

## OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

### HOG KILLIN' TIME

The first couple of years at heeler were especially exciting for me. Living on the farm was right down my alley. This was the greatest time of my life, so far. I was old enough to have the freedom to wander around the pasture on my own, but not old enough to actually work. This was kind of a double-good deal!

Just about the time winter started settin' in, I heard my folks talking about it being close to "hogkilling time." What I didn't know, was that this was probably the biggest family event of the year; more involved than 42 parties, or even music in the front yard on any evening in the week.

The "big event" was set up at my Uncle Fat" and Aunt Vera's house. We had quite a few kinfolks round close by and they all showed up to help.

WARNING! --- If you have no idea of what it takes to get "porkchops, bacon, etc." on a farm table in the early years before "super markets," this might disturb you.





### **PROPOSITION 1**

The proposed amendment would appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment to prohibit the taking, damaging, or destroying of private property for public use unless the action is for the ownership, use, and enjoyment of the property by the State, a political subdivision of the State, the public at large, or entities granted the power of eminent domain under law or for the elimination of urban blight on a particular parcel of property, but not for certain economic development or enhancement of tax revenue purposes, and to limit the legislature 's authority to grant the power of eminent domain to an entity."
