Injunction filed against
out-of-state vehicle fee
There has been an uproar over the bill that will increase first-inspection fees on out-of-state vehicles from \$1 to \$225.
The Tribune published an article in last week's issue outlining the amendment that was tacked onto an envi ronmental bill, to go into effect Nov. 1. The bill was passed by the state legislature about 3 a.m. one fine morning.

But the Texas Automobile Dealers Association filed an injunction on Aug. 15 to block initiation of the fee. TADA is basing its suit on how it gives preferential treatment, and inhibits interstate commerce. Many Texas auto dealers buy vehicles from out of state at auctions ... and the $\$ 225$ fee would be tacked on, causing higher prices for consumers
Courts in Florida and California have found similar fees to be unconstitutional and certain opinions issued by the Texas Attorney general have found analogous fees invalid, according to the TADA

NOTICE OF CHANGE IN ELECTION PRECINCTS IN PARMER COUNTY

Pursuant to authority vested in the PARMER County Commissioners' Court, under Section 42.035 of the Texas Election Code, the Court has made certain changes in the boundaries of Commissioners' Election Precincts in order to properly perfect a new redistricting plan for the County.
The new redistricting plan and the changes in the Election Precinct Boundaries were adopted at a Special meeting of the Commissioners' Court on the 29th day of August, 2001

Therefore, pursuant to the mandatory duty imposed upon the Commissioners' Court, pursuant to the Texas Election Code, to-wit:
(1) In future elections, there will be 9 Election Precincts plus the early voting box.
(2) These Election Precincts will be defined as shown by Exhibit $A$ and the polling boxes in each precinct will be as follows:
VOTING BOX NO. 101
This polling place remains at the Calvary Baptist Church, 1500 Cleveland, Friona, Texas.
VOTING BOX NO. 201
The polling place remains at the Bovina EMS Building, 109 3rd Street, Bovina, Texas
VOTING BOX NO. 202
The polling place remains at the Friona Community Center, 601 W. 15th Street, Friona, Texas. VOTING BOX NO. 203

The polling place remains at Rhea Community Center, 307 FM 2013, Rhea, Parmer County, Texas. VOTING BOX NO. 301

The polling place remains at Farwell Community Center, 207 9th Street, Farwell, Texas.
VOTING BOX NO. 302
This polling place remains at the Oklahoma Lane Methodist Church, 645 FM 1731, Parmer County, Texas.
VOTING BOX NO. 303
This polling place remains at Bovina Ridgelea School, 1000 Hwy. 86, Bovina, Texas.
VOTING BOX NO. 401
This polling place remains at the Lazbuddie School, 673 FM 1172, Lazbuddie, Texas.
VOTING BOX NO. 402
This polling place remains at the Friona Fire Station, 623 Main Street, Friona, Texas.
(3) These Election Precinct Boundaries will become effective upon approval by the United States Department of Justice, pursuant to Section Five (5) of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended in 1975.
