

Animal shelter rules rescinded

There has been confusion over new state rules governing animal shel-

Last year, the state announced very strict requirements, then scinded some, apparently due to criticisms from the Texas Municipal League.

New rules will go into effect Jan. 16, 2005 but the cities, such as Farwell and Bovina, are not required to provide indoor facilities for animals as long as individual standards are complied with, such as protection from direct exposure to sunlight, and other standards.

Final passage for this is expected in July by the Texas Department of Health.

\$1.3 million bombshell dropped on Bovina

Quite a bombshell was dropped on the Bovina City Council on May 6.

Rich Oller, of Oller Engineering, of Lubbock, had some bad news to report:

It doesn't appear the state will continue granting the permit for the current city sewer system since it's been outgrown. So Oller recommended that the city must build a new sewer system at an estimated cost of \$1.3

The current system was built more than 50 years ago, and the city's population has risen to 1,900-plus resi-

The council made no decision on this. They had expected that a new sewer system would be needed, but didn't know when. It appears, they will have to build one earlier than expected.

The key problem, obviously, is the funding for it. City Manager Ernest Terry estimated that if the city got a loan with 4 percent interest, homeowners would have to pay \$13.29 more per month for their sewer connections.

The city has purchased land at the southeast part of town for a new sewer plant.

In other business, the council:

-- Again met with property owners along First Street to discuss possible improvements to that road.

At the last council meeting, City Manager Ernest Terry was asked to look into options. Since then, he has come up with two:

-- Paving, with an estimated cost of \$418,900.

-- Potash, with an estimated cost of \$46,000. Of that total, the potash would be purchased for about \$34,000, with extra funds needed for renting a maintainer, and for

Terry is recommending that the city pay one-third of the cost, and the property owners involved the remaining two-thirds. Thus, property owners are probably looking at between \$700 and \$800 each, depending on how many are participating.

The property owners are setting up a group to continue working on this project.

-- Adopted an ordinance for an investment policy. This basically gives the city manager more leeway for

investing city funds. -- Tabled a resolution authorizing the city's participation in the Panhandle Region Mutual Aid Agreement. There was one paragraph in the pact that concerned councilmen - where it said that if help is given, a county can get billed for services rendered. Clarification is

sought on this. -- Okayed the ad valorem tax continuation.

-- Set a special meeting for May 20 to (1) canvass the election, and (2) further discuss the 1st Street proposals. The next regular meeting will be June 10.
