At about the age of fourteen, girls thought about my looks. dad started letting me ride my horse with a saddle; no more of that bareback ridin' for me. britches get really wet and dirty, about three dollars, plus fifty or then kind-of stiff when they dry sixty cents shipping. It came with out. In addition to looking pretty two leather straps, ready to lash dorky, you also, don't smell very good! A saddle was definitely an improvement, all the way round. Not satisfied with just the bare

necessities, I managed to get a catalog for "army surplus" stuff. What I had been wanting for guite a while, was a "saddle scabbard," so I could carry my .22 rifle with me. onto the saddle. I'll have to admit, I was a pretty fine-looking specimen of young manhood, with that on my saddle.


