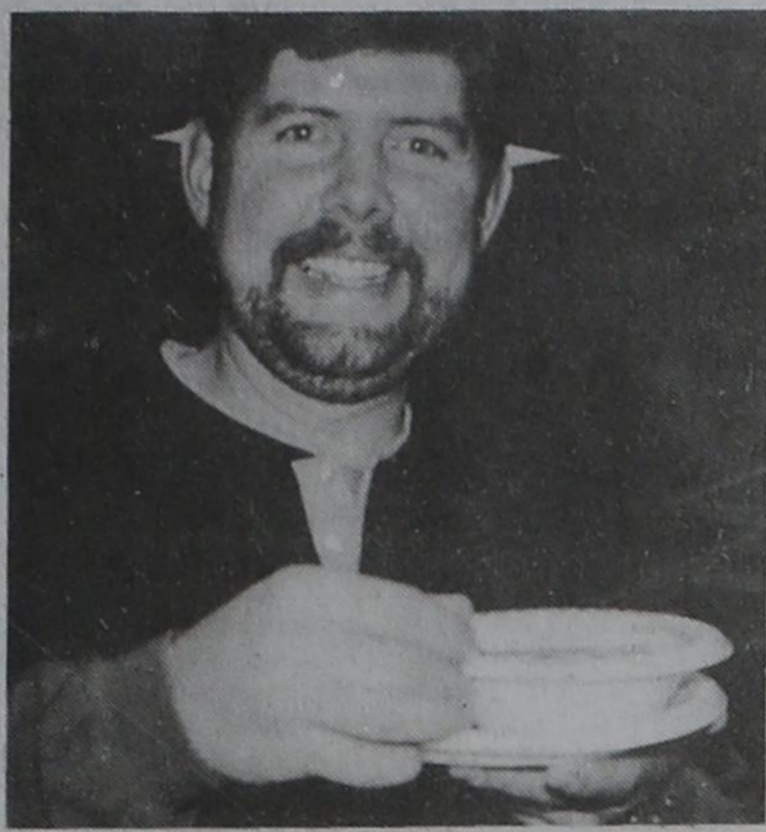

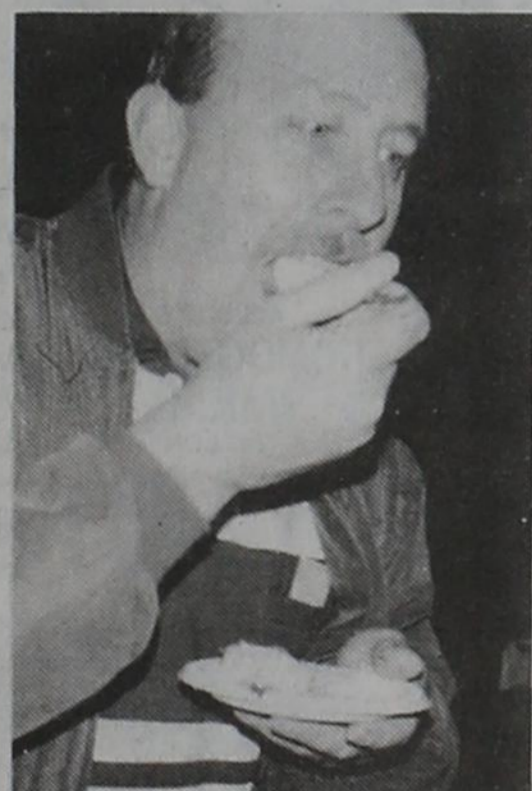

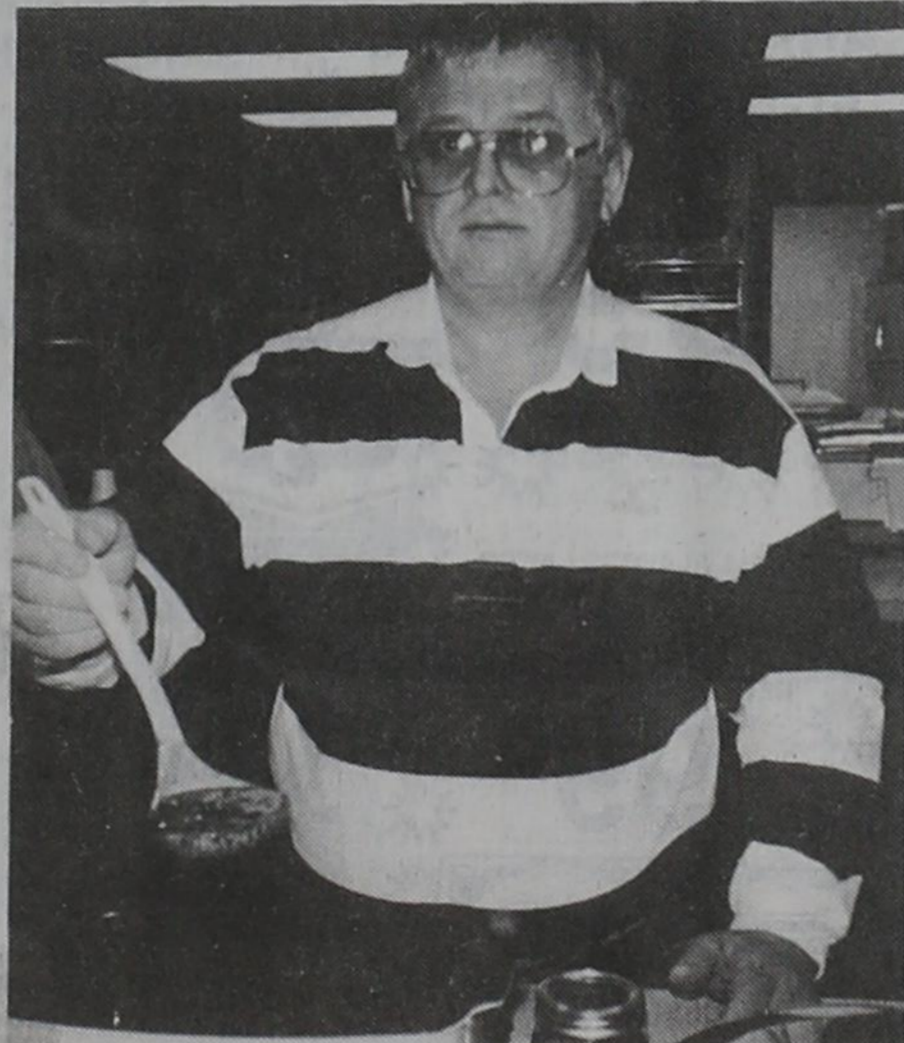

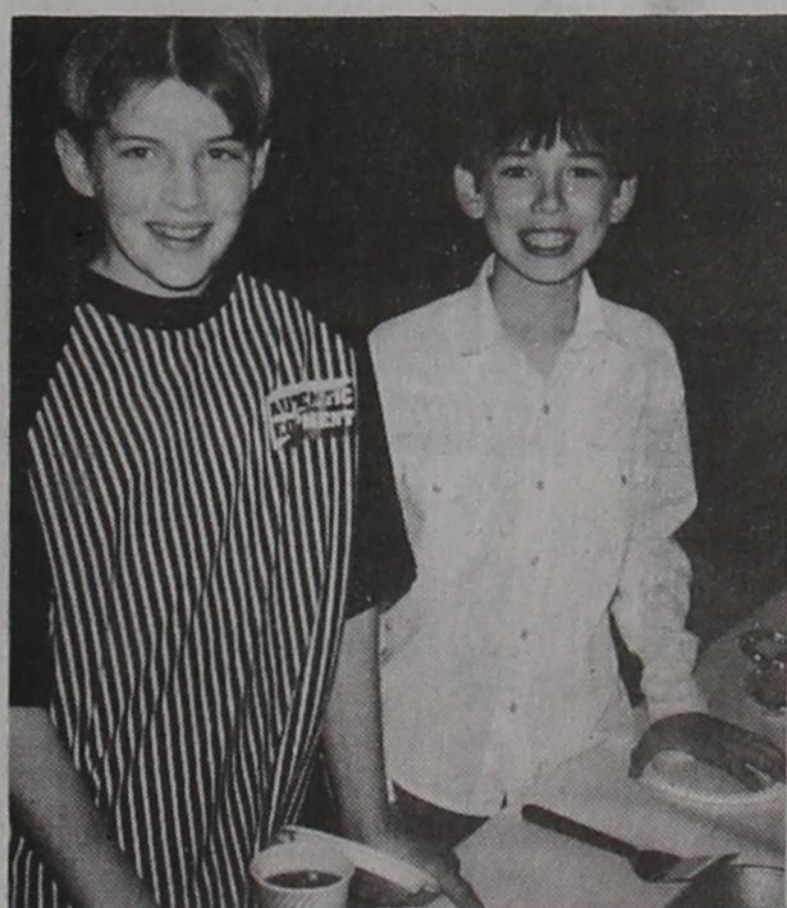

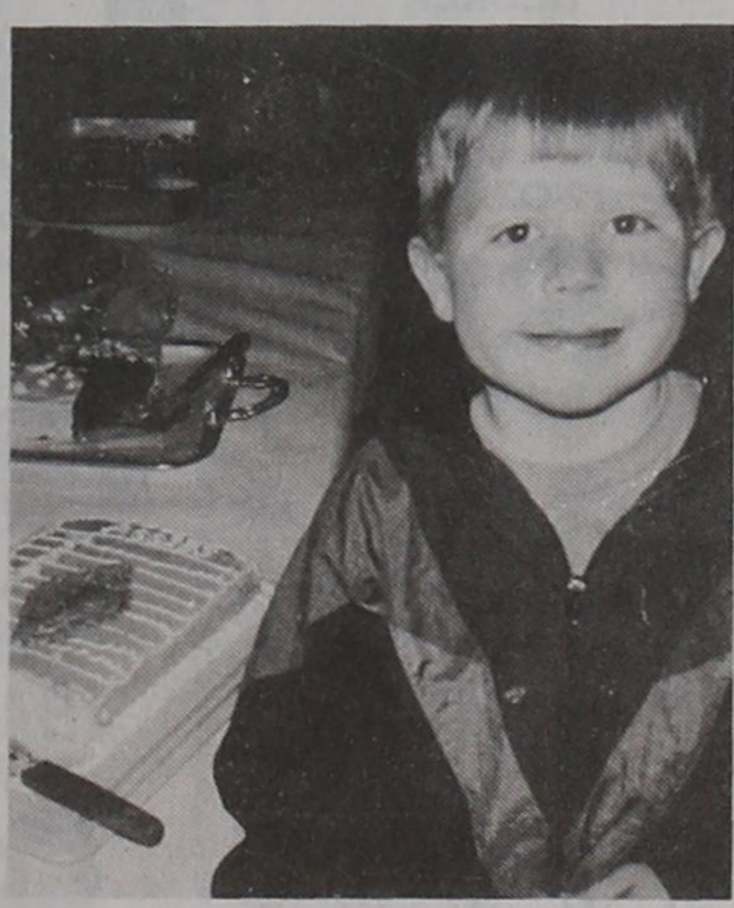

The Chief's Corner

Farwell Police Chief Roy McGaa has submitted his 1994 year-end report.

He said he received 252 calls for service resulting in 95 reports. They included:

Sixteen traffic accidents, 3 sexual assaults, 6 residential burglaries, 2 motor vehicle burglaries, 6 reports of child abuse, 3 firearms violations, 2 reports of loud parties, 44 assists to other officers, 2 disorderly conducts, 8 vandalism calls, 3 public intoxication arrests, 4 suspicious person reports, 1 suicide (unfounded).

Also, 4 simple assaults, 3 building burglaries, 6 DWI arrests, 10 domestic violence reports, 19 juvenile arrests, 2 drug calls (1 arrest), 10 criminal mischief/trespass calls, 12 theft cases, 5 warrant arrests, 4 terroristic threat reports, 1 other weapon violation and 8 suspicious vehicle reports.

During the year, McGaa was re-elected president of the South Plains Criminal Investigators Association.

McGaa also issued his report for December 1994: It included 1 public intoxication, 1 building burglary, 2 thefts, 1 assault, 1 residential burglary and 2 criminal trespassing. He issued 1 citation and made 1 arrest.

# Control program moves ahead

The board of directors of Plains Cotton Growers, based in Lubbock, Jan. 18 approved a proposal from the PCG Boll Weevil Steering Committee to proceed with plans for the implementation of an Enhanced Boll Weevil Diapause Control Program under the auspices of the Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation.

The PCG effort is designed to reverse the recent pattern of boll weevil infestations on the High Plains and to effectively remove the weevil from cotton fields above the Caprock in advance of a full-fledged eradication effort to eliminate the boll weevil beginning in the spring of 1998.

Approval of the plan by the PCG board means the effort to get the enhanced diapause program up and running by the fall of 1995 can proceed immediately. To implement it, producers across the High Plains will participate in a formal referendum conducted by the Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation. The referendum ballot will contain three separate items for producers to vote on.

The first question will decide whether or not to establish the 30-county area, defined in the Boll Weevil Eradication enabling legislation as the High Plains Eradication increment, as an active boll weevil eradication zone. Secondly, producers will elect a member to the Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Board of Directors. And third, producers will vote on a proposed assessment that will be collected through county consolidated farm service agency offices.

Ballots will be mailed directly to eligible voters who will then have a predetermined number of days in which to mark and return the ballot. More information about the program will be presented by the PCG at meetings throughout the High Plains area.

- 3/4 tsp. salt
- 1/4 c. cold milk.

Measure sifted flour and salt in to mixing bowl. Mix 1/2 Crisco into flour to cornmeal consistency using blender. Mix the other 1/2 of Crisco mix and blend to the size of a pea. Add cold milk, a small amount at a time using a fork. Place on board and work slightly until particles hold together. Divide into 2 parts making one part a little smaller than the other. Use the larger part of dough for the bottom crust; roll it 1/2" thick. Fold into quarters and place in pie pan. Trim crust. Pour in filling slowly. Moisten lower crust with cold water. Add top crust. Trim and turn top crust under edge of lower crust. Crimp edge with fork.

# Here's why school levy is sought

**Editor's note: The Tribune asked Texico School Supt. R.L. Richards to write some background information on why Texico Schools is seeking voter approval of a 2-mill levy. The question will be on the Feb. 7 ballot when school district residents elect school board members, also.**

by Texico School Supt. R.L. Richards  
The Texico School Board is requesting your support for a two-mill levy to assist Texico Schools. The levy is a form of returning some of our tax money going to Santa Fe back to the local community. Our community does provide tax money to Santa Fe, but little money is ever returned to us. Here is our chance to return local tax money back to our local area.  
The two-mill levy assesses a tax on local property owners; this two mill is received by the county government and returned to the school district. The best part about this levy is the match money we receive from state taxes. The state guarantees \$70 per student unit from its capital outlay funds to the school district. For Texico Schools, the program works this way:

Texico School District	
1993 Assessed Property Valuation	\$21,652,699

State Guaranteed Level	\$84,144
Local Two Mill	43,305

As you can see for the \$43,305 the community puts in, the state puts in \$40,839. For every \$1.06 the local tax contributes, Santa Fe matches it with \$1.00.  
This is how a 2 mill tax would work on a house or property:  
Market Value is \$33,000  
Assessed Value is 30,000  
Taxed Value is 10,000  
\$10,000 x .002 equals \$20 increases in taxes per year. While a \$33,000 property value contributes \$20, the state contributes \$18.87 through Capital Outlay Bonds. Therefore, the school will receive a return on the money.  
Presently, Texico Schools is the only Curry County School District without the 2 mill program. This is a good opportunity for us to begin the program.  
Two mill money may only be used to maintain, repair and furnish buildings, purchase equipment and student activity vehicles and for the purchase or improvement of school grounds. It cannot be used for salaries of school personnel. It is not to be used for administrative purposes.

We hope to keep kids first and we have developed the following list of suggestions for future school improvement. These are not prioritized or ranked; rather funds will be spent only as need arises, not wants:  
Elementary playground equipment, renovation in old gym, library books and equipment, computers for students, network student computers for Internet, write to write software, block windows north side of high school, high school hallway doors, high school desks - 2 years (40 desks), update elementary bathrooms, replace carpet in needed areas, roof repair, replace old Peyton bus barn, replace gas bus in 2000, replace station wagons, replace maintenance pickup, cover south gym II windows, add water fountain in elementary, improve high school science lab, replace mini bus in 2000, ADA specifications, floor tiles in two elementary rooms, activity bus - replacement schedule, and re-key facility.

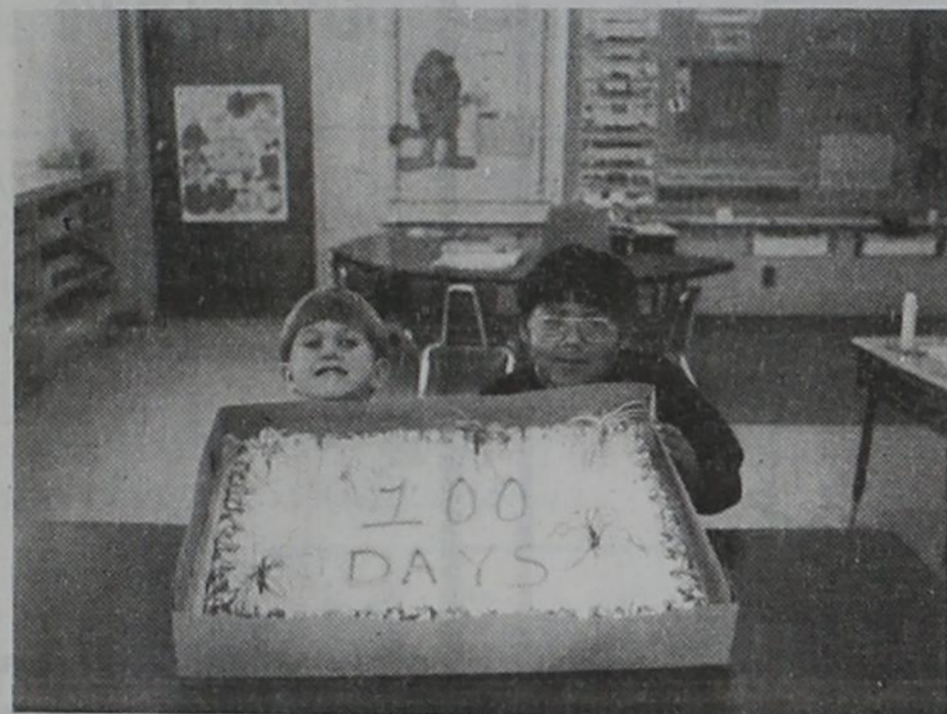
