The news in the Texico-Farwell News for April 12, 1918 was mainly focused on the "up and coming Cannon Ball Motor Company" headquartered at Texico. The lead headline for the issue was "Cannon Ball Motor Company is Represented by a Fine Bunch of Live Salesmen."

Interestingly, the News was also owned by the Cannon Ball owners! Hmmmmmm.

Salesmen from seven states "were represented in this group of splendid men who are the advance guards for this great Industrial Organization." The front page also featured a poem entitled "There's a Cannon Ball Four in Texico Town." Sung to the tune of "There is a Quaker Down in Quaker Town," the lyrics read as follows:



Another fascinating article that appeared on Page 1 was headlined "Melrose Merchant Tarred and Feathered" and taken from the Clovis News. It should be noted that this incident occurred during World War I.

"Quite a lot of excitement was created in Clovis Monday when a merchant from Melrose was tarred and feathered. The merchant was in Clovis attending the Socialist convention and looking after business. He was inopportuned to buy a Liberty Bond, but it is said that he repeatedly refused, although he is reputed to be able to buy bonds.

"After his refusal to invest in the Third Liberty loan bonds, he was stripped of his clothing from the waist up and tar and feathers applied. In this condition, he went out of town in his car late Monday afternoon. He was accompanied by his son. He is opposed to war and it is said he expressed himself on the question in a decided manner."

The Western Tire Manufacturing Co. was progressing right along with the plant running two days during the week while machinery was being tested. "Some of these days soon, the people of this community will see 'Western Tire" on the new Cannon Ball car now on our streets."

"The Battle Cry of Peace" was the big movie at the **Criterion Theater in Farwell.**

Deaf Smith has had a good year

The year of 2002 proved to be a record year for Deaf Smith Electric Cooperative with energy sales of 417,030,368 kWh, an increase of 13 1/2 per cent, reports co-op president and general manager Steve Louder.

The peak demand was slightly above the previous record, setting a power supplier coincident level of 136 MW. During 2002, the co-op posted margins totaling \$2,428,693. It installed 21 miles of underground wire and constructed 27 miles of overhead distribution line to serve 404 new services.

Deaf Smith's transmission, distribution and underground lines now total 4,354 miles, serving 13,980 meters.

The cooperative will have its annual meeting on Tuesday at the Bull Barn in Hereford. The remainder of 1990 and a portion of 1991 capital credits in the amount of \$1 million will be returned to members this year.

Among the awards to be presented are a 20-year director service honor to Clarence Martin, and a 5-year director service honor to Vick Christian.



'Uncle Klump was a dandy'

(Editor's note: Hurshel Harding is a longtime Farwell attorney who retired and moved to Brownfield, Texas.)

What a surprise it was to receive the Feb. 6 issue of the Tribune and read some news of my uncle sporting a new Overland Automobile (as reported in the Texico-Farwell Times 1916 article).

I can imagine Rudolph John Klump, Uncle Klump as we nephews called him, driving a new 1916 Overland automobile manufactured by Willis Motors, as depicted in the adjacent photo.

Uncle Klump was born March 12, 1882, in Oxford, lowa, and moved to the Farwell-Texico area in 1909. He had two sisters living in Iowa, namely Minnie Matyx and Settie Spenar, and a third sister, Mrs. Georg Elliott, who lived in Dowagiac, Mich.

He married one of my father's sisters, being Fannie Harding. The D.L. Harding family had moved from Comanche County, Texas, to a farm six miles south of Texico on the state line.

Apparently, Uncle Klump met his wife-to-be there and they married June 1, 1910. They were never fortunate to have children. They owned farm lands in Bailey County, selling part of the same in the '20s and the remainder in the early '50s or '60s.

At one time, they owned the farm which my father

purchased in 1931 located in Bailey County, 3/4 mile east of my grandfather's farm and home. This is where my brothers and I grew up.

Uncle Klump moved to Muleshoe around 1920 and was elected Bailey County Judge, serving from 1920-1924. He served as the "official weatherman", reporting the temperatures, rainfall and other weather factors for 47 years.

He drove a 1929 4-door Plymouth for over 20 years. He was active in the Methodist Church, as well as the Muleshoe Masonic Lodge, Scottish Rite and a Worthy Patron in the Eastern Star for many years.

From 1950-55, he served as a Justice of the Peace, and enjoyed people, especially performing a marriage.

My Uncle Klump was a kind and happy person, and I consider it a pleasure to be his namesake. My parents selected his first name, "Rudolph", as my middle name when I was born.

This uncle was different, and I was pleased to see his mention in the 1916 Texico-Farwell Times. He died March 8, 1968, five days short of 85 years of life, and is buried at Muleshoe.

These photos of R.J. Klump and Fannie Klump probably were taken the year of their marriage. Uncle Klump always combed his hair forward, as shown in the picture, over his balding head. I would have recognized him as his looks never changed except age. He was a dandy.


