I'm looking forward to a fun Dallas Cowboys season.

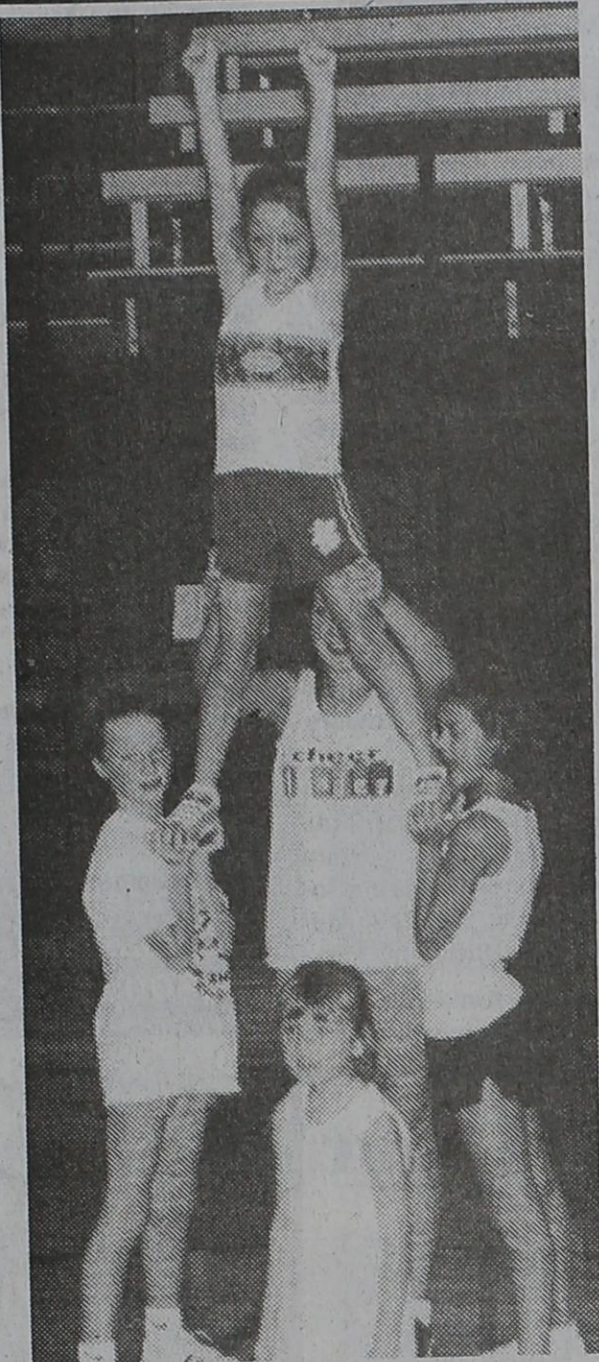
While I may not have the same optimism as Cowboys' owner Jerry Jones that the team can win 10 games (they have a real tough schedule, alas), but they will more than hold their own.

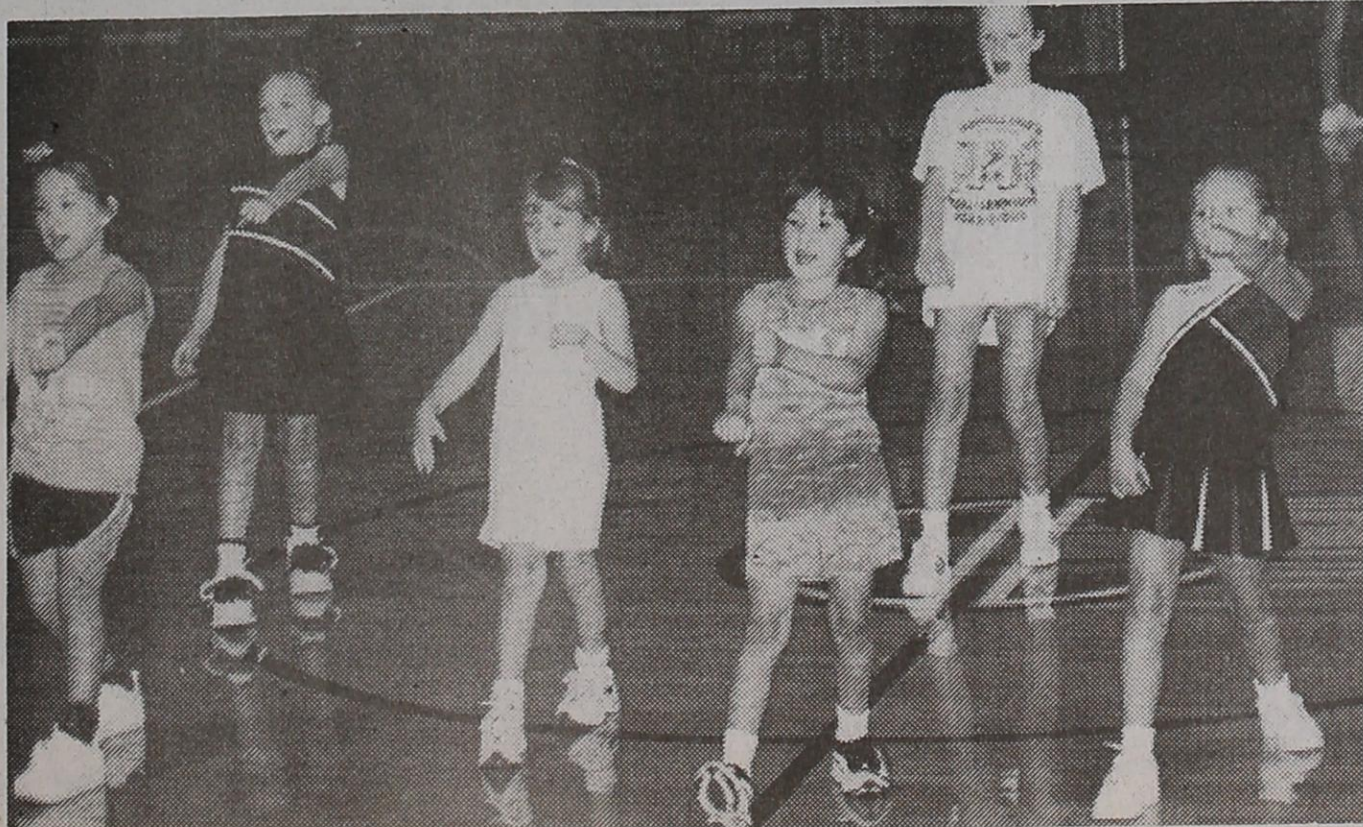
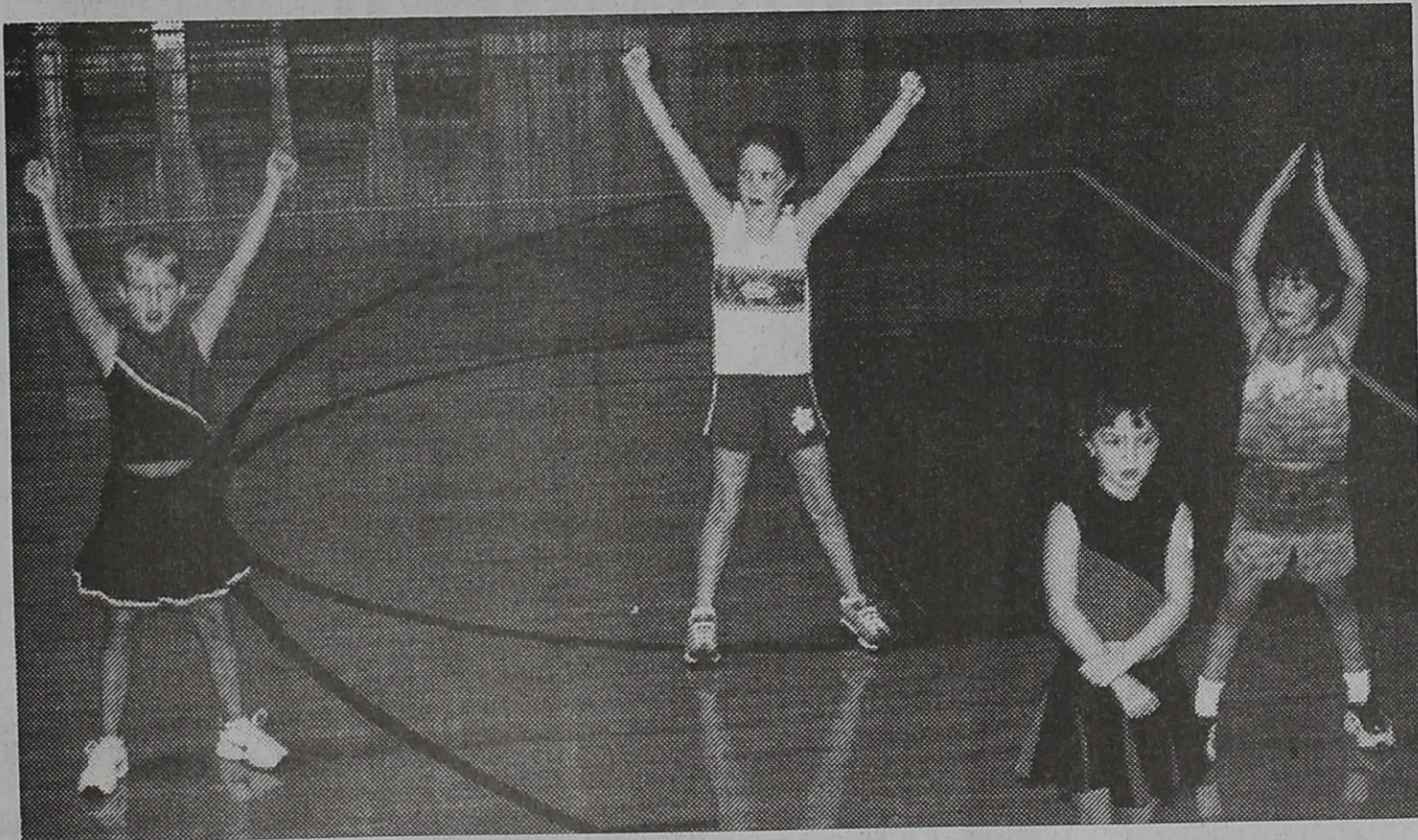
Having a mobile QB is essential in today's pro football world. Thus, I was glad to see Troy Aikman retire. With little mobility, he was destined to take some hard hits again. And

Edwards captures contest opener

It was another big start for the annual Area Merchants Football Contest last week.

A total of 325 participants (compared to 338 last year, and 316 the year before), ages 12 and above, are going for the gold.

But right off the bat, the 12-game contest showed its evil heart, with scores generally in the 6, 7 and 8 range.

IN fact, none of the 323 players got more than 10 games picked correctly. Eleven entrants had 10 correct answers.

By virtue of being closest to the tie breaker (Dexter 29, Texico 0), the first place cash prize of \$15 went to Danielle Edwards. She was 19 off the tie breaker.

The second place cash prize of \$7.50 went to Willie Roberts, who was 23 off the tie breaker.

Rules for the contest are the same as in the past. A person must be at least 12 years of age to enter.

Each entrant must remember to pick a tie breaker score since many weekly winners -- and some overall grand prize winners -- have been determined by that method.

Each week's scoring is tabulated and kept on public view at the Tribune office. Standings are posted each Monday and may be seen during regular business hours.

Ballots are kept throughout the length of the contest so that any entrant with a question can look back at them.

The overall winner of the 12-week contest will win two tickets to the Dallas Cowboys -- New York Giants game at Texas Stadium, plus over night lodging for 2 at a Dallas hotel, \$50 in cash and other goodies.

Injunction filed against out-of-state vehicle fee

There has been an uproar over the bill that will increase first-inspection fees on out-of-state vehicles from \$1 to \$225.

The Tribune published an article in last week's issue outlining the amendment that was tacked onto an environmental bill, to go into effect Nov. 1. The bill was passed by the state legislature about 3 a.m. one fine morning.

But the Texas Automobile Dealers Association filed an injunction on Aug. 15 to block initiation of the fee. TADA is basing its suit on how it gives preferential treatment, and inhibits interstate commerce. Many Texas auto dealers buy vehicles from out of state at auctions ... and the \$225 fee would be tacked on, causing higher prices for consumers.

Courts in Florida and California have found similar fees to be unconstitutional and certain opinions issued by the Texas Attorney general have found analogous fees invalid, according to the TADA.

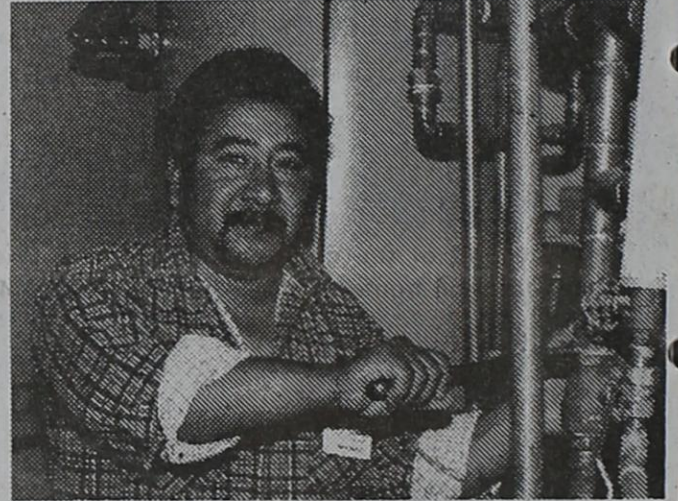
Homecoming supper offered

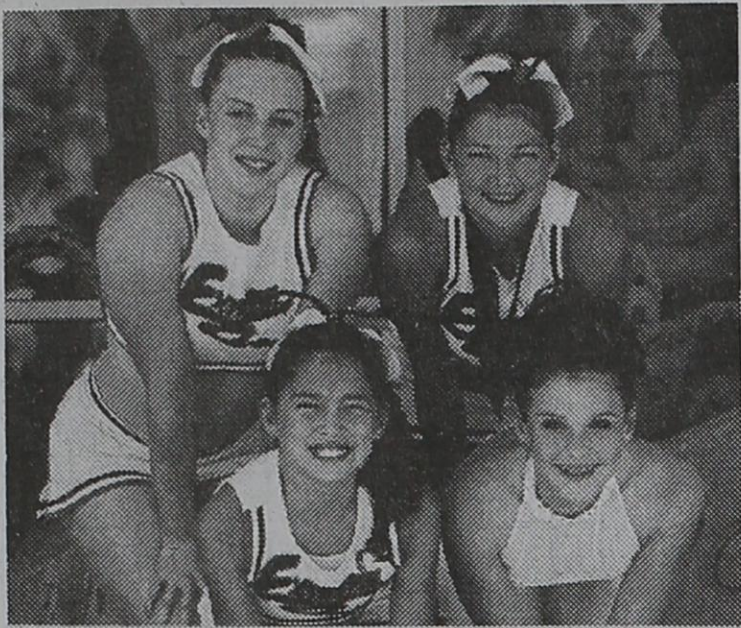

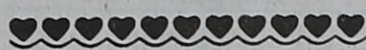

This polling place remains at the Oklahoma Lane Methodist Church, 645 FM 1731, Parmer County, Texas.

VOTING BOX NO. 303

This polling place remains at Bovina Ridgelea School, 1000 Hwy. 86, Bovina, Texas.

The Lazbuddie scores came on a pass play from DeLeon to Tobin Redwine,

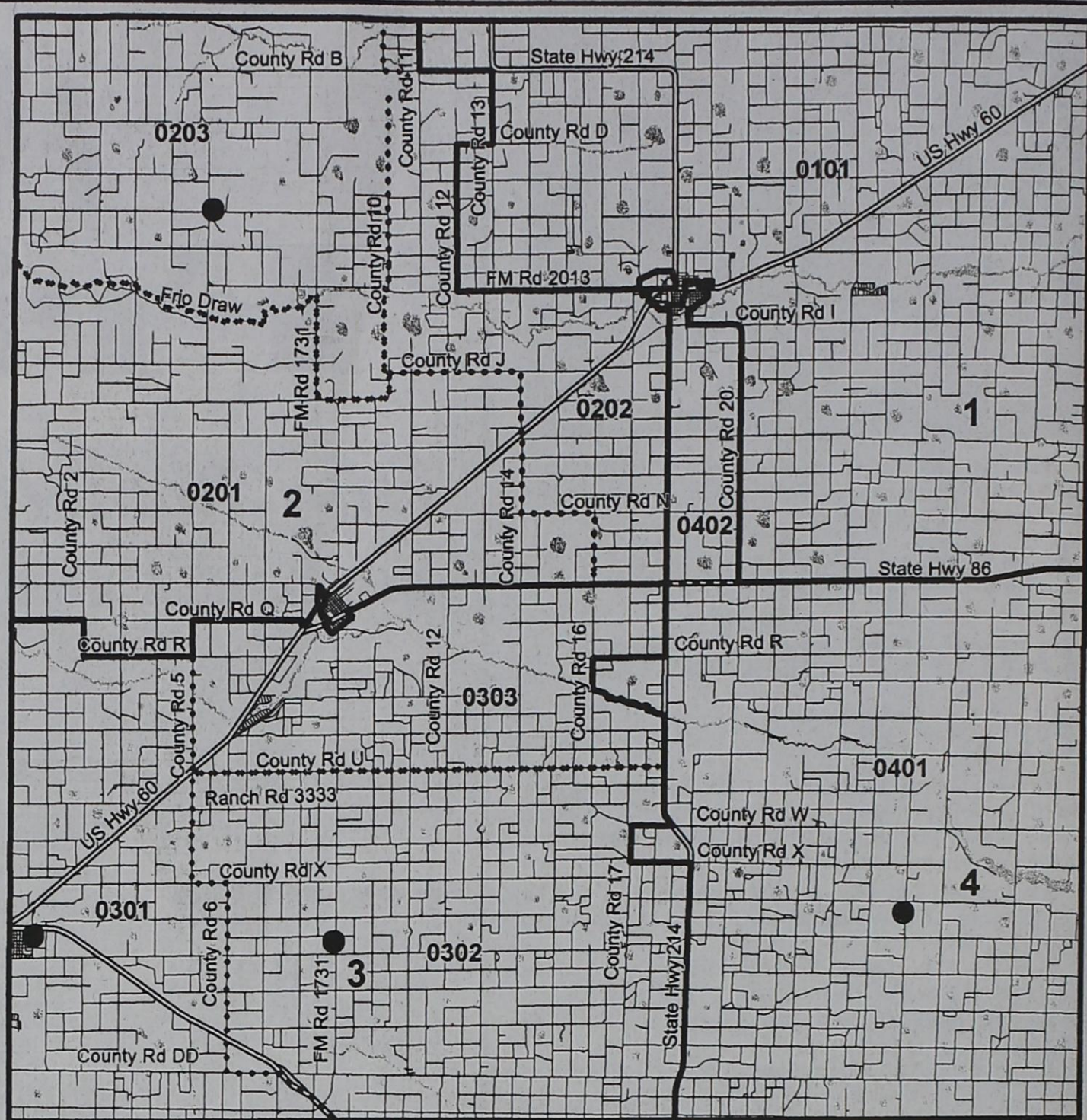

and rushes by Michael Martinez, Kolby Wilkerson and Trevor Gartin (2).

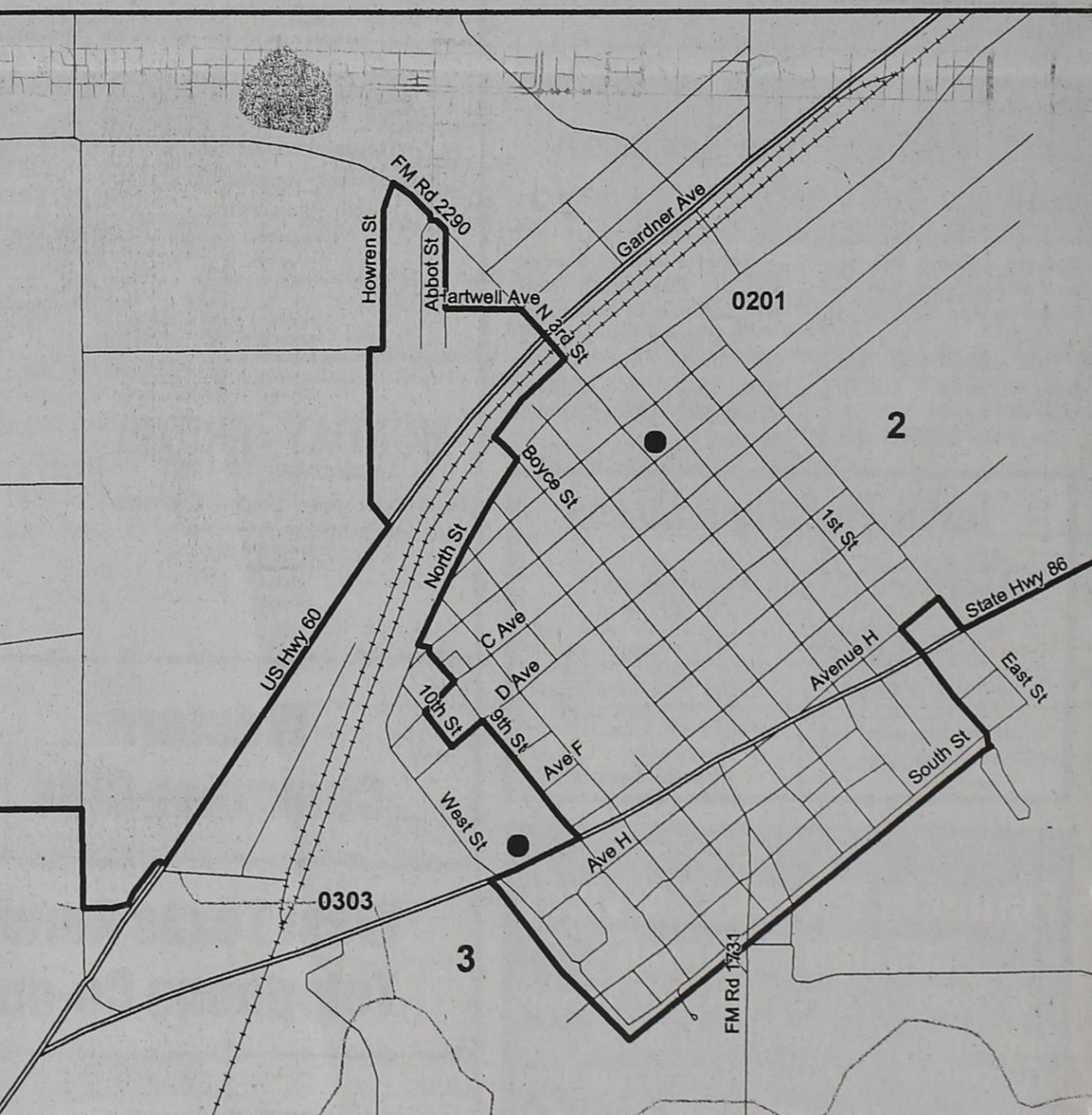
Lazbuddie actually outgained Follett, 300 yards (including 177 rushing) to 260. But the turnovers proved the difference.

Texico School Board policy puts stress on academics over sports

The Texico School Board announced a new policy at its Tuesday meeting to put more priority on academics over athletics.

Previously, school officials would wait until the 9-week grading period ended to see if students were academically eligible for extra-curricular events, such as the sports program.

Bailey County Electric Co-op re-elects three directors

The Bailey County Electric Cooperative re-elected three directors at its annual meeting in Muleshoe on Tuesday.

In District 4, Jerry Nichols defeated Pudd Wiseman. Nichols has served on the co-op board since 1992 and is secretary-treasurer.

In District 5, Nelson Carlisle defeated John Barker. Carlisle has been a director since 1985.

An interesting race developed in District 7, where the incumbent is Raymond Lewis, who has been a director since 1988.

The nominating committee put up Edward Dewbre and Ronald Coleman for the post. But Lewis' name was added to the ballot as a result of a nomination from the floor.

After the ballots were tallied, the election judges announced that none of the three candidates for the District 7 post had achieved a 50 percent majority of the votes, thus no one was elected. At the bottom of their score sheet, it was stated that a 50 percent majority of votes cast was needed before a candidate was elected.

But a check by Johnny Actkinson, cooperative attorney, of the by-laws, found that that 50 percent statement was incorrect on the tally sheets and all that was needed for election was a simple majority of votes cast.

Thus, Lewis was re-elected.

Other board directors are District 1, Darrell Stephens, chairman and director since 1988; District 2, Keith Hicks, elected in 2000; District 3, Jimmy Craft, elected in 1995; and District 6, Tommy Kirk, vice chairman and a director since 1978.

The committee on nominations included

Jack Schuster, Rusty Gore, Mary Ferguson, Brian Kirby, Ernest Ruthardt and Calvin Wiseman.

The capital credit situation for 2000 showed: assigned, \$237,903.85; retired, \$209.97; and balance, \$237,693.88.

In the cooperative's financial statement, the net margin for 2000 was \$531,961.

The total operating income was \$17,094,604.

Revenue comes from: residential, 13 percent; commercial, 12 percent, and irrigation, 75 percent.

In his annual report, cooperative manager Duane Lloyd thanked the Legislature for passing a bill that will delay electric deregulation in the Panhandle until 2007. He noted problems in California and other areas where deregulation has been rushed into, with serious problems occurring.

"Had we been forced to deregulate under the law as it was written, you can be assured that the cost of electricity would have increased by four to five times, so we can thank our state representatives from the Panhandle for pushing HB 1692 and making sure that we were protected from such happenings as those taking place in California and other areas," Lloyd said.

He continued: "The big excuse for the problem being experienced is the lack of generating capacity, and this is true in some areas, but we also have a transmission constraint in other areas, also."

"It will take many years to get the country to the point of being able to transmit power to different locations, and by the time we get technology developed to operate generating plants and transmission grids efficiently and effectively, the cost may be prohibitive."

But now, students' grades will be checked on a weekly basis to ensure they can stay in extra-curricular events.

"If you want to play ball, you have to keep your grades up," summed up Supt. R.L. Richards.

The board met earlier than usual this month due to the state fair coming up. In other business, the board:

-- Heard the administrative philosophy that if a student is participating in a school event, such as an FFA fair, and is on a sports team, there will be no punishment from the coach just because the student is absent from the sports team.

-- Noted that Oct. 15 is parent-teacher conference day.

-- Heard that there will be a further delay in the school gym construction project. The new delay is due to this: the original bids taken on plumbing and heating/air conditioning were rejected because they were too high (the lowest bid was \$340,000). So the bids were re-done, and they came in about \$120,000 to \$170,000 less.

But Richards said that W.T. Denton, of Clovis, protested the bidding process, so the board rejected all those bids, and decided to re-advertise the bids.

-- Heard Richards report that it's going to be a busy weekend. The school board will march in the state fair parade and about 30 Texico students will be participating in the state fair. Also, there will be football and volleyball games this weekend.

-- Heard a request from a parent that the Grady School District bus be allowed to pick up students who attend their school but live within the boundaries of the Texico School District. The board denied this request.

-- Approved three new bus drivers -- Lyn Johnson, Steve Ray and Coletta Ray.

-- Heard that 529 students were enrolled this year, with the kindergarten and 8th grade classes very full.

-- Noted that the staff leave policy lets folks take sick leave, then go directly to their accumulated sick leave.

-- Discussed bus rates when the new apartment complex is built on the Burrows property. A new bus may be needed.




