# U.S. Department of Justice okays county redistricting plan

Parmer County Judge Bonnie Clayton reported that she has been informed by Bobbye Hill, the atttorney who handled the county's redistricting plan, that it has been approved by the U.S. Department of Justice.

Thus, the proposed precinct redistricting plan that the county commissioners had okayed in August, is now official. Justice Department final approval was necessary because of deviations in population changes between the county's four precincts.

The county will send out letters to all country residents informing them of which precinct they are in.

Here re the plan's major changes:

-- Pct. 3 (Ed Corn's Farwell area precinct) has added six blocks in the city of Bovina, mostly at its southeast and western edges. The major change for the Bovina folks added to Pct. 3 is that they will now vote at Ridge-

-- The Oklahoma Lane voting area has been expanded to include the western half (roughly) of FM 3333. This means that these folks will no longer vote at the Farwell Community Center, but at the Oklahoma Lane voting

# Incumbents announce for re-election, but McGehee not running

The filing period for next year's Texas county elections starts Dec. 3 and ends Jan. 2. Candidates need to register with their respective county chairmen -- Democrat Robert White or Republican John Tannhill in Parmer

Write-in candidates are not allowed in Texas primary elections, but are okay for the general election in November.

The big news on this front is that Pct. 4 (the Lazbuddie area) County Commissioner Raymond McGehee doesn't plan to seek re-election. When his term expires in December 2002, it will mean that McGehee, a Democrat, will have served in this post for 24 years:

Also, there are two undecided incumbents: Parmer County Treasurer Anne Norton, and Friona area Justice of the Peace Frances Euler (who has been ill.). Both are

## Farwell moves on water project

Farwell Council on Nov. 20 took important steps toward ensuring the city's longterm water supply.

The council approved an agreement between the city and First Southwest Co., of Lubbock, to act as placement agent for issuing \$375,000 in tax notes.

Also, the council passed an ordinance authorizing the city to issue that amount in tax

Tax notes need to be paid back within five years. If a longer period had been needed, the city would have had to have a bond election.

The \$375,000 will go along with a state grant of \$250,000 to buy land and to build new water wells.

To help pay back the tax notes, the city council in September raised the basic rate for water usage by customers from \$7.60 a month to \$20 a month.


The city has purchased 220 acres from Randy Ware. The area is roughly bounded on the west by Farwell Spraying Service's air strip; on the north by the Lubbock highway; and on the south by a eastwest running county road.

The city recently cut weeds on the property, which also contains two wells and a sprinkler sys-


Water Supt. Dee Hammit said the city probably will sell the sprinkler system. But the wells (the main one has been running 550 gallons a minute) will be used, alongside two wells to be drilled.

box -- folks have asked for this because it means a much shorter drive to the poll.

-- Pct. 4 (Raymond McGehee's Lazbuddie area precinct) picked up two areas in the city of Friona, an area north of Highway 60, and an area off Grand Avenue. These areas previously were in Pct. 1 (Kirk Frye's Friona area precinct). These folks will now vote at the Friona Fire Station.

-- Pct. 1 picked up an area mainly west of Highway 60, that had been in Pct. 2 (Tom Ware's Bovina area precinct). So instead of voting at the Friona Community Center, they will vote at the Calvary Baptist Church.

The county's four precincts needed to be redistricted because of the 2000 census and the Voting Rights Act. The 2000 census showed Pct. 1 losing 70 persons; Pct. 2 gaining 226; Pct. 3 losing 22, and Pct. 4 losing 134. The new districts will bring these four populations much closer together.




Security State Bank will be displaying 50 to 60 works of art on Nov. 29 and 30 during regular lobby hours.







- Vegetable oil spray 1 pound boneless pork loin chops, all visible fat removed Egg substitute equivalent to 1
- egg, or 1egg

2 tablespoons nonfat milk 1/3 cup cornflake crumbs

2 tablespoons commeal 1/2 teaspoon dried marjoram, crumbled

1/8 teaspoon ground pepper

1/8 teaspoon dry mustard 1/8 teaspoon ground ginger

1/8 teaspoon cayenne

Preheat oven to 375° F. Using vegetable oil spray, spray a shallow baking pan large enough to hold pork chops in a single layer. Set aside. Cut pork chops into 4 portions, if necessary. Set aside.

In a small, shallow bowl such as a soup bowl, combine egg substitute and milk. In a shallow dish such as a pie pan, combine crumbs, cornmeal,

marjoram, pepper, mustard, ginger, and cayenne. Using tongs, dip pork chops in milk mixture, letting excess liquid drip off. Coat both sides of pork chops with crumb mixture. 
