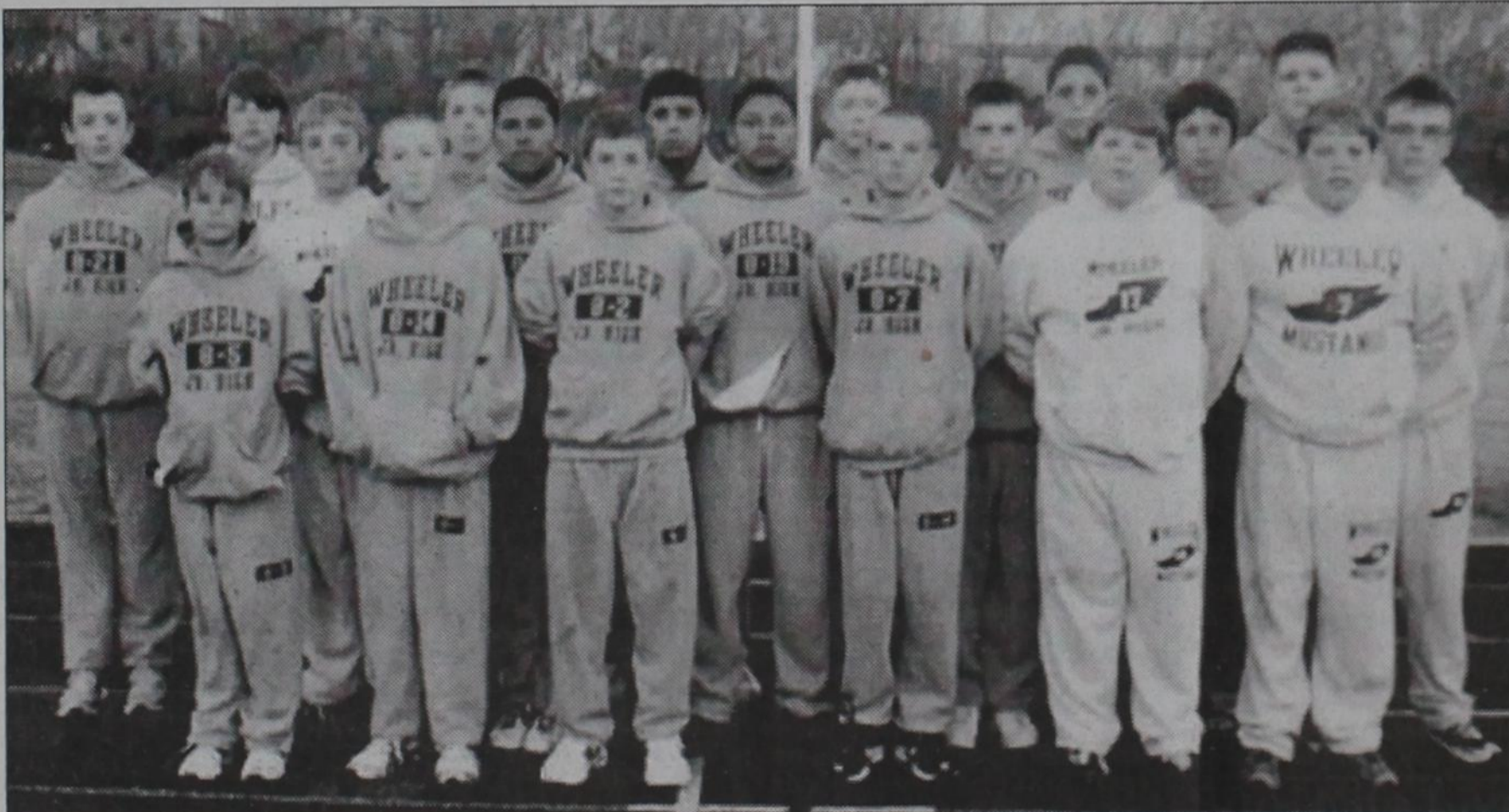

### Renewable Energy Grants Available

USDA Rural Development State Director Bryan Daniel announced today the availability of \$176.5 million in loan guarantees and \$11.4 million in competitive grants to support investments in renewable energy and energy efficiency improvements by agricultural producers and small rural businesses. Renewable energy systems utilizing wind, solar, biomass, geothermal or hydrogen sources may be purchased. Energy efficiency improvements may include retrofitting lighting or insulation, irrigation, grain dryers, or purchasing or replacing equipment with more efficient units in existing or new replacement facilities.

Loan guarantees cover up to 50 percent of a project's cost, not to exceed \$10 million. Grants are available for up to 25 percent of a project's cost, not to exceed \$250,000 for energy efficiency improvements and \$500,000 for renewable energy systems. These loan guarantees and grants are expected to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 0.97 metric tons, replace 821 million barrels of foreign oil and generate almost 2 million kilowatt hours of electricity annually. USDA has funded more than 400 loans and grants since the renewable energy program began in FY 2003.

"American agriculture is going through a time of enormous transformation," said Bryan Daniel, State Director, USDA Rural Development. "We need to be bold in recognizing and capitalizing on new opportunities. Renewable energy is unquestionably one of those areas that present tremendous opportunities for economic gains and ultimately an improved quality of life for rural Texans."

To date, the Bush Administration has invested through this program nearly \$66.7 million in 36 states. During Fiscal Year 2006, Texas provided nearly 1.7 million for this program.

Applications for grants must be completed and submitted to the Texas USDA Rural Development, Attention Business Programs, 101 S. Main, Suite 102, Temple, TX 76501, postmarked no later than May 18. The deadline for submitting loan applications as well as for loan and grant combinations is July 2.
