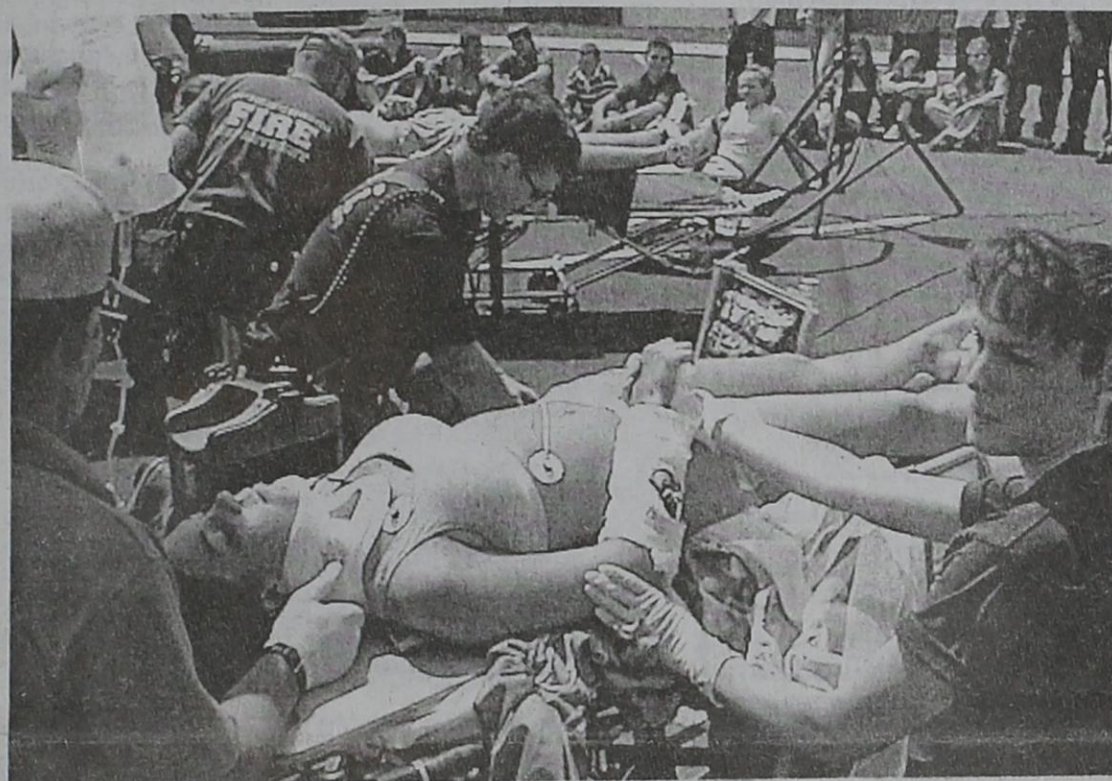

The Texico Fire Department presented a Driving Under the Influence prevention program to Texico High students on May 15.

The program was presented prior to graduation and prom in an effort to reduce teen DUI's. Four seniors were made to look as if they had been injured and placed into a wrecked vehicle. The Texico police and fire departments responded as if it were an actual motor vehicle crash.

The drive of the car, Marc Foust, was simulated

as intoxicated, with only minor injuries. Texico Police Chief Kelley Brophy performed all the normal field sobriety tests as he would in the real situation and placed Marc under arrest.

Kelsi Cain, Jesse Barclay and Tara Lockmiller were the other students placed in the auto, who were simulated more seriously injured. The fire department performed auto extrication as they would for a real crash, treating, removing and transporting the victims.

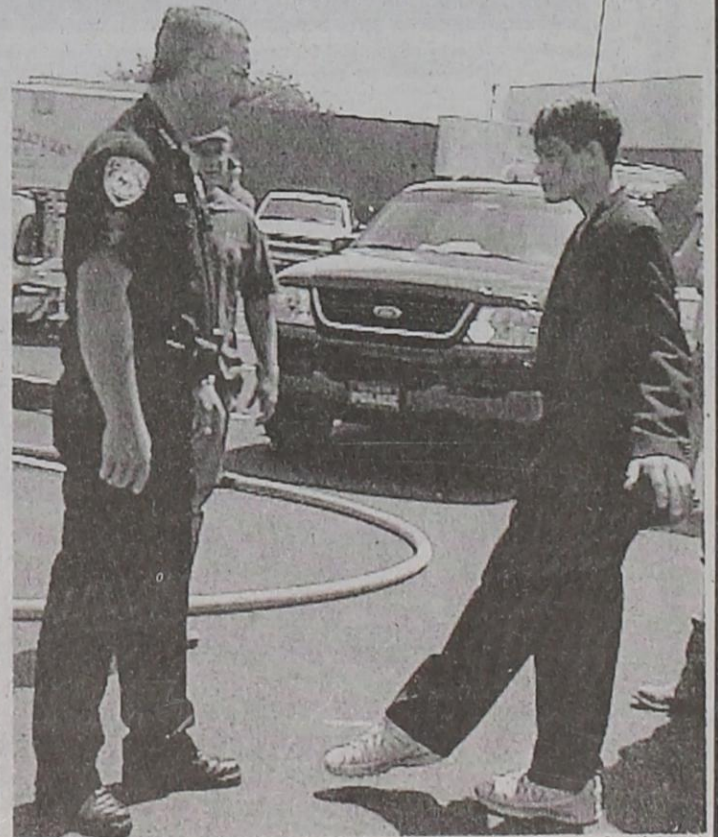
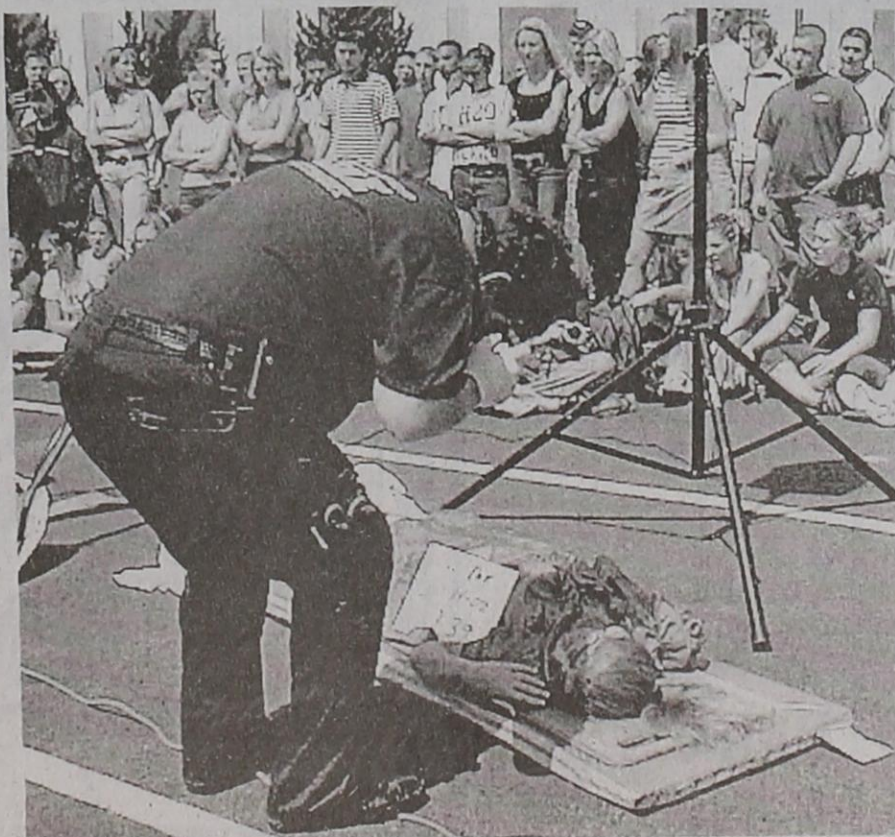

The program was narrated by Texico Fire Department Training Officer Bobby Lockmiller, who explained to the students the procedures being used in the removal and treatment of the simulated patients.

The incident was simulated as having one fatality, which was investigated by Bill Blankenship of the Medical Investigator's Office. He performs his required investigation, then asked the incident commander, Texico Fire Chief Lewis Cooper, to call for mortuary transport of the DOA. Ronny Stidham, of Steed-Todd Funeral Home, arrived to simulate transport of the DOA to Albuquerque for autopsy.

The Texico Fire Department thanked those who helped with the program: Hank Merrik, from Causey Fire Dept.; Shirley Woods, of Portales, who made the students look as if they had actually been in a crash; Bill Blankenship, Ronny Stidham, school activities director Steve Foust for scheduling the program; American Auto Salvage for providing a car (which is now missing its roof and doors!), Clovis Fire Dept.'s Karen Burns for the sound system used to narrate the program, and Battalion Chief Ike Burns, for providing an ambulance and crew to assist, plus all the members of the Texico police and fire departments who assisted the program.

Honors were given out to:

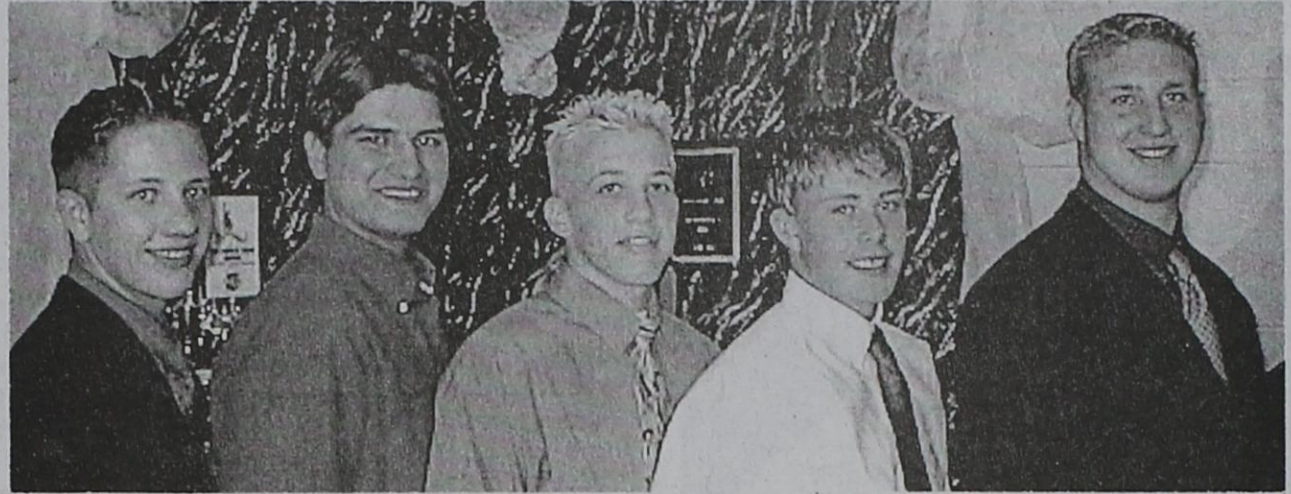

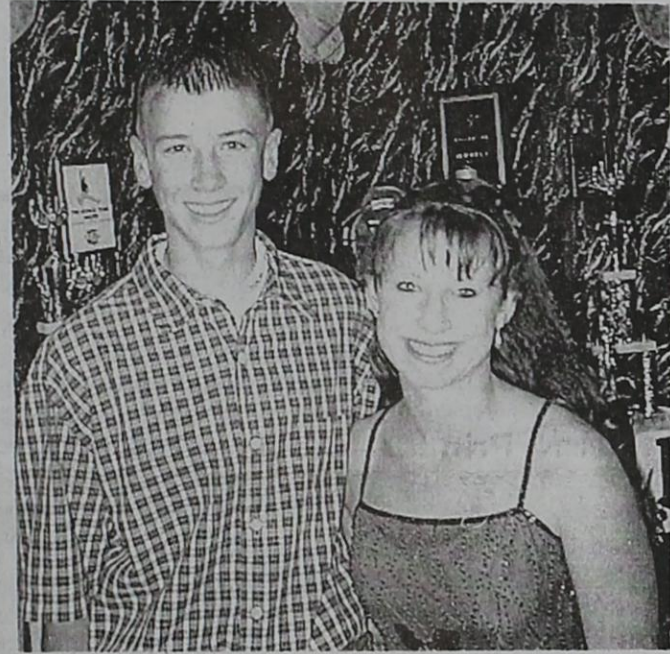

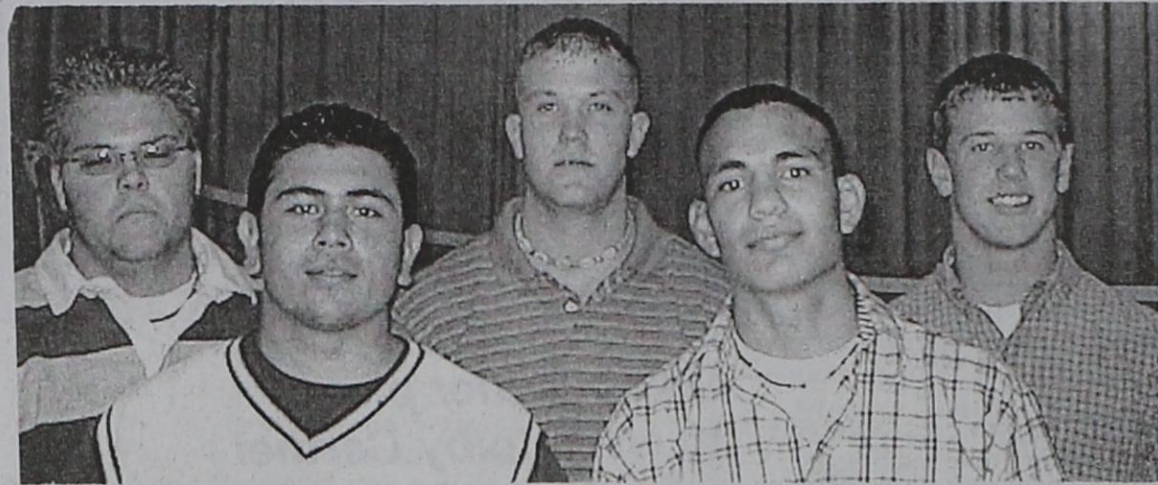

I wrote many years ago, that it was a real eye opener when I first moved into the Washington, D.C.,

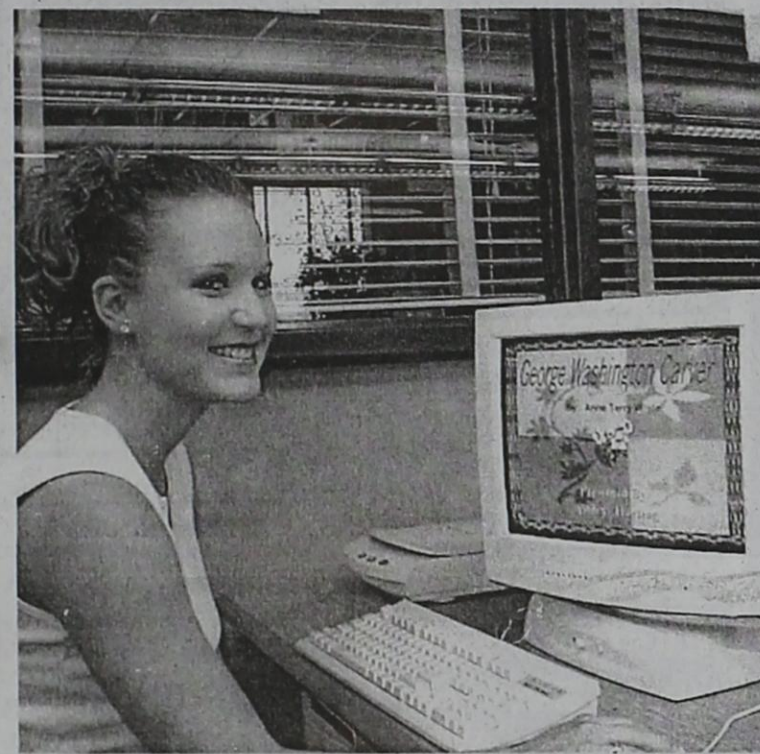
area. That's when I found that many government folks only cared about No. 1 (themselves) and didn't give a hoot or holler about folks in the rest of the country.



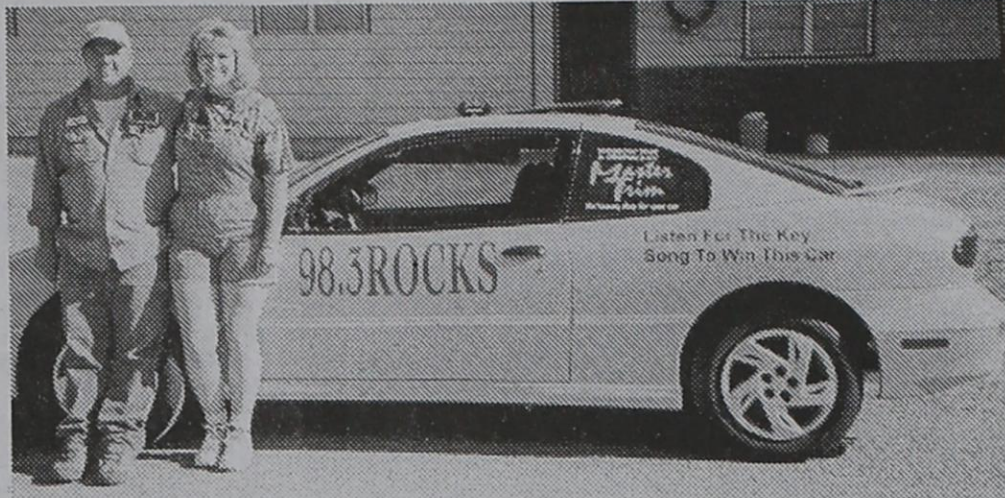

These have a tape strip and will attach permanently into the back of the yearbook.

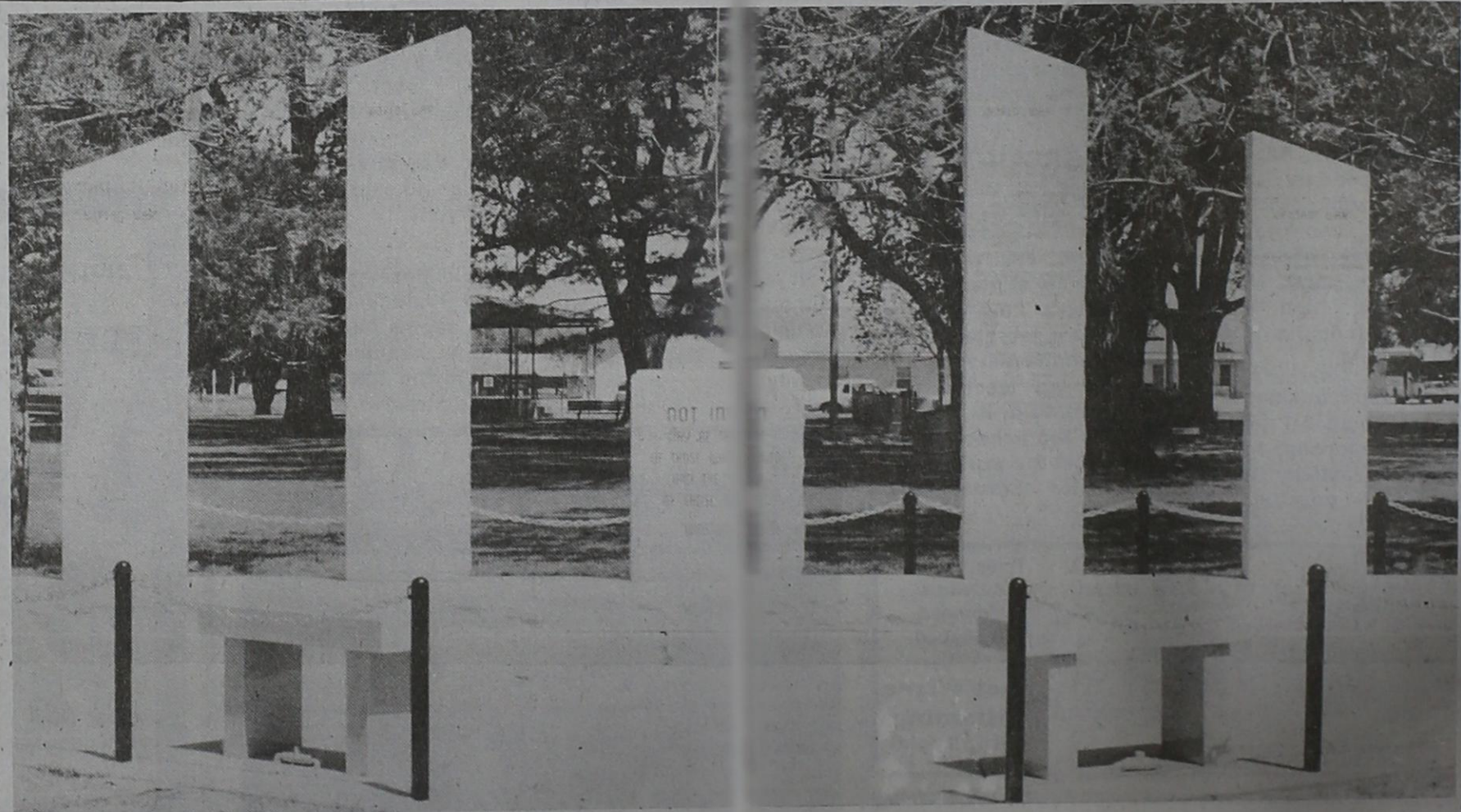
Before being shipped back, the books can be reviewed by seniors in the library on May 24.

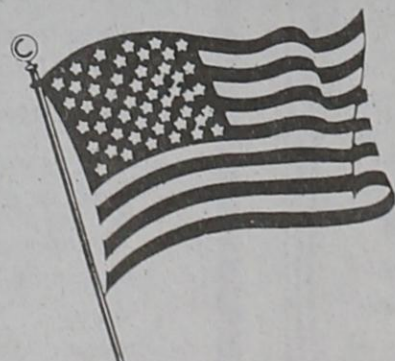
