



Precincts 3 and 4 were given approval for the purchase of a used rock crusher at a cost of \$10,000. The rock crusher will be shared by all precincts.

Enbridge Pipelines was given permission to cross County Road 15 for the purpose of running an underground Utility and Pipeline.

Chairman Helton went to

Agenda Item #9F to allow Mrs. Whitley to present the district's annual audit report. Mrs. Whitley gave a very detailed overview of the audit as well as the notes to management. There was a discussion regarding the effect of being a critical access facility and the impact that this has had on our financial success. Mrs. Whitley left the meeting at 7:25p.m.

Chairman Helton moved to Agenda Item #2 Consent Agenda. Ray Hudson made a motion to approve the consent agenda. Motion seconded by Dale Garner and carried unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook presented the investment report. She reported that in order to fund three payrolls and pay the bills some money would have to be withdrawn from a CD. This would still leave adequate reserves. Ray Hudson made a motion to withdraw the money and replace it when tax monies start coming in. Motion seconded by Dale Garner and carried unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook reported there was no bad debt or charity write-offs this month. No action required.

September 2009 QAPI minutes and scorecards were presented. Dale Garner made a motion to accept as presented. Sue Chandler seconded motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Sue Stiles, RN, BSN, Chief Nursing Officer made a report from the Nurse Staffing Committee that included the policy and procedure for determining nurse staffing numbers as well as the nurse staffing plan. Ray Hudson made a motion to accept the report. Sue Chandler seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.






OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

SOCIAL EXTRAVAGANZAS

While living on the "Old Double Tuff" farm, sometimes we would go visit neighbors or kinfolks at night. Several different kinds of 'social' visits occurred. The "42" party was then and still is today, a favorite social event played with dominos. Four people sit around a table with partners across from each other. Several tables would be set up to accommodate all who wanted to play. Mostly, adults played this game and probably, teen-agers would have been allowed to take part, but I don't think they would ever admit to liking a game their parents liked. All of us smaller kids couldn't count good enough, our attention span was way too short, and we'd rather

play kid games anyway. "Hide & Seek" was good.

In order to get us out of the house at night, the adults were more than happy to set up a lantern or two out in the yard. If they already had electricity, they would string up some lights. Some of the added attractions of having outside lights in the summertime, were bugs. Frogs came to eat the bugs and snakes came to eat the frogs. We didn't really mind the snakes very much, as long as they were bull-snakes or spreadin-adders (hog-nosed snakes).

Another fun event was simply going over to our kinfolks' house. Even as a little kid, I could see that this event was done by mostly different rules, set up by the adults. One thing that didn't ever change; the adults wanted us kids out of the house and that's what we wanted, too! Isn't it amazing though, how these 'moms' who said words like, ooh and aah and gitch-gitch-gu, over the little babies; were the same 'moms' that were eager to send us outside when we were about four or five years old? Apparently, they weren't afraid that the coyotes

might get us! We kids would hear them barking and howling; it sounded like they were really close and maybe... hungry! I guess our folks figured the coyotes wouldn't come within a mile of a bunch of noisy kids like us.

Now, concerning the adults; unlike at the domino parties, the men would usually sit around the kitchen table and talk about hogs, cows, how deep to plant cotton, whether to plant fuzzy seed or delinted seed. Some conversation would be about their hay. If it was windrowed-up, was it "too wet" or "too dry" to bale? There was always something about farming that needed more than one opinion. Uncle Fat, was generally accepted as being an expert about such stuff and they never seemed to tire of the discussion.

The women would usually sit in the living room and talk about whatever women talk about.... We kids knew better than to interfere with their conversations! A long hard look from one of them and you knew, you needed to leave...now! It seemed to me like they had some sort of 'secret society' which men and little kids weren't privy to. Once a teenage girl joined that secret society, she wasn't ever allowed to go with us outside and play, ever again! They had claimed her and she became...one of them....


