I saw an interesting Associated Press article that I wanted to pass on.



Parmer County boasts \$500,000 surplus

The annual audit for 2000 by Kirkland, Kirkland & Co., CPA, at the Parmer County Commissioners contained some excellent news for county residents.

Year-end figures showed that receipts totalled \$3,008,269 while disbursements were \$2,457,625. Thus, the county achieved a surplus of more than half a million

In addition, Parmer County has Certificates of Deposit totalling \$718,920, and a Tex Pool investment of \$328,865.

All told, the county reserves have risen to \$2,332,471. Jack Allen Kirkland, head of the CPA firm, noted that receipts were up 16 percent over the previous year's total. And that disbursements (expenses) had risen only 6 percent (which included pay raises for county employees and higher health insurance costs).

The county is in "excellent financial shape," said Kirkland. He also presented a management report citing some auditing deficiencies, most of which already have been corrected by the individual county officials.

This is a turnaround from several years ago, when some budgets were in the "red."

Another point of interest was that collections by the county's three Justices of the Peace have increased a lot . The 2000 totals were: Friona JP, \$39,000; Bovina JP, \$114,000; and Farwell JP, \$61,000.

After the budget report, the commissioners toured the recently-painted county jail. Sheriff Randy Geries explained that new jail standards and jail population will necessitate improvements and/or expansion of the jail.

Deputy sheriff Wayne Gruben recently supervised inmates in the cleanup, and commissioners said the jail has never looked this good.

Jail standards involve segregating males and females, and persons incarcerated for felonies and misdemeanors. The Parmer County jail's deficiencies are due to lack of space.

Thus, it appears that the commissioners and Geries will work together soon on correcting this situation.

In other business, the commissioners:

-- Pointed out an error in last week's Tribune report on the coming precinct redistricting. One sentence inadvertantly said that part of the west side of Friona, which is currently in Pct. 2 (the Bovina area), probably would be put into Pct. 3 (the Farwell area). That should have been Pct. 1 (the Friona area).

-- Renewed the annual \$10 fee for vehicle owners, which provides revenue for the county road and bridge fund. There are more than 10,000 vehicles registered in Parmer County, said commissioner Tom Ware.






